Pioneer Farm Families

Stepp, Isernhagen families accept award for several generations

The families of Mary Stepp and Mike Isernhagen were recognized as this year's Pioneer Farm Families, sponsored by the Aksarben Foundation, Nebraska Farm Bureau and the Nebraska Association of Fair Managers. They were honored at the Thayer County Fair July 28.

The Stepps and Isernhagens are two of 96 farm families this year to receive the honor, which includes an engraved plaque and gatepost marker.

The history of their farm starts with great-grandfather Henry William Gottfried Schmidt, who came to the United States in 1870 at the age of 17.

He purchased his first piece of land in 1879 and broke the sod in 1881 after marrying Sophia Plummer. She and Schmidt were in the same group that had immigrated to the country.

After the turn of the century on March 13, 1902, Schmidt

bought more land. Six years later, a tornado ripped the area and Schmidt's farm killing two people.

George W. Schmidt, a son of Gottfried, was married that year and rebuilt the farm buildings.

He purchased land from the Fintel family April 4, 1916, who also lost a mother and daughter in the 1908 tornado. The abstract read all minor children owned the property and the father had died before that time. A guardian was named for the children.

Schmidt was deeded the farm in 1920.

Hugo and Helen Schmidt Isernhagen were deeded the farm in 1945 and lived there until 1976.

Mike Isernhagen's family lived on the farm from 1976 to 2007. Isernhagen's son, Eric, moved there in 2007 with his family, and they still live there.

Five generations of the Gottfried Schmidt family have

lived on the land, owned by six generations.

Isernhagen's other son, Brian has farmed the land since 1988.

Mary Stepp and Mike Isernhagen were deeded the farm in 2008 to (S&I Farms, Inc.).

Since its inception, nearly 9,000 farm families have received the Pioneer Farm Families award.

"Aksarben Foundation is proud to recognize the long-standing dedication these farm families have to agriculture and their commitment to Nebraska," Kevin Kock, executive director of agricultural initiatives, said.

"Nebraska Farm Bureau is proud to help sponsor the 2016 Pioneer Farm Family Awards. It is an honor for Nebraska Farm Bureau to acknowledge the commitment of these families to preserve and build Nebraska agriculture for future generations," president of the farm bureau, Steve Nelson, said.

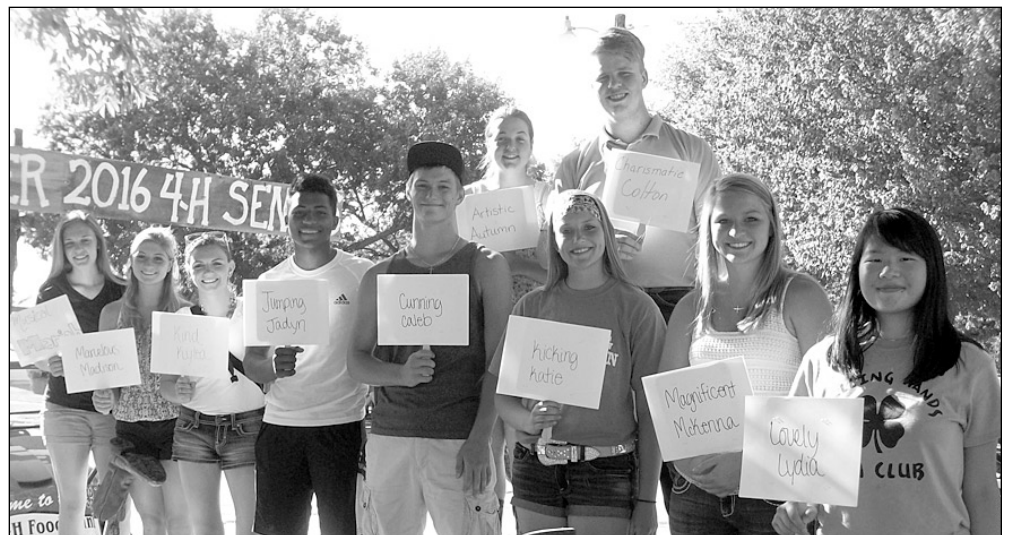

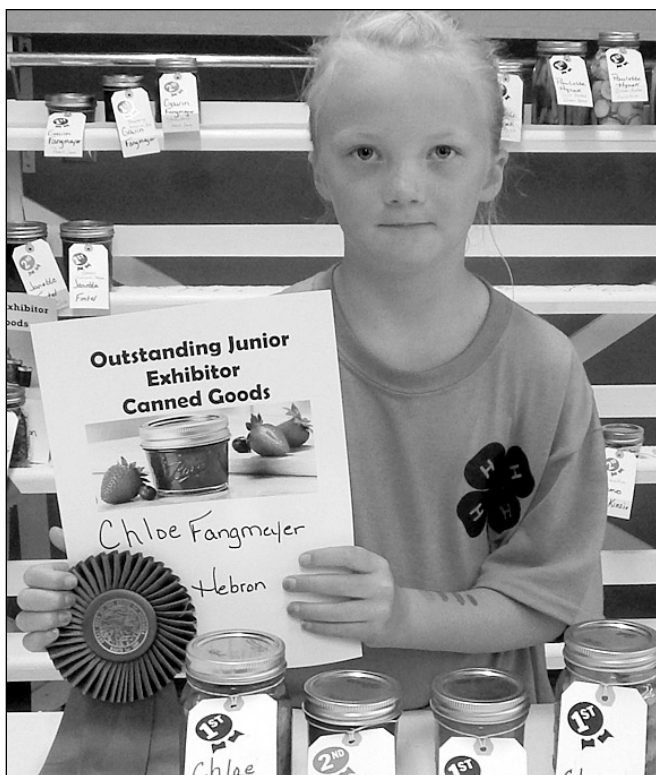

The 2016 Thayer County Fair Fine Arts Open class, once again, gave residents from age three to over 65 their opportunity to display their artistic flair. While the photograph section decreased a bit in number, more junior entries came in. The many arts and crafts on view included Lego projects, painted wooden objects, paintings, drawings, computer generated images, greeting cards, photographs, scrapbook pages, jewelry, and even a "functional sculpture" go cart. Every item was a winner. Each year, several overall winners are also selected.

The 2016 Outstanding Junior Exhibitor (age 15 and under) was Kelby Mumm, daughter of Blake and Rhonda Mumm of Hebron. Kelby's photograph of 4th of July fireworks earned her the award.

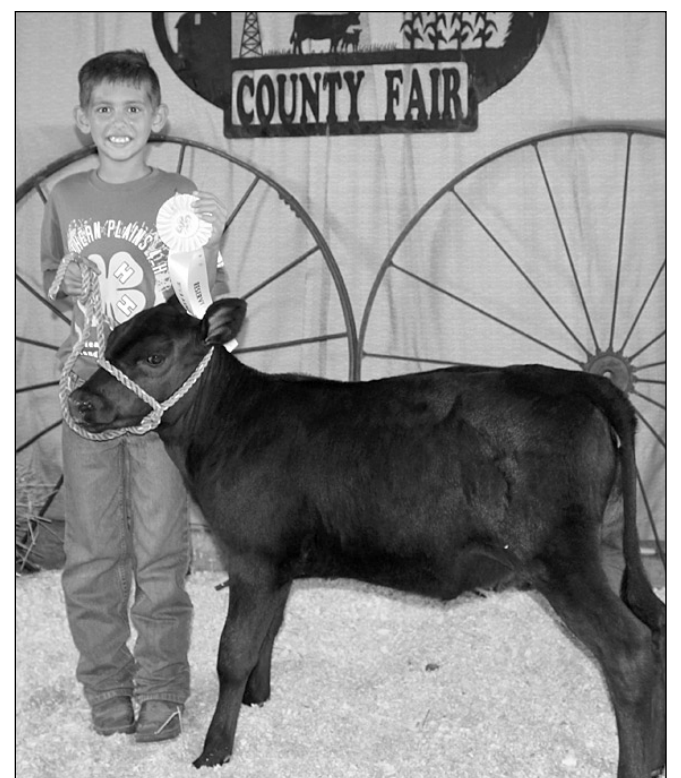

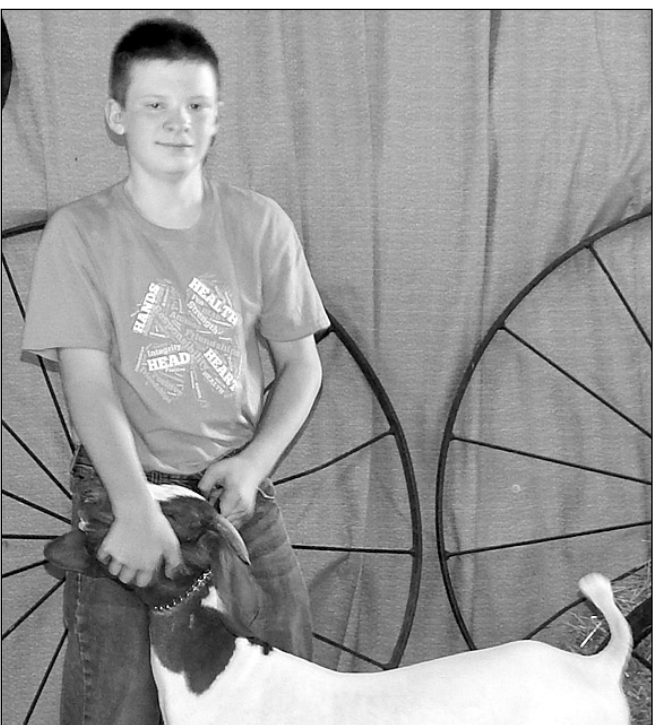

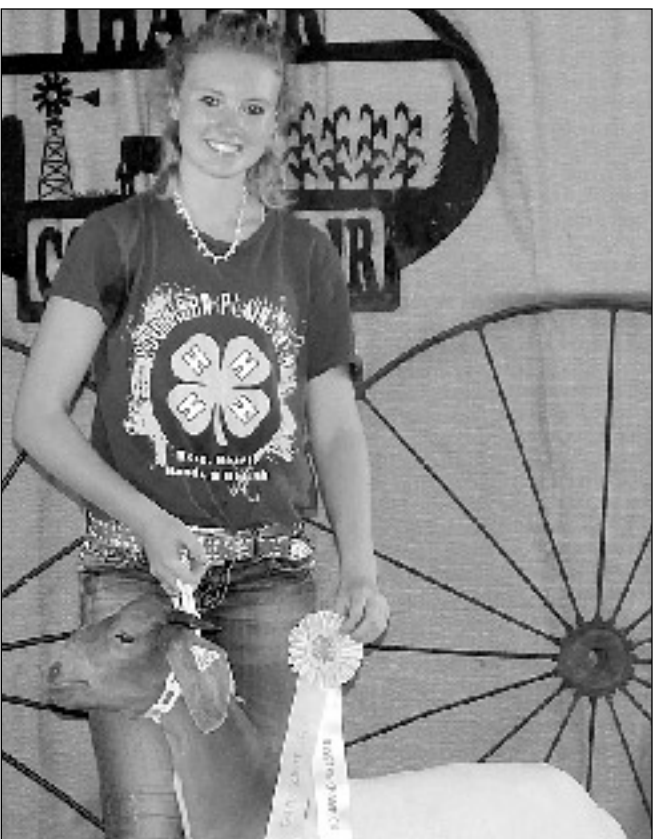

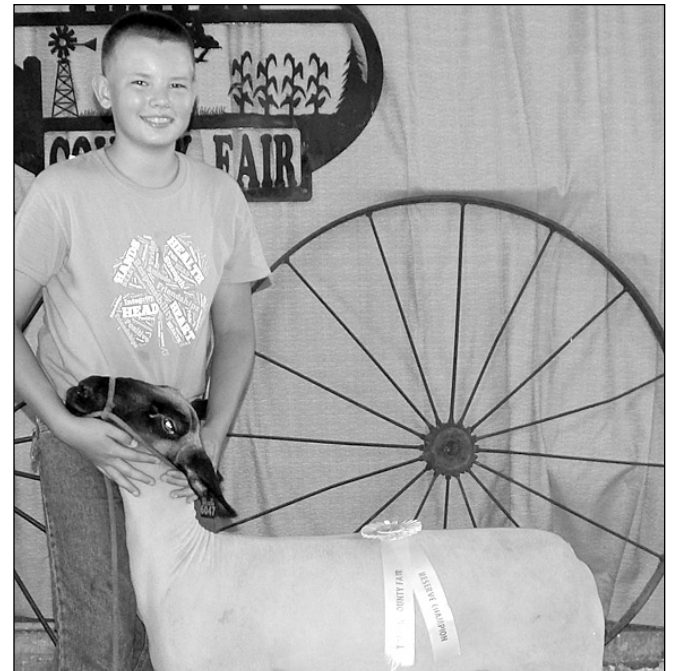

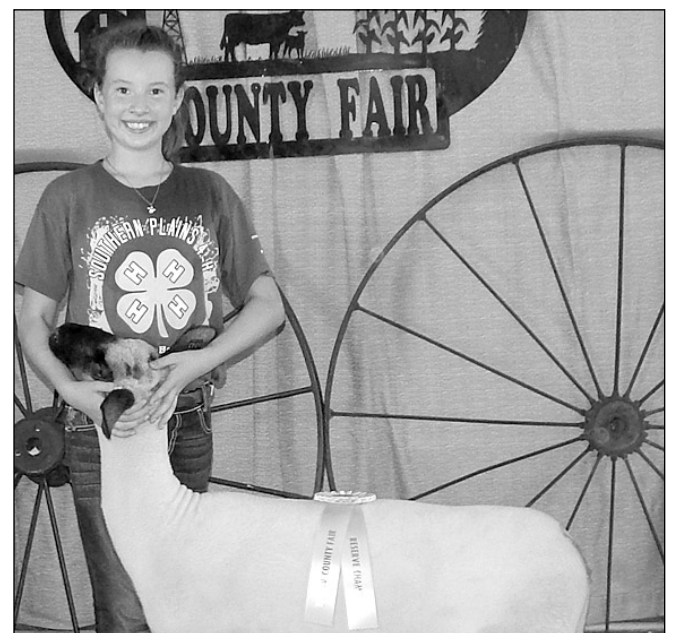
