

Low Maintenance Vegetable Gardening for a Bountiful Harvest

Increase your harvest without increasing the size of your garden or workload. All you need is a bit of intensive planting, along with some low maintenance techniques.

Invest some time upfront to prepare the garden soil. This will save you time throughout the growing season. Add several inches of organic matter and a slow release fertilizer into the top 8 to 12 inches of soil. The organic matter improves drainage in clay soils and increases moisture retention in sandy soils. The slow release fertilizer feeds the plants for several months, reducing the number of applications needed. You'll have healthier plants that are better able to fend off pests and outcompete the weeds.

Match the plants with the right growing conditions. Tomatoes, peppers, and other vegetables that produce fruit need full sun. Leafy crops like lettuce are more tolerant of shade. Check plant tags and seed packets for planting details or download a free gardening app, like Homegrown with Bonnie Plants, for plant information, maintenance tips, weather reports, and more.

Plant seeds and transplants in blocks with fewer pathways. Give each plant enough room to grow to its full size. Your rows will be closer together with just enough paths for weeding, watering, and harvesting. You will be growing more plants and pulling fewer weeds with this strategy.

Interplant to further maximize your planting space. Plant short-season vegetables like lettuce and radishes in between properly spaced longer-season vegetables like broccoli and tomatoes. By the time the longer-season plants start filling the space, the shorter season plantings will be ready to harvest. You'll be pulling radishes or cutting lettuce instead of weeds. Plus, you'll harvest two crops from one row.

Plant successive crops throughout the growing season. Plant cool weather vegetables like spinach, radishes, and lettuce in spring. Once these are harvested, replace

with warm weather vegetables like beans, tomatoes, or cucumbers. Finish off the season by filling any voids with a fall crop of cool weather vegetables.

Go vertical to save space, reduce disease, and make harvesting easier. Growing vine crops on supports lifts the fruit off the ground and increases the amount of light and airflow the plants receive, reducing the risk of disease. Plus, you'll do less bending when it's time to harvest.

Mulch the garden with pine straw/evergreen needles, shredded leaves, or other organic matter. These materials suppress the weeds, conserve moisture and add organic

matter to the soil as they decompose. You'll have fewer weeds to pull and not have to water as often.

Save time and water with the help of soaker hoses or drip irrigation. These systems apply the water directly to the soil where it is needed. Less water is lost to overspray, evaporation, and runoff. They also reduce the risk and spread of disease by preventing water from settling on the leaves of the plants.

Try a few or all of these strategies this season for an abundant harvest without a lot of extra work.

Make garage organization go smoothly

Garages tend to fall victim to disorganization during the winter, when homeowners want to hurry inside and get some respite from the cold. As a result, many homeowners resolve to clean their garages come springtime.

· Look up. Many homeowners fail to make adequate use of the vertical space in their garages. But keeping items off the floor can make it easier



to clean the garage and will provide more room for your car or other machinery you don't want to leave in the driveway or a backyard shed. Install shelves so you can more safely store automotive fluids and cleaners, and hang some hooks or hammer a few nails into the garage walls so you can hang tools like rakes and garden shears.

· Group tools by season. Grouping tools by season can make for a more organized garage and one less likely to be overcome with clutter. Designate one corner of the garage for lawn and gardening tools and another for winter tools like snow shovels or snowblowers. This makes it easier to find tools when you need them. When grouping

tools, you can also group items by who uses them. For example, parents can designate one area of the garage for their tools, while kids can get their own area for their toys and bicycles.

· Resolve to park in the garage. One of the best ways to keep a garage organized is to park your vehicle or vehicles inside the garage each night. Parking in a garage protects your vehicle(s) from the elements, and you also won't be tempted to leave items lying around on the garage floor if you know you will eventually be pulling your vehicle in.

Eagles compete in two meets

The Bruning Davenport Shickley Eagles track team made its way to McCool Junction April 19 Exeter Milligan Invitational track meet.

The girls finished in third place and the boys ended up in fourth in the seven-team meet.

The girls were led by Catherine Mick who finished her day with four medals, three of them gold. She won the pole vault with a leap of 10 feet, 9 inches, the 300 hurdles in a time of 46.1 and the 100 hurdles in a time of 15.4. Mick completed her day with a personal best time of 12.8 to take second in the 100-meter dash.

Another second place finish happened when the girls 3200-meter relay squad made up of Lexi Kadel, Morgan Lowery, Haley Pena Lopez, and Kim Ardissono took home the silver.

A third second was earned by Tristen Mosier who was the runner up in the pole vault, and Jadyne Kleinschmidt took two medals in the jumps finishing second in the triple jump and sixth in the long jump.

Courtney Kamler took fourth in the pole vault as well.

Several athletes and teams took home fifth place finishes as the 400-meter relay team of Mashaya Dierking, Carely Elznic, Jadyne Kleinschmidt, and Kim Ardissono captured fifth, as did Miranda Elznic, Caitlin Mosier, Sera Johnson, and Megan Grote in the 1600-meter relay.

Grote took fifth in the high jump and so did Mashaya in the 200-meter dash. Tara Lee Hudson was fifth in the shot put to finish off the girls scoring.

The boys had a solid day as Thomas Mick took first in the pole vault with a leap of 12 feet, 9 inches to capture the teams only gold medal. Chris Lichti followed that up with a fifth place finish and established a personal best by jumping 111 feet, 3 inches.

Hunter Krehnke took home a pair of silvers with second place runs in the hurdles.

The 400-meter relay team of Sam Christensen, Kale Kleinschmidt, Thomas Mick and Brandon Anderson were third.

Kleinschmidt then teamed up with Stuart Rohr, Brett Holtzen and Caden Norder to finish third in the 1600-meter relay as well. Kleinschmidt completed his day with a sixth place run in the 200-meter dash.

Mick finished off his day with a fourth place in the 100, and Anderson took home third in the triple jump.

Christensen ran to a third place finish in the 110-meter hurdles after earlier finishing fourth in the high jump. The 3200-meter relay team of Kale Smith, Brett Holtzen, Kamron Dickson and Josiah Kamler finished fourth, with Dickson adding a fourth place leap in the triple jump and Kleinschmidt adding a third place run in the 800-meter as well.

Taylor Anderson took home a third place finish in the high jump and added a sixth place in the long jump.

Stuart Rohr established a personal best with a 125 feet discus toss and took fourth place.

The junior varsity boys 400-meter relay team of Chris Lichti, Josh Hinrichs, Isaac Kamler and Preston Sybrant completed the scoring by taking fifth in that event to complete the day.

On April 23, the BDS Eagles Track team traveled to Tecumseh for the Mudecas Track meet.

Both the boys and the girls took fourth place with the boys finishing with 66 points and the girls finishing with 71.

The boys lone gold medal was earned by Mick who broke his brother Will Mick's Mudecas pole vault record by leaping 13 feet, 9 inches and establishing his personal best mark in that event.

Lichti took home the silver medal in the pole vault. Mick came back later and was joined by Kleinschmidt, Norder and Brandon Anderson to take third in the 400-meter relay.

Kleinschmidt finished with another medal by earning fifth in the 100.

Hunter Krehnke brought in three medals by taking second in a school record tying 15.8 in the 110-meter hurdles, third in the 300-meter hurdles and then teamed up with Rohr,

Kale Smith and Noel Gines to get fourth in the 1600-meter relay.

Rohr established his personal best in the discus where he finished in fourth place with a toss of 127 feet, 8 inches. Earlier Smith teamed up with Dickson, Taylor Anderson and Kamler to finish third in the 3200-meter relay.

Taylor Anderson had finished third in the high jump and Dickson later was sixth in the 1600 as well.

Brett Holtzen established a personal best by running 57.8 and taking sixth in the 400. Kendall Dickson was sixth in the shot put and Sam Christensen took fourth in the 110-meter hurdles to top off the boys scoring.

The girls only gold medal was earned by Courtney Kamler who claimed the top spot in the pole vault with a leap of 8 feet.

Carley Elznic also finished fifth in the 400 and was joined by Miranda Elznic, Madison Elznic and Sera Johnson to place third in the 1600-meter relay.

Madison Elznic established a personal best by running a 69.2 and taking fourth in the 400.

Kadel brought home a pair of silver medals by finishing runner up in the 3200-meter run and then teaming up with Brice Ardissono, Morgan Lowery and Haley Pena Lopez on the second place 3200-meter relay.

Dierking established her personal best time in the 100 where she ran a 13.8 and took third place.

Later she teamed up with Madison Elznic, Sera Johnson and Jadyne Kleinschmidt to finish fifth in the 400-meter relay.

Earlier Kleinschmidt was fourth in the 200-meter dash and took fifth place in the long jump, finishing just behind teammate Grote who was fourth.

Grote also took third in the high jump and was sixth in the 100-meter hurdles.

The girls discus duo of Tara Lee Hudson and Carley Elznic finished one inch apart with Tara Lee claiming fourth place and Carley ending up in fifth.

Thayer Central boys win Superior meet in packs

The Thayer Central boys track team has done it again, placing first in the Superior Invite April 19 with 157 points, ahead of second place Hastings St. Cecilia.

The boys' team operated in packs to rack up points. In field events, Simon Wiedel and Jadyne Dightman took first and third in the long jump with distances of 20 feet, 10 inches and 20 feet, 3.5 inches.

It was Dightman again in the triple jump, only this time he took first place with 42 feet, 4 inches. Following Dightman was Jarod Hergott in third place at 34 feet, 2 inches. Shevin Solomon finished sixth at 31 feet, 10 inches.

Dietric Kenning and Kyle Kugel placed fourth and sixth in the shot put and fifth and sixth in the discus. Kenning heaved the shot put 43 feet, 1.50 inches and swung the discus 123 feet, 9 inches. Kugel went 41 feet, 5.50 inches on shot and 114 feet in the discus.

In running events Aubrey Fangmeier and Connor Mumm teamed up to win second and third places in the 400-meter dash. Fangmeier ran the strip in 52.78 while Mumm's time was 52.91. In the 800-meter run, Mumm topped Fangmeier by taking first place in 2:04.63, but Fangmeier came in second place in 2:05.17 for another event dominated by Thayer Central.

More first places came from Keegan Casey in the 110-meter hurdles in a time of 18.70. Casey had some company as Titan Zach Koss ran the stretch

in 20.73 for third place.

Simon Wiedel topped his running events in the 100 and 200-meter dashes. Wiedel went 11.25 in the 100-meter and 23.34 in the 200. Elijah Nobbman ran for a fourth place in the 200 as well, nailing a time of 24.85.

In the 300-meter intermediate hurdles, Thayer Central had third and sixth places with Evan Fuglestad and Casey at 43.83 and 49.01.

Dylan Fischer, Damian Stewart and Collin Fink placed fifth, sixth and seventh on the 1600-meter run at 5:14.13; 5:15.54; and 5:18.97. Stewart also placed fourth in the 3200-meter run in 11:11.72.

The Thayer Central boys running team placed first in the 3200, 1600 and 400-meter relays. In the 3200, the team ran it in 8:59.61. For the 1600, the first place time was 3:42.62 and in the 400, the boys finished with a time of 45.65.

The girls' Titan team did a little packing of their own in the triple jump.

Maddison Williams placed second at 30 feet, .75 inches; Grace Souerdyke, third at 29 feet, 9.75 inches; and Mariah Hintz, fourth with 29 feet, 4.50 inches.

Jena Cottam jumped to first place in the long jump at 15 feet. Souerdyke followed in fourth place with a 13-foot, 9.50-inch jump and Samantha Lindsey came right behind Souerdyke in fifth place with a jump of 13 feet, 9.25 inches.

Bridget Linton floated the high jump to place fourth with a height of 4 feet, 1 inch. She was also sixth in the 200-meter dash.

Thayer Central has two up and coming pole vaulters. Reata Elting and Bailey Remmers were fifth and sixth with heights of 7 feet, 6 inches for Elting and 5 feet, 6 inches for Remmers.

To finish out the field events, Emily Welch placed sixth in the shot put with 34 feet, 1.50 inches.

Cheyanna Tietjen scaled the 100-meter hurdles for a third place finish. Her time was 18.67.

The 100-meter dash looked good for Jena Cottam, who crossed the finish line in 14.11 for third place.

The 400-meter dash had McKenzie Johnson in fourth place and Katelyn Richardson in seventh. Johnson's time was 1:07.53. Richardson ran the race in 1:10:80.

Jessica Huhman took fifth place in the 800-meter run. Her time was 2:50.40. She was followed by Hintz in seventh.

The Thayer Central girls ran the 3200-meter relay in 11:15.59 good for second place. Relay team members were Johnson (2:44.7); Cambrie Cottam (2:50.4); Huhman (2:51.4); and Richardson (2:48.8).

The 400-meter relay team of Huhman, Jena Cottam, Souerdyke and Welch made another second place win in 55.97.

Jena Cottam, Johnson, Richardson and Souerdyke were fifth in the 1600-meter relay with a time of 4:45.23. Cottam ran it in 69.4; Johnson, 70.4; Souerdyke, 71.9; and Richardson, 73.4, after she ran the mile.




