wife worked in Kansas and boarded planes to attend conferences.

In May of 2015, long after the victim's mother had called the contact between Stone and her daughter off, Stone emailed the victim, telling her he missed her terribly:

"I miss your family so very much. I hope one day soon we can get past this. I hope you are well. I think of the decent, positive times we shared. I'm sorry for the things that have become out of hand."

May was the month the victim's mother took her daughter to the Child Advocacy Center to start the forensic process that stemmed from the sexual assaults.

Stone also emailed the victim when he left the state in January of 2015.

"She was telling me things she didn't want her mother to know," Stone testified toward the end of the trial.

"You continued to tell her you loved her and missed her terribly," Bergevin pointed out to Stone. "When you got back, you gave her a gift, this piece of jewelry that has two hearts."

"I have never seen that before. I don't know what it is," Stone answered as Bergevin showed him the jewelry.

Stone continually denied he was involved with the victim, even though he told her he reached out to her as he "spiraled into depression and wanted to commit suicide."

Stone also told a bizarre story about his victim that was contradicted by the victim herself and a family member, who was a witness.

During one of the last times the victim spent time with Stone, he splurged for a \$150 meal in Omaha and mentioned taking the victim and the family member to Las Vegas.

"It was just a comment. Apparently, it was more important to them than it was to me," Stone said.

He began his nearly six-month assault spree soon

after he met his victim by suggesting to her mother he could help her with her education. The victim was homeschooled.

Stone told the mother he was versed in math and science and eventually, said he would adopt his own curriculum, brushing the mother's Christian curriculum aside.

Barbara Sturgis, a psychologist in private practice, testified on grooming tactics perpetrators use to gain access to their victims.

They're willing to take care of the child, she said.

Stone had begged the mother to give her daughter to him, the mother told the jury.

"He said 'just give her to me. I want her.' He tried to reassure me everything would be fine if I just gave her to him," she testified.

Following the jury's verdicts, Allen asked Thayer County District Court Judge Vicky Johnson that Stone's bond be revoked because he may be suicidal and a flight risk.

Stone's attorney, Rick Tast, told Johnson Stone was willing to surrender his passport.

Johnson said Stone stands convicted of four Class 1B felonies as well as child abuse.

"Bond is revoked," she said.

Johnson ordered a pre-sentencing investigation prior to Stone's sentencing date Sept. 1 at 10 a.m.

She also thanked the jury of six women and six men for their dedication.

"Thank you for the research you've done in this very important public service. It's you that make us a strong country," she said.

In a statement, the attorney general's office said it is pleased with the guilty verdict.

"We appreciate the work performed by the jury," the statement read.

## FSA county committee nomination period began June 15

Thayer County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Jay VanWesten announced that the nomination period for local FSA county committees began on Wednesday, June 15, 2016.

"County Committees are unique to FSA and allow producers to have a voice on federal farm program implementation at the local level," said VanWesten.

To be eligible to serve on a FSA county committee, a person must participate or cooperate in an FSA administered program, be eligible to vote in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area (LAA) where they are nominated.

This year, nominations and elections will be held in LAA #3, which includes the precincts of Alexandria, Chester, Gilead, Highland, Hubbell and Rose Creek.

Farmers and livestock producers may nominate themselves or others. Organizations representing minorities and women also may nominate candidates.

To become a candidate, an eligible individual must sign an FSA-669A nomination form. The form and other information about FSA county committee elections are available at [www.fsa.usda.gov/elections](http://www.fsa.usda.gov/elections). 2016 nomination forms must be postmarked or received in the Thayer County FSA Office by close of business on Aug. 1, 2016.

Elected county committee members serve a three-year term and are responsible for making decisions on FSA disaster, conservation, commodity and price support programs, as well as other important federal farm program issues. County committees consist of three to 11 members.

"It is important that county committees are comprised of members who fairly represent the diverse demographics of production agriculture for their community," said VanWesten. "All producers, including women, minority and beginning farmers and ranchers, are encouraged to participate in the nomination and election process."

FSA will mail election ballots to eligible voters beginning Nov. 7, 2016. Ballots must be returned to the Thayer County FSA Office via mail or in person by Dec. 5, 2016. Newly-elected committee members and alternates will take office on Jan. 1, 2017.

## Riding for hunger through Hebron

Lana Beeson of Omaha stands outside Mary's Café Monday afternoon. She is part of the Nebraska United Methodist Bike ride for hunger. Hebron was a stop on this year's ride. Tuesday, the riders were headed toward Sutton. The hunger trek is 300 miles with riders biking 70 miles per day.

Reverend Bill Ritter, who founded the Nebraska United Methodist Bike ride for hunger 21 years ago, said the tally this year to beat hunger is \$60,000 and counting.

Ritter pulls 125-150 riders each year from different states to tour Nebraska while raising money for food banks, Heifer International, Society of St. Andrew's and the Africa University Agricultural program.

The riders this year are from Alaska, Kansas, Missouri, West Virginia, Illinois,

Arizona, South Dakota, Iowa and Colorado. The route began in Milford and will end there after riders bike a total of 300 miles.

"We have our own bike shop with us and EMT," Ritter, who started his ministry in Shickley in 1980, said.

After dining at Mary's Café, the group set up camp at Thayer Central for the night. They bike 70 miles per day.

Ritter said he has raised \$793,000 for hunger in 21 years.





Industry needs identified and addressed in the applications included bulking up in skilled labor via creation of a manufacturing talent pipeline, focusing on future job growth with an emphasis on manufacturing, working closely with schools to offer curriculum tailored to industry needs, industry education outreach, and promotion, mentoring and financial support among others.

"As the state's second largest industry, we have an opportunity, not only to fill the workforce needs of our manufacturers, but to help them continue creating good-paying jobs and to connect them with quality, highly-skilled employees," said Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED) Director Courtney Dentlinger. "This program is helping us increase awareness among our younger students about the many excellent careers that exist for them."

"MetalQuest is thrilled to be the recipient of a Nebraska Developing Youth Talent grant. We are fortunate to be a part of the Manufacturing Career Pathway Program at South Central Nebraska Unified School District," said Scott Volk, Vice President of MetalQuest.

"This grant will have a direct impact, exposing area students in grades 6-12 to exciting and challenging manufacturing careers. Students will now be able to get real life experience through project-based learning strategies, building upon the career pathway concept currently in development. We are very excited to be a part of this program, and appreciate the assistance in helping develop the manufacturing talent so desperately needed."

"On behalf of Distefano Technology & Mfg., Dream it Do it, the Nebraska Advance Manufacturing Coalition, Omaha Public Schools, and a group of business leaders dedicated to creating awareness in manufacturing, I would like to thank the Governor for awarding us the Nebraska

Developing Youth Talent Initiative grant," said Brian Turner, Vice President and General Manager of Distefano. "These funds will assist us in furthering the work of creating an awareness of careers in manufacturing for our youth. We are excited to get started."

About the DYTI Grant Recipients:

MetalQuest in Hebron is working with the South Central Unified School District to support and offer the Career Pathway Program with an emphasis in manufacturing to students, grades 6-12. Middle school grades 6-8 will be offered exploratory courses in manufacturing under the supervision of a college-level instructor who is hired by the District and Central Community College working with MetalQuest and other business partners. This will lead students who choose a manufacturing career path into project development at the 9th and 10th grade level.

Distefano in Omaha as part of an area consortium of manufacturers will establish the Metro Area Mobile Manufacturing Expo (M3E), a traveling mobile lab for Omaha Public Schools (OPS) middle schools. M3E industry leaders (including Distefano and industry volunteers engaged with "Dream It Do It") collaborated with Omaha Public Schools and the OPS Career Center to draft the M3E education plan. This fall, industry partners will deliver nine mobile expo experiences, such as introductions to 3D design and printing, automation, welding, robotics, and related careers to OPS middle schools. In addition, the plan is to host an additional three mobile expo experiences at community events the summer of 2017, impacting 2,700 students in year one.

About the Nebraska Developing Youth Talent Initiative:

Last year, the Governor proposed DYTI to respond to rapid innovations in the manufacturing and information technology sectors. Next generation workers in these industries require advanced skill sets and knowledge to help companies compete in the global economy. Meeting workforce demands will continue to require innovative approaches to develop a youth talent pipeline, and this initiative has been a step toward laying the groundwork for that pipeline.

"The Nebraska Developing Youth Talent Initiative is a great way for our state to connect young people with potential career options," said Governor Pete Ricketts. "Expanding educational opportunities and creating more and better paying jobs are two of my administration's top priorities. This initiative is opening up horizons for young Nebraskans looking for a career track with good-paying jobs."

"The Nebraska Developing Youth Talent Initiative is challenging industry and education partners to come up with innovative, creative ways to engage students early on in selecting careers that both satisfy their future aspirations and help fill workforce needs for highly-skilled employees," said DED Director Dentlinger.

"As our 21st-century economy continues to rapidly shift and grow, DYTI can evolve and grow along with it to ensure that our businesses can fill the demand for employees whose skills meet the exacting demands of work as it exists at any given time."

Through this initiative, DED is providing up to

\$125,000 financial assistance each to MetalQuest and Distefano for the 2016-2017 school year. The Governor and DED previously awarded financial assistance to Flowserve in Hastings, and Hollman Media, LLC, of Kearney for the 2015-2016 school year.

How Business Qualify for the Nebraska Developing Youth Talent Initiative:

Businesses that qualify for DYTI are those in the manufacturing sector or businesses in need of high-skill information technology professionals. At least one business selected for a grant must be in a county with a population less than 100,000.

Grants through DYTI are provided to private sector for-profit entities. Businesses are selected by independent scoring by a multiple agency committee with recommendations shared with the Governor for final approval.

DYTI grant recipients partner with schools to engage students to participate in hands-on career exploration and relevant workplace learning opportunities. The programs reach students beginning in the seventh and eighth grades and must demonstrate sustainability and measurable impact.

Interest and participation in the program by students may be initial metrics, but measures may also include tracking of course-taking patterns through high school, possible work experiences provided by businesses after initial exposure, and tracking of post-secondary plans.

"They just made our first ones here less than a month ago," Stewart said.

Meanwhile, Dietrich designed the website at atv-wheelstop.com that features a promotional video, and information about using wheel stops to eliminate accidents and inconveniences.

A wheel stop is a stationary aluminum structure that is used to brace ATV's, UTV's, golf carts, lawnmowers or other movable equipment when hauled.

Wheel stops may be bolted down in the bed of a pickup or trailer, or folded for storage when not in use.

"We have 100 right now. We are feeling out the market and might have to go to some trade shows," Stewart said.

He said two new businesses in the family are no big deal.

"We're always looking for something to do," Stewart said as he listed off a number of family ventures, S&K Weld-

ing, Oink, Inc., and Brinegar & Son.

"We are diversified," Stewart said.

Dietrich, a student at University of Nebraska-Lincoln in finance, said the best part is he gets to work with his family.

"I love working with my family. There is always something to do," he said.

It was a family event for Rise Up Yoga & Fitness, too.

"Dietrich helped with all the technical hookups, and Preston and Stewart built shelves and doors. It's really been a family thing," Kristen said about the decorative partitions in her studio.
