

Thayer Central youth serve as leaders to support youth prevention initiatives

According to the 2015 Nebraska Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 22.7 percent of adolescents have consumed one or more drinks on at least one occasion in the past 30 days, and 14.3 percent of adolescents have engaged in binge drinking in the past 30 days. Nationally, as reported by the CDC, alcohol is the most commonly used substance of abuse among America's youth. Two students in our community are working to prevent underage drinking and substance use through leadership and community connections.

The Youth Action Board (YAB) is coordinated by Region V Systems Prevention Team and is comprised of high school and college youth, to develop youth leadership within their home communities. YAB works to reduce youth substance use and underage drinking through a variety of community activities and initiatives. YAB sponsors three annual events: June Jam, Red/White Tailgate, and Youth Leadership Day, which includes over 1,000 youth and 100 sponsors from all over Southeast Nebraska. Collin Fink and Maggie Harris, students at Thayer Central High School, serve as representatives of Thayer County on YAB. YAB is made up of 24 youth that represent communities all over southeast Nebraska. "This year, every county in Southeast Nebraska is represented," said Fink. Both Maggie and Collin have found that serving on YAB has opened up doors to experiences and opportunities that allow them to use their leadership skills to promote positive youth development in their community. Fink says he first became aware of YAB 10 years ago when his older brother Kesston became the first Thayer County student to become part of YAB. "I knew that coming into high school I wanted to be part of YAB," said Fink. He currently co-chairs as president of the board. Maggie, who is serving

as co-chair, recalls hearing her older brothers talk about the fun they had at June Jam when she was younger. "I knew I wanted to try it," says Harris who also followed in her older brother Cole's footsteps, who served on YAB as a student.

Both teens believe that positive peer leadership is an important part of youth substance use prevention in their community. "Helping students to develop a culture of not drinking takes time and continued initiative," says Harris. "The message we want to share" says Collin, "is that you can have fun without drugs and alcohol." Promoting positive social norms around underage drinking, having open dialogue with students about risks associated with underage drinking and substance use and creating fun and inviting opportunities for kids to engage in drug and alcohol free events are important aspects of YAB.

Harris and Fink credit the positive influence of their parents in their decision to not engage in risky behaviors such as underage drinking or drug use. According to a study produced by the Foundation for Advancing Alcohol Responsibility, 83 percent of adolescents say that their parents are the leading influence in their decision to not consume alcohol. The power of parents is something that families should not take for granted in efforts to prevent underage drinking. "It is important that parents sit down and talk openly to their kids about the dangers of substance use and the risks involved in underage drinking," said Fink. By talking with children early and often, parents can play a role in their child's choice not to drink. "Despite what kids may say, they really do care about what their parents think. If parents share with their kids their feelings and beliefs around underage drinking, then they will take that into consideration in the choices they make," said Harris.

While YAB is focused around substance use prevention

and mental health needs and giving kids an avenue to ask for help. Even though we may not have a high suicide rate in our community, I feel like there are a lot of issues, like depression, that maybe parents and teachers aren't seeing because they don't know what to look for." Both Fink and Harris are hoping to partner with other community members and school professionals to bring more awareness of the importance of suicide prevention and mental health awareness.

Youth are important players in the growth of our community. Leadership roles such as YAB and opportunities to enhance youth connectedness to their community can serve as protective factors that promote healthy youth development.

How to read the news

The public's frustration with the American media and beyond is building and what's worse, are the Americans who give credibility to media organizations because they are the "big" names in media — The New York Times and Washington Post are two examples. That covers print, however, this editorial addresses print, broadcast and online "news."

The tabloid reporting coming from the "press" at the top of the journalism spectrum is worrisome. It takes the profession and twists it into something ugly and unethical. Journalists are journalists because they have a penchant for justice and truth, but as we are seeing today, those who call themselves the "press" and report stories with information from "anonymous sources" are not doing Americans a service. And, that is what journalism is — a service. News stories are history's "first draft" and if the first draft rests on air, we have a problem.

Most all of these "news" organizations have cried out, "Freedom of the Press," but they are leaving a crucial part out — that freedom comes with a tremendous responsibility and when a journalist meets this responsibility, it is a terrific feeling of service.

On March 10, "LIBERTY The Press and the Presidency in the Post-Truth Era" will be held at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Concerning are the players who will present: Human Rights Watch, the Washington Post and the Omaha World Herald.

All three of these organizations have reported false information regarding the "wars" in the middle east. The Omaha World Herald often regurgitates information from the Associated Press. Human Rights Watch calls for further sanctions on Syria.

In the description of the seminar, the phrases, "Alternative News" and "Fake News" are mentioned. Perhaps the most worrisome.

Since 2002, the United States has been at "war" in the middle east. You know the drill. It started with the weapons of mass destruction in Iraq and Saddam Hussein's cruelty toward his people. Later, it was Gaddafi in Libya who was the murdering tyrant, then, President Assad of Syria, who was gassing the Syrian people.

At some point, it became clear the WMD story rang weak and even the "big" media corporations reported the evidence was falsified, however, they continued to relay the same rhetoric coming from Washington on Afghanistan, Libya and Syria. Washington continued to speak for Americans, as if we wanted "war," as if we wanted our fellow Americans fighting in a desert overseas, going days without sleep and coming home suicidal, and as if the reports on these foreign leaders were true.

The result is tens of thousands of innocent middle eastern people and Americans died and not one word from the media on the possibilities the "evidence" is thin. In fact, the media began pushing more stories on how "bad" Assad is.

Independent journalists, the US Peace Council, Hands Off Syria and Rep. Tulsi Gabbard (who is now being demonized) have spoken out on ending the "regime change," which is a nice word for genocide, in Syria, and to the perpetual "war." Gabbard also introduced a bill to stop American tax dollars from funding terrorism. Remember, these "wars" are costing the United States billions every day.

Reading the "news" today is a tricky task, but it can be done. Here are a few tips on how to determine if a news story is true:

1. A lot of sites and social media pages regurgitate news from other sites, such as the New York Times. Some will come right out and name the publication, others won't. If the source for the original story is named, go to that story.

2. Look for the quotes. Who said them? If they are unnamed or anonymous, the story is questionable. For example, a Washington Post story from last week, claimed the GOP was in disarray, according to "an anonymous source" who wanted to remain anonymous for future information" from the White House.

3. After the quotes are scanned, move on to reading the story. Watch the language for dramatic words. Many reports are sensationalized using language. Skip over these words to get the story. You may have to scrap it all together.

4. Read the story from beginning to end and then read it again. If some of the details seem questionable, such as 7-year-old Bana tweeting full sentences in English from a war zone and using government buzzwords, like "No-Fly Zone," the story is untrue.

5. Start picking the story apart. Verify against the original sources, i.e., Olga Korbut was reported as selling her Olympic medals. On her social media, however, she adamantly denied it as hashtag fake news:

"OMG, Russian article said I sold medals because I'm broke. Not true! Happy & Healthy in AZ. @nbc @tmz @abc @cbs #fakenews. I have a gr8 life."

She was the source for this particular story.

On executive orders from the White House: Go straight to the White House website and read them. If you don't have the media filter, you will be more informed.

6. Notice how you keep seeing the same story over and over, just on different sites or pages. After you've checked the story out, realize this: You are meant to see it over and over, i.e., the Clinton "nomination" and subsequent "win."

7. Remember the underdog. We have independent journalists in Syria and just because the Washington Post dismisses their work, doesn't mean they are not reporting the truth. Many underdog journalists are credible. In fact, we are lucky they don't work for the Post or its counterparts.

8. Refrain from using "Snopes" as a tool to verify articles. Snopes has attempted to discredit the independent journalists in Syria, even though the evidence from them carries more weight than the reports from the American media.



Eagles top Knights, both sent to state tourney

The Bruning Davenport Shickley Eagle boys met the Nebraska City Lourdes Central Catholic Knights Feb. 28, for the fourth district championship game in four years.

The past three years with Lourdes saw games down to the wire with BDS taking two of the three and last year's game as both teams advanced to the state tournament because of the wildcard system.

The difference was this year BDS had to win to get in and Lourdes had a wildcard sown up.

The game started with both teams fairly tentative on the offensive end, but aggressive on defense.

Lourdes jumped to a six-point lead, but thanks to a late 3-point basket by John Christensen, the Eagles trailed 12-11 entering the second period.

A Caden Norder 3-pointer and two assists by Kale Kleinschmidt allowed BDS to climb into the lead at halftime, 24-22.

"It really felt like the whole first half we were trying

get a feel for the other team's defense," Head Coach Fred Kluck said. "We'd make a little run then they would and by halftime, we were basi-

cally back where we started. Neither team could really pull away."

The game continued down that line as each team scored 11 points in the third quarter and BDS entered the fourth quarter leading 33-33.

The game began to shift. Lourdes scored to take the lead on a traditional 3-point play, but the Eagles came right back with three of their own as Kale Kleinschmidt knocked down a 20-footer to give BDS the lead for good.

"That was as big a shot as we had all game," Kluck said. "If Kale would miss that and they rebounded it, now for the first time since the first quarter we would be playing from behind on the defensive end. Lourdes is too strong a team to try to come back from too far down on."

Norder led all scorers with 22 points on the night while Kleinschmidt added nine points to go with his eight assists.

Christensen scored seven points with Noel Gines and Holden Stengel contributing four each along with Stengel's game high nine rebounds.

Garrett Schardt and Anthony Beavers scored two points apiece to complete the scoring.

The Eagles were scheduled to play their first round game at 3:45 p.m. March 9 at East High versus Randolph.







The Thayer County Board of Commissioners met in open and public session in the commissioner's room of the courthouse at 9:00 a.m. on March 1, 2017. Present were Commissioners Dave Bruning, Dean Krueger, Rick Dageforde and County Clerk, Marie Rauner.

Dave Bruning, chairman of the board, called the meeting to order.

Public meeting laws are posted and available on the north wall of the meeting room in compliance with Nebraska statutes.

The minutes from the previous meeting were mailed to the commissioners for review. Dean Krueger moved and Rick Dageforde seconded to approve the minutes from the February 15, 2017 meeting. Result of vote: Krueger-yes, Dageforde-yes, and Bruning-yes. Motion carried.

George Gerdes, Thayer County Road Superintendent, met with the commissioners to discuss ongoing road projects and give a department update.

The chairman signed the County Bridge Match Program Agreement between Thayer County and the Nebraska Department of Roads, Project #: STWD-CBMP (1) as passed by resolution at the last meeting.

Dean Krueger made a motion to approve the application of Roger Pollman to occupy county road right-of-way for a water line in Sec-18-T1-R1. Dave Bruning seconded the motion. Result of vote: Krueger-yes, Bruning-yes, and Dageforde-yes. Motion carried.

Thayer County Ag Society members, Bob Dankenbring, President, Kurtis Elting, Treasurer, and Travis Miller, Vice-president, met with the board to propose options for the disbursement of the Ag Society allocated funds designated to them each budget cycle. Another meeting will be held with them and the budget authority in April to further discuss options available.

Wm. McPherson, Emergency Manager, met with the commissioners to discuss his employment review as mandated by the grant guidelines.

Steve Albin, United Benefit Services, updated the commissioners on changes in the healthcare industry and marketing the county employee policy for the next insurance renewal.






