Personal records were set by all medal winners and several others set season PR's — Daniel Petersen in the shot

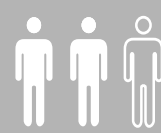
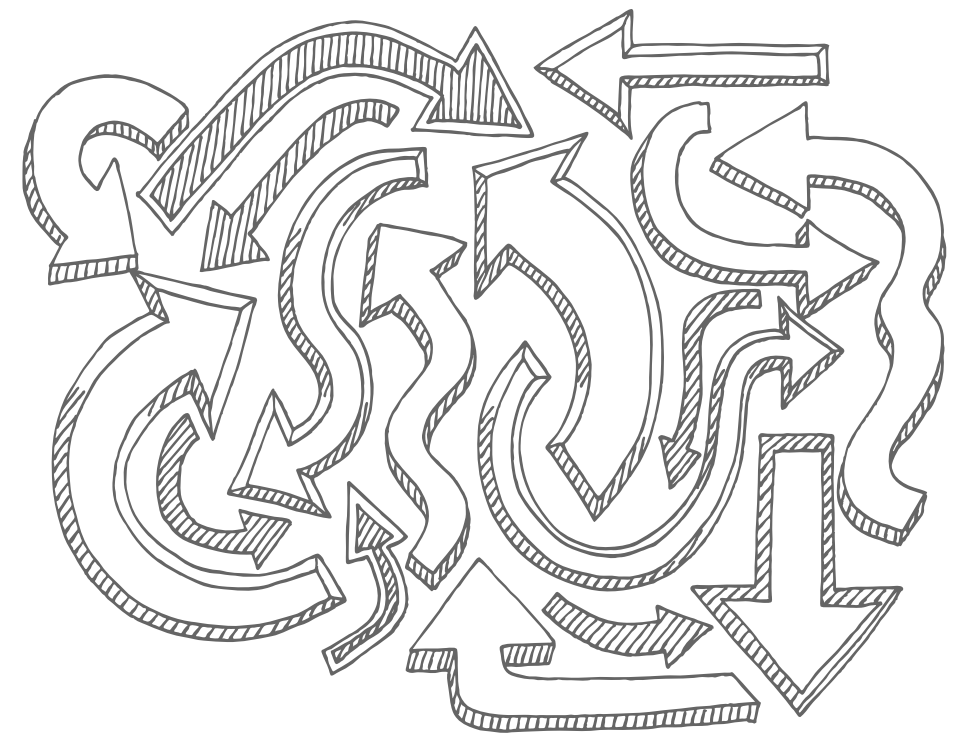
put at 36 feet, 3.50 inches and in the discus at 99 feet, 5.50 inches and Brett Mundhenke in the 800 in 2:20.2.

NOXIOUS WEEDS MUST BE CONTROLLED YOU ARE REQUIRED TO CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS ON YOUR PROPERTY

THE NOXIOUS WEEDS ARE: Musk Thistle, Plumeless Thistle, Canada Thistle, Leafy Spurge, Knapweed (spotted and diffuse), Purple Loosetrife, Saltcedar, Phragmites, Knotweed (Japanese and Giant), and Sericea Lespedeza. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THIS 19th DAY OF April 2017**, pursuant to the Noxious Weed Control Act, section 2-955, subsection 1(a), to every person who owns or controls land in Thayer County, Nebraska, that noxious weeds being grown, or growing on, such land shall be controlled at such frequency as to prevent establishment, provide eradication, or reduce further propagation or dissemination of such weeds.

Upon failure to observe this notice, the County Weed Superintendent is required to:

- Proceed pursuant to the law and issue legal notice to the landowner of property infested with noxious weeds and giving such landowner 15 days to control the noxious weed infestation. Conviction for noncompliance may result in a \$100.00 per day fine to the landowner with a maximum fine of \$1,500; or
- Should more immediate control be required, proceed pursuant to the law and have the weeds controlled by such method as he/she finds necessary, the expense of which shall constitute a lien and be entered as a tax against the land, and be collected as other real estate taxes are collected, or by other means as provided by law.

Also, the public is notified that noxious weed seed and propagative parts may be disseminated through the movement of machinery and equipment, trucks, grain and seed, hay, straw, nursery stock, fencing materials, sod, manure, and soil as well as articles of similar nature. Methods of treatment have been prescribed by the Director of Agriculture and may be obtained from the county weed control authority.

The county attorney has reviewed all of the information submitted for the permit and the zoning regulations in regard to this type of operation. Mr. Werner felt that the conditions for the permit need to be part of the resolution, due to that desire he was unable

to provide the commissioners with the resolution for adoption. This item will be put on the agenda for April 26th, 2017. Jane Ford Witthoff, Health Director for Public Health Solutions, was unable to keep her appointment and has rescheduled for a later date. There being no other business to come before the board the chairman adjourned the meeting at 10:30 am. The board will convene on April 26, 2017 at 9:00 am. 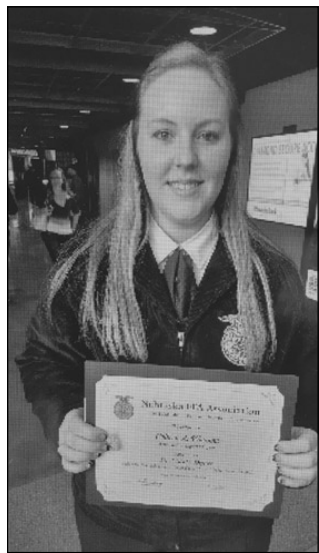

Area students receive scholarships from UNL

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln has offered over 4,000 university-wide scholarships to the 2017 high school graduating class from Nebraska high schools. The total potential value of the scholarships is approximately \$38.5 million.

The students offered scholarships include 29 Chancellor's Scholars, 743 Regents Scholars, 447 David Distinguished Scholars, 611 Nebraska Achievement Scholars, 983 James H. Canfield Scholars, 57 Chancellor's Leadership Scholars, 582 University Honors Program Scholars, 15 Health Sciences Scholars, four Davis Scholars, six Johnny Carson Scholars, 355 Nebraska Emerging Leader Scholars, 201 Nebraska Legends Scholars and 66 Pepsi Scholars.

- Chancellor's and Regents scholarships are among the most prestigious awards granted by the university. Each of these awards pay full tuition for full-time students with the potential for renewal at a value of approximately \$28,000 over four years. Chancellor's Scholars receive an additional \$2,000 per year.

- James H. Canfield Scholars, named for the chancellor who led the University of Nebraska to a position of national prominence in the 1890s, receive a one-year, \$1,000 award.

- Nebraska Achievement scholarships are based on academic achievement, admission test scores and information in the student's personal statement. There were 160 of these scholarships awarded for full tuition and 451 awarded for \$1,000, each with the potential for renewal.

- Students admitted to the University Honors Program, a university-wide community of scholars, receive book scholarship that provide up to \$500 per year. The Honors Program gives students who strive for academic excellence an opportunity to explore new knowledge through research,

to participate actively in a process of discovery, and appreciate and respect a diversity of opinions.

A list of scholars by high school is below. In addition to the programs listed, colleges and departments at the university also offer various scholarships to freshmen students. Students offered scholarships have until May 1 to secure their scholarship with the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid by notifying the Office of Admissions of their intent to enroll through submission of the enrollment deposit.

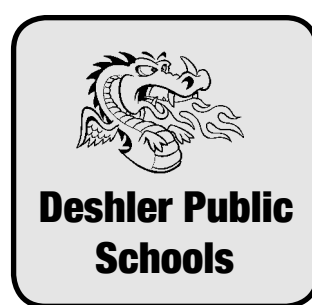

Veteran flight larger than last year's

The manifest is complete with 650 veterans for the May 1 Vietnam Veterans Flight.

Veterans from 175 Nebraska communities will travel with their comrades to visit the Vietnam Wall, possibly triggering memories they have pushed into the recesses of their minds for over 40 years.

"This is the largest group of Vietnam veterans from a single state to ever visit the Vietnam Wall since last year's flight," Jim Knotts, President and CEO of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund in Washington, D.C., said.

The flight will be preceded by an early evening Pre-Flight Dinner so the veterans can go to bed early to prepare for their 2 a.m. wake-up call. The four charter jets will depart from Eppley Airfield in Omaha, but will return to the Lincoln airport to offer Nebraskans west of Lincoln the opportunity to

say "Welcome Home!"

Thousands of citizens are anticipated to welcome the veterans home at the Lincoln airport.

The welcome home event is scheduled for May 1 at 8:30 p.m.

The veterans are:

- 55 Purple Heart recipients, some multiple recipients;
- 242 (37 percent) have been diagnosed with Agent Orange, creating many health issues, incl cancer;

- Ten have received the Distinguished Flying Cross, some twice; and
- One Army nurse, the only female in the flight.

Hundreds of generous donors throughout the state made the trip possible.

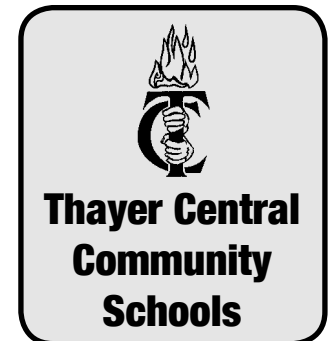

During National Infant Immunization Week April 22-29, Jefferson Community Health & Life encourages parents to make sure their children's immunizations are up to date.

In Nebraska, 26.2 percent of children between 19 months and 35 months of age are not up to date on their immunization schedule, according to HealtyAmericans.org. Those who are not fully immunized are at risk of contracting preventable diseases, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Children need immunization to protect them from many dangerous childhood diseases. Vaccinating your child according to the recommended schedule is one of the best ways you can protect them from 16 serious diseases. To learn more about the diseases and the vaccines that prevent them, visit cdc.gov/vaccines/parents. The website includes age-specific information about all recommended infant, child and teen vaccines.

In Jefferson County, an immunization clinic is offered twice a month by Blue Valley Community Action Partnership at Jefferson Community Health & Life's Outpatient Services area. JCH&L nursing staff give immunizations, and BVCA staff coordinate the clinic. Clinics are held on the second Tuesday of each month from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., and the 4th Thursday of each month from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Additional Back-to-School clinics are held in July and August. The schedule is available at JHealthandLife.org or from Blue Valley Community Action Partnership.

Appointments are required by calling BVCA at 402-826-2141, ext. 3. Most commercial insurances are accepted through BVCA's private funding program. All Medicaid plans are accepted, and all uninsured clients are accepted through BVCA's Vaccines For Children program. BVCA will verify insurance prior to the appointment time. All clients must bring insurance/Medicaid/managed care insurance card to each visit. Walk ins are not accepted.

The immunization clinic is most easily accessed through the Emergency/Outpatient Service entrance on the south side of Jefferson Community Health & Life.

LBNRD receives Nebraska Environmental Trust grant

Little Blue Natural Resources District announced that it will receive \$15,000 from the Nebraska Environmental Trust for their "Stream Monitoring" project.

The Trust Board announced funding for the project at its meeting on April 6, 2017, in Lincoln. The project is one of the 85 projects receiving \$16,680,000 in grant awards from the Nebraska Environmental Trust this year. Of these, 33 were new applications and 52 are carry-over projects.

The Little Blue Natural Resources District (LBNRD) will be utilizing the \$15,000 for the installation of two additional stream gages in the Little Blue River Basin to monitor surface water flows and flood elevations.

The additional gages will assist the LBNRD, National Weather Service, Emergency Managers, State of Nebraska and resources interests in monitoring surface water flows on the Little Blue River at Hebron and on Rose Creek near Endicott. The stream gages will be installed and maintained by the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources and real time data will be available online at <http://data.dnr.nebraska.gov/RealTime/>.

The Nebraska Legislature created the Nebraska Environmental Trust in 1992. Using revenue from the Nebraska Lottery, the Trust has provided over \$265 million in grants to over 2,000 projects across the state.

Anyone--citizens, organizations, communities, farmers and businesses--can apply for funding to protect habitat, improve water quality and establish recycling programs in Nebraska.

The Nebraska Environmental Trust works to preserve, protect and restore our natural resources for future generations.
