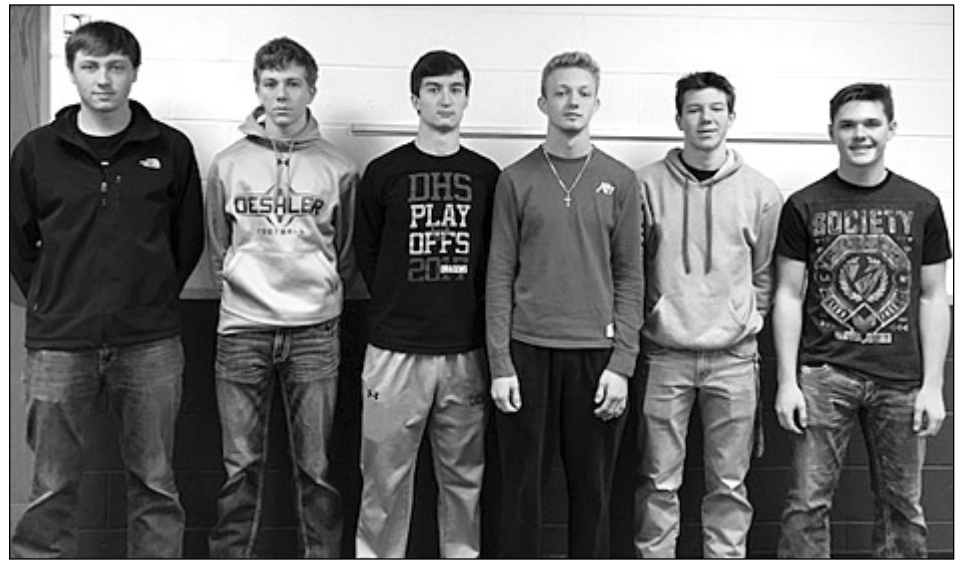

The Bruning-Davenport/Shickley girls won two games on the road last week - against Dorchester, the Eagles topped out 62-23 and in a contest with Lawrence-Nelson, BDS went 47-38. Top shots were Jady Kleinschmidt with 11 points in the Dorchester game and Macy Kamler with 10, and Carley Elznic's 14 points, along with Lexi Kadel and Megan Grote at 10 each in the contest with the Lady Raiders.

The girls were on fire from the beginning of the Dorchester game, Coach Shana Gerberding said. They built a 12-1 lead during the first quarter and by the end, they were at 19 points to Dorchester's six.

"I thought the girls came out and put a lot of pressure on Dorchester right from the tip-off," she said. "Our defense shut down their offense."

By half time, the girls had built a 44-15 lead and cruised the second half for their third victory of the season.

On defense, Kleinschmidt had six steals. The girls

pulled down a total of 43 rebounds, 18 of which were offensive. Elznic grabbed 14 and added eight points. Regan Alfs contributed six points.

Gerberding was also happy with the six turnovers, compared to Dorchester's 21.

"Shooting 74 percent from the charity stripe was another highlight of the game," she said.

Quarter scores were 19-6; 25-9; 14-4; and 4-4 with BDS leading the entire contest.

In Nelson, the Lady Eagles struggled to find rhythm and were on the low end of the halftime score, 21-14.

"The Raiders were ready to take it to us and they did just that," Gerberding said. "Defensively, I don't think we moved well and let L-N get to the basket, and hit some outside shots."

Meanwhile, the Eagle shots weren't falling, but that changed in the second half as the Eagles outscored the Raiders, 33-17.

Gerberding said it didn't feel like they had control of the game until late in the

fourth quarter. The girls were unable to build a lead because the Raiders answered every shot. Finally, the Lady Eagles wore their opponents down.

"Our girls kept battling and putting pressure on them," Gerberding said.

But it was good for the Eagles to play a close game because they each found a way to contribute toward the win, she added.

Elznic snatched 13 rebounds and Kamler, 11 with six of them offensive rebounds. Alfs had six points to her credit.

Their working areas will be on turnovers and free throw shooting. There were 20 turnovers to L-N's 25. On free throws, the Eagles went 6-20 from the line.

Gerberding said the free throw shooting must improve from 30 percent. "The competition will get tougher as the season goes on," she said.

The Lady Eagle record is now 4-0. They were in Sutton Dec. 12 and will play Cross County Dec. 15 before the break.

John Christensen shot for 10 points; Garrett Schardt and Grote, five each; Karson Dickson and Anderson, four; Jacob Swartzendruber, Schroeder, Holden Stengel and Isaac Kamler, three; and Anthony Beavers, Kellen Reinsch, Josiah Kamler and Weber, two each.

Against Lawrence-Nelson, the Eagles took charge of the lane early, starting with a 15-9 lead after the first quarter with Stengel going 4-4 from the charity stripe. They stretched the lead into the half, 27-14, and took full control of the third quarter.

"We were able to get some mismatches in the post tonight and fortunately, were able to take advantage of

many of those opportunities," Schroeder said. "Our posts overall did a good job of going to the basket strong and finished a lot of scoring opportunities."

Defensively, the Eagles are showing signs of improvement in communication and off ball movement.

"It has been paying off," Schroeder said. "We hope to continue that moving forward."

Nine players scored. Beavers led with 13, then came Norder and Stengel with 12 points each. Anderson and Dickson scored four a piece; Schardt and Logan Schroeder, three points each; and Reinsch and E. Schroeder, two each.

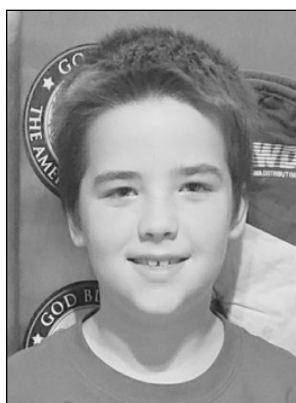
A heartwarming story...



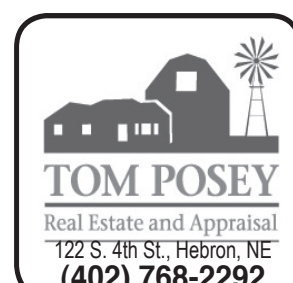
