## Classroom doors part of upgrades

The Thayer Central Board of Education has approved improvements for the summer, which were already accounted for in the district's budget and currently totals \$199,585.

The list of upgrades includes school security. About half of Thayer Central's doors are key-less entry via card or fob and are on schedules.

"One of the nice features about that is we can set the doors on schedules to be locked or unlocked," Superintendent Drew Harris said.

In a more serious situation, the doors would not be accessible to most of the cards or fobs, Harris said. The only people with access would be part of school administration, law enforcement or the fire department.

Steel doors and sheet rock will replace the current doors and doorways. The narrow, rectangular windows in the doorways will be covered with sheet rock.

Harris said the windows provide no cover for students.

"There is no place to stand in some of those rooms out of the line of sight," Harris told the board.

A square window will be in the upper middle of the steel doors. Its placement is strategic — if someone breaks the window and tries to reach in, their hand will not be able to reach the door handle from the inside.

Harris said the school is going to upgrade a test room.

"If we feel comfortable with it, we'll proceed to other classrooms," he said.

Additional improvements will cover flooring in the gymnasium, lobby and cafeteria; finishing up four classroom remodels; plumbing in lights in the high school locker room; epoxy flooring in the elementary locker room; sidewalk repairs and painting.

On the future list for the district are renovate the high school lobby and restrooms; ceiling and lighting in the metals area; high school business room improvements; and air conditioning in the high school gymnasium.

The district is also trying to keep the afterschool program going, which ranges from eight to 20 children.

Elementary principal, Kurk Wiedel, said the program's life hinges on staffing. Two people have applied for the position.

Wiedel also mentioned the elementary will welcome 41 kindergartners in the fall while first grade will usher in 20 students.

The elementary held a step-up day. Students had a chance to spend about 30 minutes with the teachers they will have next year.

Wiedel gave the board a summary of the school's bank teller program, which hosts approximately 120 students.

Additional school news included the FFA Greenhouse Grand Opening May 16, with plants for sale afterward, and a possible all-school musical next year, which may cancel out the One Act.

Students are excited about the prospect, Harris said.

In other news, administrators and staff will visit Sandy Creek May 22 to have a look at its Career Pathways program.

The district's auction is June 15. The house and several outbuildings next to the football practice field will be auctioned. Older tables from the cafeteria are also on the list, along with kindergarten chairs, universal weight machine, croquet sets, tents, two electric ranges, two refrigerators and a variety of other items.

## 1888 130 Years Ago

The petition circulated by Director F. A. Powell to call an election to vote \$16,000 in school bonds for the construction of a new high school building, has about 75 signatures.

Attention is called to the new standing advertisement of T. J. McGovern & Co., manufacturers of cigars and dealers in tobacco.

A camp of the order of Modern Woodmen of American was instituted in this city on last evening by Deputy Head Consul, N. W. Noble.

To W. S. Wood, from York, is due the honor of building the first house on the county land addition. He has commenced the erection of a fine residence on a lot bought of H. H. Sisson.

There has been a compound fracture of the vertebrae of winter, as it were.

Three families and a single man by the name of Goodman have rented farms near the county line northwest of Alexandria.

J. C. Helfrich will soon start a manufactory here for the making of pruning hooks. He has already bought the steel. He will put in steam power.

Geo. Williamson, of Gilead precinct, has the first new potatoes of the season. They grew in the pit where he had covered up last year's crop.

Mrs. Andresen, a sister of Mrs. Olsen on Spring Creek, arrived last Thursday from Trondheim, Norway, making the journey in twenty days, in company with her son, Jens Andresen, a photographer by trade. With her also came a niece, Miss Jonson, from Hammerfest, who joined Mrs. Andresen and her son at Trondheim. The sisters had not met for thirty years.

Belvidere Era: The Knox Brothers, from over on the Blue, dehorned over one hundred cattle at this place this week. Mr. Barruss had 97 head dehorned and is so well pleased he says he will hereafter have all the stock on his place dehorned.

A man of Gilead is wanted for complicity in the whiskey traffic. So far he cannot be found.

## 1898 120 Years Ago

Deshler: The Water Work Bonds carried Wednesday by a vote of 85 for and only seven against... This shows the energy of the people. The school house bonds carried two months ago. This means a new school house, water works, a mile of cement sidewalks and a dozen new residences for Deshler the coming season. Every hand points to the future great-

ness of our city. The people here have been fishing for industries and its coming and coming fast... The three months' old baby of Albert Kietzke died Sat. and was buried Mon. The baby was a sufferer from birth, and death in reality brought relief.

The Hebron Telephone Company has again changed names and officers, and will now be known as the Thayer County Telephone Company.

Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Higbee of Rockford, Ill., have been spending the winter with their daughter, Mrs. C. J. Deming, and are so pleased with Thayer county that they are thinking of making their home here.

The many friends of Mrs. Sarah Wright, formerly of Middlesex farm near Carleton, will be pined to hear of her death in Chicago last week.

A communication for publication without a signature was received this week which we are compelled to omit, as we cannot vary from the rule of the office that all articles for publication must bear the author's name, not necessarily for publication, but as an evidence of good faith. The writer may use a pen name, but the editor must know the identity of the author.

## 1928 90 Years Ago

Lincoln Tel. & Tel. Co. last Friday purchased the Davenport-Kiowa telephone company and expect to rebuild the plant in both town and country. The privately owned telephone systems in Thayer County are Alexandria, Byron, Chester and Hubbell.

## 1938 80 Years Ago

Elmer A. Harmon of Belvidere has purchased the William Miller two-story brick building on West Lincoln Avenue and will engage in the implement business in Hebron.

Quarantine on the Harry Ferguson home will be raised this week. Mary Louise and Marjory have been afflicted with scarlet fever several weeks.

The horse and mule sale at the Jack Williams sale barn in Fairbury last Friday resulted in the sale of 151 horses and mules and sold for shipment to the cotton fields in the south.

An incubator stove exploding caused the destruction of the incubator house and the loss of 300 baby chicks at the Bob Miller home Friday night.

## 1948 70 Years Ago

(The Alexandria Argus)  
Approximately 60 athletes from 12 schools participated in the annual Night Relays, sponsored by the Alexandria High School, under the direction of Coach Riemers, Tuesday evening. This evening is a traditional track classic of southern Nebraska and has won wide recognition among high school circles. Although Davenport did not win a first place in any relay, they won nine points to take first place at these relays.

Fire of unknown origin completely destroyed the old ice house building belonging to Mrs. Anna Bricka of Fairbury, last Saturday evening.

Beginning with May 15, and continuing to May 21, the post office department will celebrate the 20th anniversary of the first air flight in the U.S. A mail plane may stop here on Thursday, May 19.

## 1958 60 Years Ago

Hugh Stanclift of Alexandria was the first Thayer County boy to die in the naval service... Hudson Stanclift, aged 22 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Stanclift of Alexandria, a volunteer in the Navy, died from diptheria, and the body arrived at Alexandria, his former home. Six weeks ago he came home to Alexandria on a ten-day furlough and went back to camp, making preparations to sail soon for France. This is the first death in the Stanclift family, the parents, two brothers and three sister being left to mourn his loss... The third death reported from Thayer county is that of young Mil-

## Taking care of mental health



When diagnosed with cancer, heart disease, or diabetes, you don't wait years to start treatment. People in the first stage of these diseases start right away looking for ways to reverse their symptoms. They don't ignore them. In fact, they develop a plan of action to try to stop the progression of the disease. So why don't we do the same thing when dealing with potentially serious mental illness?

Catching mental health conditions early is known as Early Identification and Intervention. Many times people don't realize their symptoms are caused by a mental health condition or feel ashamed to pursue help because of the stigma associated with it. Even though treating mental illnesses involves treatment, people can and do recover.

The following are the stages often seen with mental illness:

**Stage 1** - This stage consists of mild symptoms or warning signs. Someone may begin to experience loss of sleep, feeling tired for no reason, feeling low, feeling anxious, or hearing voices. They are often able to function but feel something is "not right."

**Stage 2** - By this stage it usually becomes obvious something is wrong. A person's symptoms may become stronger and last longer or new symptoms may start appearing. Performance at work or school will become more difficult, and a person may have trouble keeping up with family duties, social obligations or personal responsibilities.

**Stage 3** - At this stage symptoms have continued to increase in severity, and many symptoms are often taking place at the same time. A person may feel as though they are losing control of their life and the ability to fill their roles at home, work or school.

**Stage 4** - At this stage there is a combination of extreme, prolonged and persistent symptoms and impairment often results in development of other

But when they do, the results can be truly amazing.

One way for someone to see if they are experiencing symptoms of a mental health condition is to take a screening. You can take a quick, confidential screening for a variety of mental health conditions; anxiety, depression, mood disorders or post-traumatic stress disorder by going to [www.mhascreening.org](http://www.mhascreening.org). This screen is not a diagnosis, but a guide for you to use to start a conversation with your doctor, a trusted friend or a family member. If necessary, your healthcare provider can refer you to mental health provider for an evaluation.

Thayer County Health Services wants to help end the stigma surrounding mental health. Through compassion and education, we can all do our part to break through the stigma - because no one deserves to suffer in silence.

To better serve our patients, Thayer County Health Services will soon be offering Behavioral Health services with Kelsey Schilf, PLMHP, a Behavioral Health Clinician. Starting in June, patients with a referral will be able to make an appointment.

## Court hands out sentences

Sentences for Eric Donahoe, Ethan Roth and Todd Nelson were decided in Thayer County District Court May 1.

Donahoe was sentenced on attempted terroristic threats, a Class IV felony, to intensively supervised probation for 24 months.

Roth pleaded guilty to distribution of a controlled substance; possession of money used to intended to facilitate a controlled substance violation; bribery; deliver or manufacture drug paraphernalia; possession of marijuana, more than one ounce, but not one pound; and drugs and narcotics

unlawful acts.

Roth was assigned to the Gage County Attorney's office, Bradley Kalkwarf and Shaylene Smith to represent him in drug court. Roth is scheduled for a May 21, 2:30 p.m., drug court appearance at the Saline County Court-house.

His bond was continued.

Todd Nelson entered a plea agreement as of May 1 on the charge of child abuse intentional, a felony with a consequence of up to three years in prison and thereafter, 18 months of supervision or a \$10,000 fine or both.

The agreement states Nelson will also plead guilty to tampering with a witness, which is two years imprisonment and 12 months of supervision, or a \$10,000 fine.

Bond is set at 10 percent of \$50,000. A presentence investigation was ordered and Nelson is scheduled for court July 3 at 9:45 a.m.

slideshow for the runway presentation.

"Typing up these biographies is tough because you don't realize what they have gone through," she said. "It's tough for anyone to tell their story."

Light music, also selected, in part, by the models, will play in the background as master of ceremonies, Ashli Brehm, reads their stories.

Brehm was diagnosed with breast cancer and blogged her journey and approach to the disease online. She was also a speaker at the Thayer County Health Services Wellness Fair last fall.

The show committee wanted to simplify for the models. They let the survivors contact them if they wanted to model and took it upon themselves to connect with several boutiques and clothing stores, from Bryon to Hebron to Geneva and beyond.

Marsh said merchants have offered discounts or donated entire outfits. In Hebron, hair stylists have volunteered for dos and makeup on the morning of the show, but that is also up to the models.

"If they choose," Marsh said.

The show will feature younger and older models wearing athletic to western wear to present day fashions, all along the runway of barnwood planters made by Connie Lichty's group of friends.

Volunteers — there are over 800 of them — may be the ball's best kept secrets.

"I am excited to see our community and surrounding communities work together for one awesome cause," Marsh said.

That cause is the ball's main purpose — to raise funds for cancer research.

One of Marsh's closest volunteers is her daughter, Addie, who wanted to decorate the trees at the ball site on the Hergott farmland.

Nine-year-old Addie Marsh has thought about her idea for months, even creating her own committee and calculating expenses.

"It felt like we were at the ball for them," she said.

She told her friends and every year since, they have attended as a group.

She credits her husband's tenacity for Hebron's chance to showcase the ball.

"He has a huge heart," she said. "He took it upon himself to talk to Randy and before I knew it, the advisory team is coming down and here we go."
