Treasurer warns of tricky DMV url's

Thayer County Treasurer Karen Prellwitz said some residents trying to renew their driver's licenses are visiting websites that have nothing to do with the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles.

"People have paid and think they actually renewed their license and then they call and say they never got their license," Prellwitz said. "I've had three or four within the last month or two."

She said the examiner's office received similar calls.

"Make sure to read the fine print because at the bottom of these sites, it usually says what people are paying for," she said.

Websites ending in .org, but advertise DMV services are not websites to renew driver's licenses. Nebraska has one website for DMV services at https://dmv. nebraska.gov/. Official government websites typically end with "dot gov."

Prellwitz advises never entering personal information on any site unless the website is valid.

"The other sites will have instructions on how to get a license and some of them are even selling the DMV study book we have for free here," she said.

City grants extension

The Hebron City Council granted a 30-day extension to communities outside of Hebron regarding emergency medical services.

The council had agreements prepared for Gilead and Belvidere at its Monday evening meeting. Bruning will receive services from South Central EMS, free of charge.

"We will sign an agreement tonight at their town hall meeting," Ryan Hamburger of South Central said. Bruning will not be charged for the service. Hamburger said EMS will bill patients.

Hebron taxpayers will no longer be responsible for service outside of Hebron as the city council has stipulated costs to provide services annually for Gilead at \$4,740 and Belvidere at \$2,962.

The agreements will help sustain Hebron's equipment and fuel costs to provide EMS services outside of Hebron.

"I looked at it over the last five years and billing covers less than half of what it takes to run EMS services. Taxpayers are making up the difference," city administrator Chris Fangmeier said.

A committee that included Fangmeier and at least one member of the city council, reviewed Hebron's EMS services to other towns. They also consulted Hebron Fire Chief BJ Linton.

Belvidere and Gilead are interested in the service, and will spend the 30 days to review those village budgets.

Weigle speaks

on initiative

Jason Weigle is the new associate extension educator for the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension in Thayer and Nuckolls counties.

Added to Weigle's title is the Community Vitality Initiative, which focuses on increasing economic opportunities, creating new businesses, help existing businesses with new employment ideas, assist on issues like housing and downtown revitalization.

"Community vitality is the goal to sustain communities for the long term," Weigle explained to the Wednesday coffee crowd last week at D's Daylight Donuts.

According to the initiative, the four pillars are quality of life and placemaking, economic opportunity, youth engagement and entrepreneurship and leadership and civic engagement.

Weigle said the goal includes bringing people back to rural communities, but he said revitalization efforts are often compartmentalized as opposed to the initiative pillars, which must work together in order to boost communities.

"We don't get to tackle the things that are important. You can create all the jobs in the world, but if you don't have places to put these people, then what's the good of doing that?" he said. "If you don't have strong downtowns, what good is bringing new business into downtown?"

Weigle's role will be to help communities navigate through the different aspects of the initiative. He will oversee 10 counties from Jefferson and Saline to Adams and Webster. He is relocating to Hebron with his family, wife, Chandra and son, Silas.

"The other day I was standing there and asked, 'What color do we not have?" Wenske said. "Blue, I'm going to start looking for blue tops. If people want us to look for something, we will try."

Wenske wants Good Intentions to be a shopping destination for ladies out groups, a spot for lake traffic and a go-to place for custom-made gift baskets.

"We're thinking of bridesmaids' gifts for brides to call and order," Wenske said. "We can help out if they tell us what they're looking for."

Soon, Good Intentions will focus on Mother's Day, but for now, a Men's Night will be held Feb. 13.

"We have a lot of people coming and we already have wish lists," Tietjen said. Men's Night is from 5 to 8 p.m., offering a chance to purchase gifts for Valentine's Day. Patrons can watch the Good Intentions Facebook page for updates.

Wenske and Tietjen have made

the store's interior bright and seemingly larger by utilizing space.

"Our husbands were super wonderful. They helped us make the display racks," Wenske said.

She and Tietjen have taken trips together, including the junk jaunt.

"We went junk jaunting and bought pieces and put them in storage," Tietjen said. "All of our fixtures our husbands made for us."

The store opened for a sneak peek in mid-January. Tietjen said more than 100 people came through from Hebron, Deshler, Hastings, Superior and Kansas.

Well, they did not look quite so inviting as some costly cutter I saw in Hebron but they went just as fast for all that and the occupants enjoyed it probably more than those in the swell cutter because they had made it themselves.

Bruning Breeze: The old brass band was out in full force last Saturday night, their regular leader Allen Wells being at home from Omaha during the holidays. After discoursing some of their best music around town they marched to the hotel where they entertained those there with several selections, when they were invited into the dining room and entertained in turn by the landlady with cake and coffee. The boys think that Mrs. Mall's hotel is the best place that they have found yet. Belvidere Blossoms: We understand that Mr. Geo. Aller, will be one of our business men in the near future, having retired from the professional life of school teaching, and bought out Mr. Nider's store...Miss Katie Dougherty returned to her home in Omaha Wednesday morning after having spent several months here in the millinery work. Alexandria: Died, Ida Beers, on Sunday evening, Jan. 2, of diphtheria. She was seven years old the 21st of Dec. and was next to the youngest of Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Beer's children. Davenport: Warren Christener will open up the winter term of school at the ranch next Monday...Mr. Seright died at the home of his son, George Seright, on Monday of cancer and old age. Carleton: Miss Mattie Deaver has been employed as assistant in the post office...The people of this community were greatly shocked by the announcement of the sudden death of Mrs. Henry Kiser at noon Wednesday. The cause of the sudden termination of her life was hemorrhage brought on by childbirth. Mrs. Kiser leaves a family consisting of a husband and three little girls. She was a members of the Methodist church and highly esteemed in the community.


