## Tidbits

### Sales Tax...

Thayer County collected \$193,558.52 in sales tax for the month of September 2013 after showing a 9.4 percent increase in net taxable sales over September 2012. For September 2013, the county had \$3,519,238 in net taxable sales - up from \$3,216,095 in 2012.

According to Hebron Clerk Jean Nagey, the City of Hebron collected \$20,283.57 in motor vehicle and sales taxes on net taxable sales of \$1,799,533 for the month of September. That shows an increase of 2.2 percent in net taxable sales over September 2012. The motor vehicle tax (\$2,526.58) goes into the street fund, while the remainder (\$17,756.99) goes into the sales tax fund.

The Department of Revenue releases figures approximately three months later than the actual month being profiled. October 2013 figures will be released at the beginning of January.

### Winter Field Inspections...

The Little Blue Natural Resources District Groundwater Department will be inspecting irrigation flow meters that are enrolled in the volunteer reporting program this winter. They will be recording the meter serial number, GPS location, verifying totalizer type and noting if it appears the meter needs repaired.

The District's Board of Directors are currently discussing changes to the Groundwater Rules and Regulations for the entire district. At this time, its intention is to require flow meters on all high capacity wells in the district over the next several years. All changes to the rules and regulations are still being developed and will be presented at a public hearing in early 2014.

## Hebron man dies in house fire Monday night

On Dec. 9, at approximately 10:29 p.m., the Hebron Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to 134 Lawrence Road in Hebron for a structure fire.

According to a press release issued from the Thayer County Sheriff's Office, Hebron Fire crews arrived on the scene at approximately 10:32 p.m.

Fire crews made entry into the dwelling and found an unresponsive male inside and transported the victim to the Thayer County Hospital, where he was pronounced deceased. Fire crews extinguished a small fire within the residence within minutes of arrival.

The Thayer County Sheriff's Office and Hebron Fire Department requested the assistance of the Nebraska State Fire Marshal's Office and Nebraska State Patrol. Investigators are determining the cause of the fire which originated in the basement.

The deceased was identified as 61 year-old Anthony J. Wiedel, Hebron dentist. Authorities are awaiting results of an autopsy.



## Commissioners discuss purchasing new graders

At their Dec. 5 meeting, commissioners met to further discuss the new purchase of motor graders and hold their quarterly visit to the Thayer County Law Enforcement Center.

To begin their meeting, commissioners spoke with Richard Heinrichs, Thayer County Road Superintendent, about the current projects at the road department. Heinrichs talked about machines that are currently needing repair.

The commissioners went to the North Central Kansas Technical College last month to visit with representatives about the needs of the Thayer County Road Department. Commissioners and Heinrichs discussed the possibility of hiring recent graduates from the college in the future.

The group also met with representatives from CAT and John Deere regarding the purchase of a new motor grader. Representatives from both companies gave the equipment specifications and warranty information for different models that would match the county's needs.

At their quarterly jail visit, commissioners visited the Thayer County Law Enforcement Center to look at the facility. The reason for the visit is to comply with state statutes.

Discussion was held regarding the salaries for the upcoming election cycle starting in 2015. After more discussion, the commissioners decided to table the decision until Dec. 26. This allows them time to speak with other counties to see what they are doing.

Stacey McLaughlin, Clerk of the District Court, discussed with commissioners more about the Southeast Nebraska Drug Court. After this discussion, the commissioners also decided to table the decision about the drug court until Dec. 26.

Bill McPherson, Thayer County Emergency Manager, briefly spoke with the group about a new grant that may be available to Thayer County in the future.

In other business, commissioners discussed looking for a new appointment for the hospital board.

## 1883

### 130 Years Ago

Alexandria has a flourishing literary society. Hendershot & Son have a new 3,000 pound safe. David Warren of Belvidere is agent for the Leach Standard windmill. It is thought that about 200 buildings will be built here next season.

Henry Burgess has ordered a steam engine and other machinery for his elevator here.

During the past week, several farmers were plowing. They report no frost in the ground.

The town board should have a grade established before any more buildings are built on Lincoln Avenue.

C.M. Hoard of Francisville, Ind., has located at Harbine and opened a wagon shop. He has also erected a residence in town.

It affords us pleasure to state that the difficulties between the Hebron Hall Company and Hebron Library Association have been adjusted.

Harbine Post No. 212 G.A.R. has the cellar dug and stone on the ground for a hall.

The following date has been obtained from county superintendent Scoville: Thayer County has 66 organized school districts, and all but one have schoolhouses. Not only is this true, but the further fact that next year each of the 66 districts will be entitled to draw from the state school fund apportionment by reason of having had at least three months school, speaks unmistakably as to their live condition.

The Hebron Quartette Silver Cornet Band is the name of a new band recently organized here. W.F. Beckett, E flat, is a leader; F.L. Gibbs blows the B flat, Frank Leedom, alto and Archie Bigelow, the baritone. The instruments are silver with gold-plated trimmings and are probably the finest and most expensive in the county.

The departure of Mr. and Mrs. T.J. Thompson and daughter, Miss Jessie and Mr. and Mrs. W.J. Thompson, and Henry Drum from this place to New Tacoma, Washington Territory, will cause regret to many of our citizens. For years they have been important factors in local business and social matters, and will leave behind them many warm friends.

Alexandria weddings: Chas. Willemath and Miss Ida E. Pratt; Austin Pratt and Miss Eunice Way, and William Salter and Miss Minnie House.

Ives Marks, the first county treasurer of Jefferson County, when the territory now known as Thayer County, formed a part of that county, has moved to Indiana.

Married in Hebron: John A. Hansen of Chicago to Miss Agnes Birrell of Thayer County.

Daniel Bobst, who for a long

time has been a resident of this county, moved to Benton County, Ark.

Died at Hubbell of paralysis, Mrs. Ella Breiner, maiden name Harris, wife of J. Breiner, aged 25 years. By her unexpected death, two children, one an infant of only ten weeks of age, are left motherless.

H.C. Bigelow was in this city and started the ball rolling for the new church by leaving \$50. All those who have a desire to aid in the building of a Presbyterian church at this place are requested to leave their donations with A.E. Hunt, as he is authorized to receive all monies. The lumber has been ordered and is probably on the way and work will commence soon.

F. Servoss is building a large corncrib and carriage house on his residence property.

A rock yard has been established on the lots south of W.J. McNally's lumber yard.

### Carleton

Geo. Shimpf is hauling stone for the foundation to a new house, which he contemplates building on the Tolles farm west of town, which he recently purchased.

Messrs Waterman & Monoham of Wisconsin were looking up land for a stock ranch in this vicinity.

Our citizens will do well to keep their dogs chained. Henry Shutt is going to set Carl Wilkens to making sausage.

## 1893

### 120 Years Ago

Lou Birchfield and Miss Minta Jordan, both of this city, were married by Judge McKee.

The damages by fire and water will probably be less than \$750, although the building had been repapered and painted within the past two months when Mrs. Gridertook charge of the hotel.



## Winter Safety Tips

The first "real snow" of the year, is a fitting time to think about "Winter Preparedness." Thayer County Health Services wants everyone traveling this time of year, to have safe winter travels. With the low temperatures, and even colder wind chills, it is very important to be prepared for the weather, just in case you become stranded. Here are some tips from the National Safety Council to help you prepare your vehicle for the winter weather.

Prepare Your Car - Is your car due for a tune-up? Start with a checkup that includes:

- Check the ignition, brakes, wiring, hoses and fan belts. Change spark plugs if needed.
- Check the air, fuel and emission filters, and the PCV valve.
- Inspect the distributor and check your battery.
- Check the tires for air, side-wall wear and tread depth.
- Checking antifreeze level and the freeze line.

Necessary Equipment - An emergency situation on the road can arise at any time and you must be prepared. Following the tune-up, a full tank of gas, and fresh anti-freeze, your trunk should carry:

- A properly inflated spare tire, wheel wrench and tripod-type jack
- Ashovel, salt (or cat litter), tow and tire chains
- Jumper cables and tool kit

Essential Supplies - Be prepared with a survival kit that should always remain in the car. Replenish after use. Essential supplies include:

- Working flashlight and extra batteries
- Reflective triangles and brightly-colored cloth
- Compass and matches in a waterproof container
- First aid kit and survival items; blankets, mittens, socks, and cap.
- Exterior windshield cleaner, ice scraper and snow brush
- Wooden stick matches (in a waterproof container), scissors and string.
- Non-perishable, high energy foods like unsalted canned nuts, dried fruits, and hard candy

If You Become Stranded - Do not leave your car unless you know exactly where you are, how far it is to possible help, and are certain you will improve your situation. Try to



attract attention. Light flares if you have them and place one at each end of the car a safe distance away. Hang a brightly colored cloth from your antenna. If you are sure the car's exhaust pipe is not blocked, run the engine and heater for about 10 minutes every hour or so depending upon the amount of gas in the tank. To protect yourself from frostbite and hypothermia use the woolen items and blankets to keep warm. Keep at least one window open slightly. Heavy snow and ice can seal a car shut. Eat a hard candy if you have it to help keep your mouth moist.

Hypothermia can happen very easily and quickly especially in: (1) elderly people with inadequate food, clothing, or heating; (2) babies sleeping in cold bedrooms; (3) people who remain outdoors for long periods—the homeless, hikers, hunters, etc.; and (4) people who drink alcohol or use illicit drugs.

The CDC provides us with warning signs of hypothermia: Shivering, exhaustion, confusion, fumbling hands, memory loss, slurred speech, and drowsiness. In infants signs can be bright red, cold skin and very low energy.

If you notice these signs take the person's temperature. If it is below 95 degrees get medical attention immediately. The CDC advises us to begin warming the person as follows:

- Get the victim into a warm room or shelter
- Remove any wet clothing
- Warm the center of the body first — use an electric blanket if available, or use skin to skin contact under loose dry layers of blankets, clothing, towels, or sheets.
- Warm beverages can help increase the body temperature.
- Keep the person dry and wrapped in a warm blanket.
- Get medical attention as soon as possible.

port. She also reported that we had served 70 for the Annual Turkey feast for the Volunteer Firemen and that all bills for that have been paid.


We had no committee reports but learned that our unit membership is short of eight members to reach our goal.
