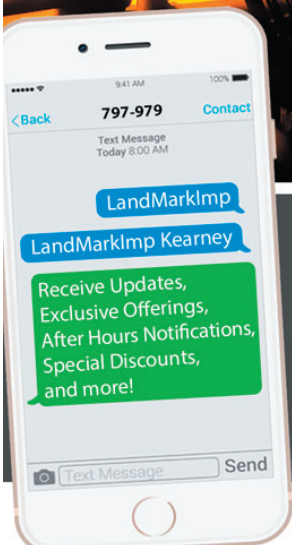

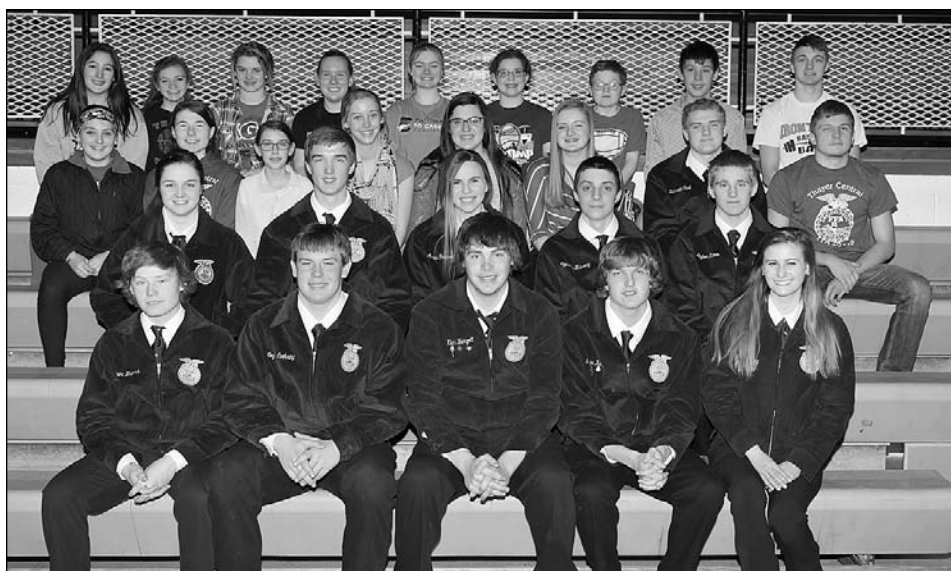

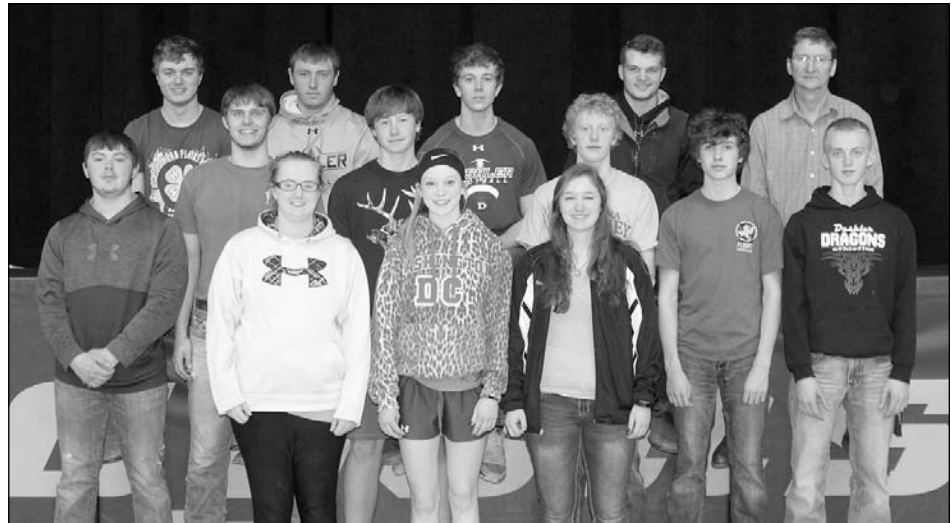

Members of FFA throughout the county fill each school year with activities and service. The most recent FFA group was organized in Deshler because the district had an opening in vocational education and hired Ron Rickstrew as the group's advisor to start the process.

"Mr. Rickstrew has been a great addition to the faculty at Deshler Public Schools," Superintendent Al Meier said. "His experience in sponsoring FFA has been beneficial to starting FFA at Deshler Public. Student interest in FFA will only grow under the leadership of Mr. Rickstrew."

Rickstrew came to Deshler from Diller-Odell, where he taught shop classes, agriculture and advised FFA.

The seniors Rickstrew has in FFA today pushed for FFA when they were freshmen.

"They'll develop skills needed for other areas besides agriculture or farm," Rickstrew said about the leadership opportunities coming out of FFA.

Treasurer Daniel Petersen said he is glad to have one year in FFA — Petersen is one of six seniors in FFA this year.

They spent FFA week in February with a movie day, serving school staff break-

fast and wearing the FFA dress blues, among other activities.

Over at the Bruning-Davenport chapter, FFA members decorated the halls, drove their tractors to school and held dress-up days to involve students.

The BD FFA had two members make the National FFA Band — Skyler Knigge and Isaac Baysinger.

Treasurer Emilie Schardt recalled the chapter's meal \$2,000 fundraiser, which successfully purchased two Cattlemen's Ball calves for the Calf for a Cure project.

"We're a community of members that work together to do things in our community," Schardt said. She added they recruit new students to FFA through planned activities.

Vice president, TaraLee Hudson, said currently, they are preparing for the FFA state convention in April at the Pinnacle Arena.

Hudson describes FFA as a student-led organization to promote agriculture.

"Thayer County is an agricultural-based county," she said.

"We're open to everybody because agriculture is such a large industry that can involve everyone," Baysinger, who is the treasurer, said.

Thayer Central doubled in membership last year and are up to 34 members this year.

During FFA week, members facilitated a game for students and staff — Hide the Emblem, a petting zoo, served lunch to the Beef Boosters and handed out a coloring page for elementary students to complete. The pages are hanging in the school cafeteria.

It will be the third year for Thayer Central's garden just west of the school. Advisor Rachel Eickman said they will plant fruit trees and vegetables.

"The main goal is to get the produce back to the school in August," she said. The FFA maintains a grow tower of lettuce in the cafeteria.

President Keith Hergott said they now have their greenhouse, which was installed last summer with tables made by FFA members.

They are also helping with parking at the Cattlemen's Ball, Hergott said. Eickman said they will assist the caterer as well.

Eickman said next, they will work on FFA's new space next to the football practice field. She is hoping to eventually have a cow, sheep, goat and pig.

Beef program going well in Thayer County schools

All three schools in Thayer County are now serving local beef at least two times a week and have taken the facts about beef to classrooms.

Thayer Central is in its third year of serving local beef on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The quality of lunches is up, along with participation in the hot lunch program, which was recognized in the most recent school board meeting.

Normally, hot lunch participation is in the mid-60 percent range. During January, participation was nearly 81 percent.

Thayer Central was a prototype for other schools, which also followed by starting their own beef programs. The school was host to a beef summit that invited over 50 schools.

Superintendent Drew Harris believes over 70 schools across Nebraska have implemented a beef program.

The school is looking forward to benefiting from

FFA's harvest this fall.

Bruning-Davenport Beef Boosters began their program approximately 2.5 years ago. Beef is served in the cafeteria two to three times per week and sometimes more because cafeteria staff will include local beef in soups, like a vegetable beef or chili.

The school is using about five animals a year.

Last year, FFA alumni purchased steaks for the FFA banquet.

Booster Gina Hudson, who helped develop the program, said students are educated on the different cuts of meat used in sirloin dishes, fajitas, steak meals and pizzas.

"Our cooks have been phenomenal about trying new things. It is exciting to provide high quality protein to our students," Hudson said.

The local beef meals have drawn more students and teachers to eat at school.

Statewide, the beef program hasn't grown as quickly as beef promoters

originally thought, but the state is a third of the way to 100 percent.

And, Omaha Public Schools are now buying ground beef from a feedlot in the Wisner-West Point area, which Hudson said is exciting.

Deshler recently had its first steer butchered and food service manager Cindy Mesloh said she will serve up a roast at the end of March.

She said they are serving local beef twice a week and the educational aspects of beef and meat processing are reaching elementary students. She also involved FFA students.

The beef program at Deshler was started by a small group of people led by Sarah Kabes and Andy Schmidt. All funds flow through the Deshler School District Foundation.

Deshler and Bruning-Davenport beef comes from McLean Feedlot in Stromsberg, allowing the two schools to share transportation costs.

Davenport pork producer Duane Miller provides input on Checkoff Programs

Duane Miller, a pig farmer from Davenport, served as a delegate to the Pork Act Delegate assembly Feb. 28 to March 2 in Kansas City. Miller was appointed as a delegate by the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture.

"It was important to me to represent pork producers from across the United States as a Pork Act delegate," Miller said. "As an industry, we are committed to 'elevate U.S. pork as the global protein of choice by continuously and collaboratively working to do what's right for people, pigs and the planet.' This was reinforced throughout the Pork Act delegate meeting."

Miller was one of 163 appointed delegates who traveled from 47 states across the country to represent pork producers and importers who sell pork products in the United States. The duties of the delegate body include nominating members to serve on the National Pork Board, establishing how much of the Pork Checkoff is returned to state pork organizations and providing direction on pork promotion, research and consumer and producer education priorities funded by the Checkoff.

To fund programs, America's pork producers contribute 40 cents of every \$100 of sales to the Checkoff. Importers use a sales formula to contribute a similar amount. The role of the Pork Checkoff is to promote and enhance consumer pork demand on a global basis, as well as to invest in research designed to improve production practices and safeguard the pork supply, the environment and animal well-being. Building consumer confidence and educating America's pig farmers about livestock production practices through training and certification programs also are key priorities.

The National Pork Board approved a 2018 budget for national spending of \$63.2 million for promotion, research and education programs. The strategic direction of the Pork Checkoff is centered on building consumer trust, driving sustainable production and growing consumer demand in the United States and globally.

"It has never been more critical that we work together as producers, processors and food-chain partners to provide high-quality pork products to consumers," Miller said.

The National Pork Board

has responsibility for Checkoff-funded research, promotion and consumer information projects and for communicating with pork producers and the public.

Through a legislative national Pork Checkoff, pork producers invest \$0.40 for each \$100 value of hogs sold. Importers of pork products contribute a like amount, based on a formula. The Pork Checkoff funds national and state programs in advertising, consumer information, retail and foodservice

marketing, export market promotion, production improvement, science and technology, swine health, pork safety and sustainability and environmental management.

Teaching beef to the state

Gina Hudson was Nebraska Cattlewoman of the Year for 2017 as a reward for her service to the Nebraska Cattlewomen. She served as NCW president and led the organization's Consumer Promotion and Education Committee. Hudson is still a co-chair for the committee.

The NCW holds agriculture days for fourth grade students throughout the state and participates in Nebraska's Largest Classroom at

the state fair, teaching some 3,000 children about beef.

The state fair also gives NCW the opportunity to educate all ages, Hudson said.

"There is more to beef than just beef. There are soaps, shampoos, cosmetics, medications — we just need to educate our consumers why we need cattle," she said.

She said the farming community is now three generations removed — there is a producer gap in families

between generations.

"It is alarming and keeps getting more distant. There are less of us out here," she said.

Nebraska Cattlewomen Consumer Promotion and Education also participate in the Nebraska Beef Ambassadors Contest; Nebraska Beef in Schools Program; Beef Outreach and Promotion events across the state; and Beef in the Classroom Project.



Aurora Coop announces 2018 scholarships

The Aurora Cooperative announces it is accepting applications for its 2018 Aurora Cooperative Scholarship from now through March 26, 2018. Students can complete the application online at www.auroracoop.com or download the application from the website and mail it in.

These scholarships provide financial support for current high school seniors and also students enrolled in college who are pursuing a college education and career in agriculture. The Aurora Cooperative began awarding scholarships in support of continuing education within the agricultural sector.

This year five \$1,000 and ten \$500 scholarships will be awarded. The qualifying students must attend a public or private post-secondary institution in the 2018-2019 school year and major in an agriculture-related field. The applicant's parent/guardian must be an active patron of the Aurora Cooperative.

"The Aurora Cooperative is committed to the agriculture industry and is honored to help students who are as passionate about it as we are," said Kevin Sagehorn, Vice President of Marketing, Aurora Cooperative. "We believe in the future of agriculture with our young

people and this is just one more way we can give back to our farmer-owners. By re-investing in the next generation."

The Aurora Cooperative has awarded 100 scholarships totaling almost \$78,000 since the program began in 2008.

Landowners--your help is needed for weed control



The invasive weed called phragmites was put on the Nebraska Noxious Weed list several years ago. Since that time it has become very prevalent in South Central Nebraska. We need your help in reporting to us any sightings that you may have had so that we may chemically treat it.

This invasive perennial is found most generally along the river, around ponds, along creeks, CRP acres, and in the bottom of sub-irrigated ravines and road ditches. The plant spreads not only by seed, but is rhizomatous and can spread tenfold in a single season. It has no forage value to livestock or to wildlife.

With phragmites being declared as a noxious weed, it is required that landowners control and eradicate it. However, if you feel you may have an infestation, large or small, please report it to your County Weed Superintendent and it will be treated FREE OF CHARGE.

This summer we will have the funding and man power

to adequately treat it. Don't let it go, as its thick mass will choke out all other palatable vegetation.

It can be easily identified with its fluffy seed head identical to pampas grass or shatter cane.

The Twin Valley Weed Management Area has been receiving grant funding the past eight years from the Nebraska Environmental Trust to combat this invader along the Republican River and Little Blue River with excellent success. However, this work will be all in vain if we do not treat the source of the problem upstream in our tributaries and ravines.

Once again, get it reported to us this year and it will be treated FREE OF CHARGE. If you have a tenant overseeing your property, please notify them of this service. After that it will be the landowner's financial responsibility.

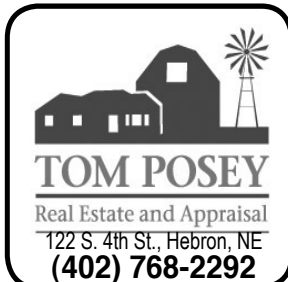
