Deadline approaches to file for Soybean Board

This year, the Nebraska Soybean Board (NSB) will be seeking three soybean farmers to serve on the Board of Directors and to represent fellow soybean farmers and the industry.

How does the Election work? The election is conducted by mail-in ballot in July. Soybean farmers who reside in counties that are up for election in 2018 will receive ballots and candidate information regarding NSB's election process via direct mail.

What are the 2018 Election Districts and Counties? District 1: Counties of Antelope, Boyd, Cedar, Holt, Knox, Pierce and Madison.

District 3: Counties of Butler, Colfax, Dodge, Douglas, Sarpy, Saunders and Washington.

District 6: Counties of Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson, Saline, Seward and Thayer.

Who Can Be a Candidate for the NSB Seat on the Board?

- Be a resident of Nebraska
- Be a resident of the district in which the election is being held
- Be a soybean farmer in Nebraska for at least the previous five years
- Be 21 years of age or older
- Have submitted a NSB candidacy petition

Candidacy Must:

- Obtain a NSB Candi-

dacy Petition by contacting NSB's Executive Director, Victor Bohuslavsky, at (402) 432-5720

- Complete the petition and collect the signatures of 50 soybean farmers in their district
- Return such petition to the NSB office on or before April 15, 2018

Roles and Responsibilities of Soybean Board Member Representative:

- Attend every NSB Meeting – 8 day fiscal year commitment
- Attend/participate in other educational events sponsored by the Nebraska Soybean Checkoff
- Receive no salary but are reimbursed for expenses incurred while carrying out board business
- Serve a three-year term that would begin October 1, 2018

Candidacy Must:

As an elected representative from NSB, you will help guide the Nebraska soybean industry in the areas of research, education, domestic and foreign markets, including new uses for soybeans and soybean products.

Volunteers to assemble upcoming ball centerpieces

Two weeks ago, the *Hebron Journal-Register* featured an aspect of the upcoming Cattlemen's Ball that has tapped the grass-roots art movement of barn quilts. Workshops have swept the area, originating from a committee formed to promote barn quilts as part of the ball's decorations.

"Whip Up a Barn Quilt" was the theme for several workshops that involved people like Renae Kamler, the committee chairperson of Fillmore County Barn Quilts, who was asked by Phyllis Schoenholz to join the quest for barn quilts in

support of the ball. Kamler assisted with the planning, preparation and instruction of the classes, and has featured many of the finished pieces on the Barn Quilts of Fillmore County Facebook page.

"We will also have a number of high school art classes in the area to paint smaller one-foot square quilts to have as table decor in the tents," Kamler said about the ball.

Ball decorating committee chair, Nancy Hofts, said the ball is hoping to draw 5,000 people. Hofts is busy bargain-hunting for

centerpiece materials to help decorate 588 tables.

"That's what I think about when I can't sleep at night — the decorations on the tables," Hofts said.

She is using a sunflower motif to fit with the theme of "on the prairie," and a variety of other items — such as old boots and the centerpieces of barbed wire wrapped around posts from a former Thayer County Feeders' banquet.

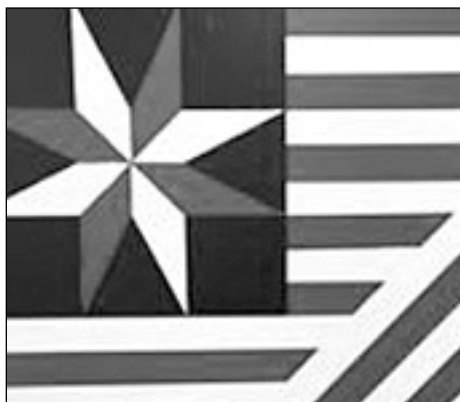
Hofts said the committee also has 1,000 Mason jars to chalk paint and arrange simulated succulents for some of the centerpieces.



A variety of centerpieces will be placed on the 588 tables inside the big tent at the Cattlemen's Ball, including this one that features prairie flowers in bright colors.



This centerpiece is a wagon with zinc canning lids used for the wheels to go along with the "on the prairie" ball decorating theme. Barn quilts will also be part of the table decor, tent decorations, and silent and live auctions for cancer research. The Cattlemen's Ball is June 1-2 at the Hergott Farm.

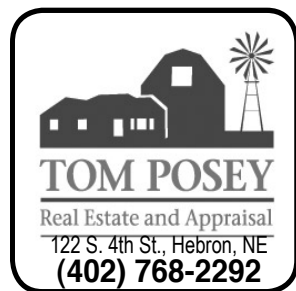

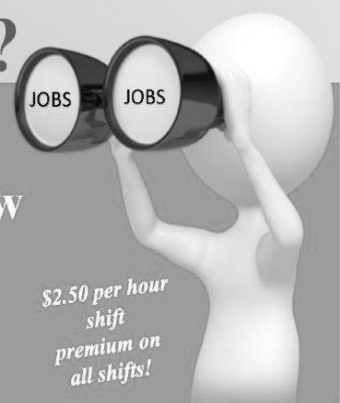

Eagle girls runners-up

The Bruning-Davenport/Shickley Lady Eagles made the trip to the state championships last week to battle the North Central Knights for the title.

Megan Grote came out on the court to set the tone with 2, 3-point baskets, but the Eagles may have been slightly nervous, Coach Shana Gerberding said in the press conference following the game.

High turnovers, low rebounding and scant looks at the Eagle basket boosted the Knights' score and had them leading in the third quarter at 34-19 with 4:38 left on the clock.

Gerberding said the experience was a bit "surreal," although making it to the state championship is always the season goal.

"Even today I had confidence as a coach," she said.

"I believe in these kids."

"It's not really our style of basketball," she said.
