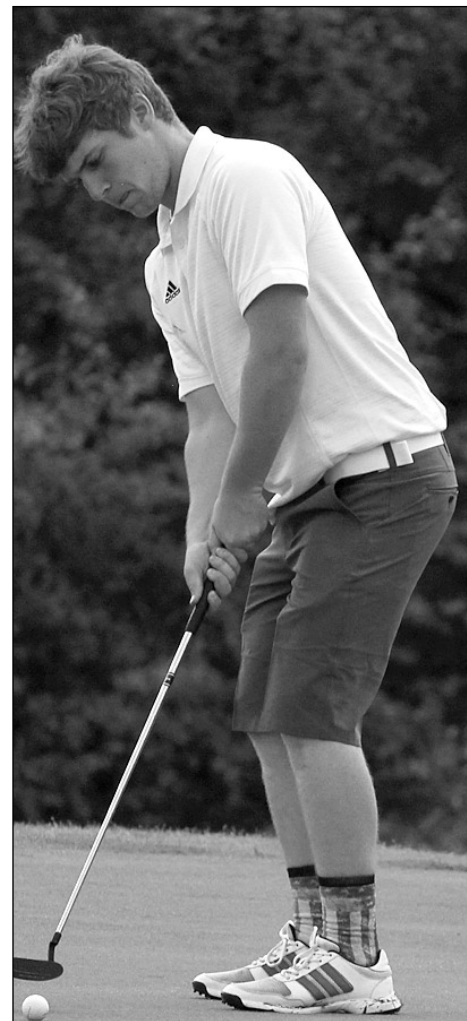

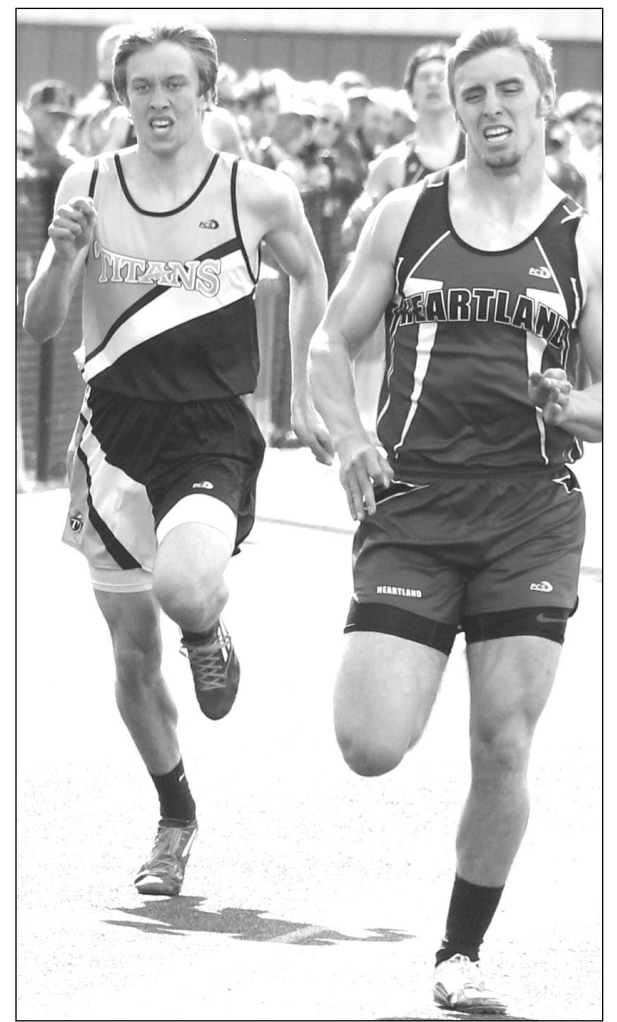

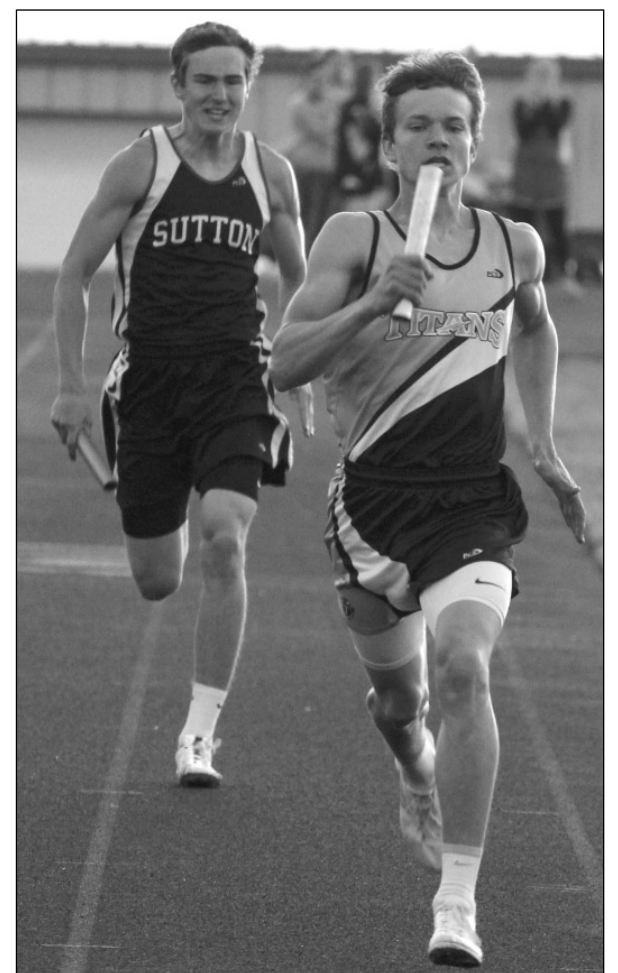

## Man sentenced in 2013 car wash case

A plea agreement was reached in Jesse Whittaker's case in Thayer County District Court May 5. Whittaker, 39, Bedford, Ind., was charged with burglary and theft prior to the plea agreement, which resulted in attempted burglary and theft charges.

Whittaker pleaded no contest to both and was found guilty.

The incident leading to the charges, plea agreement and subsequent convictions stem from June 30, 2013. Whittaker reportedly had a trucking job that took him through the midwest and into Nebraska, according to a probable cause affidavit filed by the Thayer County Sheriff's Office.

Whittaker was washing his truck at Hebron's Express Car Wash in the late evening hours of June 29, 2013 and was observed by a witness. Later, the Thayer County Sheriff's Office discovered the business had been entered by drilling door cylinders and personal and business items were missing.

The sheriff's office was contacted by someone in Indiana who knew Whittaker and described the items — a computer tower, television, archery equipment, keys, tools, air freshener totes and other items dispensed at car washes, were in Whittaker's possession.

Following a Sept. 20, 2013, domestic disturbance at Whittaker's home in Indiana, the items were confiscated by Lawrence County Indiana law enforcement officers.

Whittaker was identified via one of six driver's licenses shown to the witness who saw him at the car wash June 29, 2013.

In October of 2013, he contacted the Thayer County Sheriff's Office and said he had the items in his possession, but had purchased them at a truck stop.

Whittaker was sentenced to a \$500 fine on each count and ordered to pay \$136 in court costs, plus additional travel expenses. In addition, he was also ordered to pay \$14,399 in restitution.

In another district court case, Autumn Noojin, 18, was arraigned on attempted burglary, burglary, two counts of possession of burglar's tools and two counts of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Noojin pleaded not guilty to the charges, which originate in Deshler involving a business and residence.

A pretrial conference was set for June 6 at 1:30 p.m.

be paid for," he recalled. "I didn't pay for pencils or books."

Kassebaum said his high school years were great and his training and track success opened doors for him that otherwise wouldn't have been there.

Memorial Day weekend is usually a special time for him because it is alumni weekend in Hebron. Seeing classmates is always good, and Kassebaum also likes to visit the graves of his parents and other people who influenced his life.

He earned his undergraduate at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln between running 10 miles on Mondays and a quarter mile more on Tuesdays in track practice.

Kassebaum went on to seminary school and was ordained in 1975. Since, he has served church congregations in Nebraska and California.

For the past 20 years, Kassebaum has been in Mesa, Ariz.

The track program back then was a stellar one, or to hear Tracy Long tell it, they

had "a heck of a team."

In 1966, Long, Lester Reinke, Loren Peithmann and Ron Lange set the state record in the mile for 10 minutes because another team came across the finish line 3/10 of a second faster.

At that time, Hebron was in Class B and ran the relay in 3:23.8 before Class A came in at 3:22.7.

"It was a pretty exciting time," Long, who is the brother of Coach Andy Long at Thayer Central, said about being in track. "We were the smallest Class B school and we had a lot of good athletes."

He said they were given a standing ovation at the end of the mile relay.

"It was the only standing ovation I've ever had," Long said, as he named off the first place medals in 100 dash, 440, 880, mile and mile relay and the second place medal in the broad (long) jump.

"If you could ever talk about a dream team, that would be it," Kassebaum said.

And then in 1967, they won in the half mile, pole vault, mile and two-mile

relay and defeated Grant for the Class C team championship.

"Those were the glory days," Long said. "And then, we won in state cross country."

What made the team so good was Coach Smith, Long said.

Long, who lives in Chadron and is thinking about returning to Hebron, said they had to run on crushed cinder at the state meet. He remembers the large donation Smith made for the all-weather track in Hebron.

As Long and Kassebaum recall growing up in Hebron, neither have to search their memory banks.

"It was great town to be raised. You could go anywhere on a bicycle," Long said.

And for Kassebaum, who has parishoners all over the world, he remembers what a joy it was to be around his fellow athletes.

"It changed my life forever," he said.

George Gerdes, Thayer County Road Superintendent, met with the commissioners to discuss ongoing road projects and give a department update.

Jerry Cattlett, Fred Bruning, Zach Messman, Ryne Philippi, Matthew Leit, Dan Werner, David Burd, and Doug Wismer, met with the commissioners to discuss the permanent financing for the hospital following the completion of the hospital construction. Local representatives for the banks and the hospital will be meeting with bond agents later today.

C.J. Johnson, director for Region V Systems, presented the annual report and submitted the budget request for 2017-2018 as mandated by the state legislature. Dave Merrill, director for Region V Services presented an annual report for the past year and had Sandra Meyer speak to the board about her activities with Region V. Mr. Merrill also presented his budget request for the upcoming budget cycle.

Jane Ford Witthoff, Health Director for Public Health Solutions, presented an update on the Public Health Solution's priority issues and an annual report.

Mike Onnen, for Little Blue Natural Resource District, presented for signing an Interlocal Agreement between Little Blue, Thayer and Jefferson County, and the City of Hebron for funding for a stream gage on the county line for the Little Blue River. #### RESOLUTION NUMBER 1813

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Thayer County Commissioners in regular session with a quorum present that said Commissioners hereby purchase and direct the County Treasurer of this County to issue Tax Sale Certificates to and in the name of Thayer County, Nebraska, as to all parcels of real estate in said county upon which taxes are delinquent for two years or more and to purchase all subsequent taxes thereon as the same may become delinquent. Daniel L. Werner, Thayer County Attorney, is authorized and directed to proceed with actions in Court within a reasonable time to foreclose in the name of Thayer County, Nebraska, the tax liens on the real estate which remained unsold for want of bidders after having been duly advertised and offered for sale at administrative tax sales conducted by the County Treasurer of said County resulting from delinquency in the payment of taxes levied and assessed by the proper officials of and for the governmental subdivisions for which Certificates of Tax Sale were issued more than three years ago to said Thayer County, Nebraska, and upon which the subsequent taxes which became delinquent were purchased by said County.

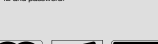
