## Strong storms hit the area

A system of strong storms rolled through Thayer County Monday evening dropping up to 1.5 to 1.75 inches of rain and packing an estimated 80-100 m.p.h. straight-line winds. "I have a large pin oak tree in my yard," said Thayer County emergency manager Bill McPherson, "and it was snapped off 20 feet above the ground during the storm."

Areas had already received anywhere from a quarter to nearly a half-inch of rain early Monday morning.

Monday evening wind downed large tree branches and flipped pivots near Alexandria. "Windows were broken at the Miller farm near Carleton and tin was ripped from outbuildings," McPherson said. "They also lost the harvest door on a grain bin and a grain dryer blew over at Cargill."

While a tornado was reported three miles south of Davenport traveling east at 40 m.p.h., McPherson said he was unaware of a confirmed tornado anywhere in the county. The Village of Davenport experienced a power outage after a transformer was damaged, but restoration was

quick. Small hail was also reported in different areas.

Spotters were called out for all Thayer County communities by 8:05 p.m., when the leading edge of the storm showed rotation in the clouds accompanied by the constant rumble of hail. The county was put into a tornado warning until 8:15 p.m. after a funnel cloud was spotted near Davenport.

Also at that time, spotters reported a possible funnel cloud five miles east of Belvidere and at 8:20 p.m., another was spotted one mile west of Alexandria. A few minutes later, Thayer County Law Enforcement advised volunteer fire departments that another front was moving in as the storm began to back-build over Superior.

At 8:57, Chester spotters were called out again as the new line began its trek over Byron, Chester and Hubbell. Although Dopplar Radar showed defined rotation in the clouds, no funnel clouds or tornadoes were reported from the ground as it made its way across the county.

The National Weather Service is predicting a likelihood of strong storms to hit in the evening hours all week long.

## Titan golfers earn Class D state title



# Pages of the Past...

## 1883

### 130 Years Ago

Col. Harbine of Fairbury is building a shelter from tornadoes.

Chester is making preparations for a fine Fourth of July celebration.

Fred Duchren has planted 20 acres of pumpkins for feeding hogs.

E.H. Geisler and Wm. Struve will soon start a lumber yard at Friedensau.

Uncle E.J. Huse very properly boasts of his rye which is now five and one-half feet high.

The dedication of the new Methodist Episcopal Church of Hebron will take place next month.

Henry Werner Jr., is building a dwelling house on his farm three miles southwest of Friedensau.

John Brash of Spring Creek has commenced shearing sheep. The average is 10 pounds to the fleece.

Mrs. Harlan P. Harding is making a beautiful and splendid quality of gilt-edged butter for table use.

A bridge on the township line north of the mill, about half a mile, is very much needed by those living west of the county seat.

Several relatives of Peter and Andrew Olsen arrived this week from Norway.

F.A. Powell has now gone into the insurance business, making a specialty of insuring against loss by tornadoes.

George and Dick Bobst, formerly of this precinct, are now in San Francisco, Calif. They have employment as street car drivers at \$65 a month.

A party from Friedensau, after imbibing quite freely of the favorite beverage of Gambrinus, lost three hats on his way home. A neighbor brought the hats to Hebron and deposited them in the saloon, where the owners were obliged to redeem them.

The called meeting of the settlers at Hebron to consider the report of the committee relative to the Kneval, Mitchell and Parker land cases, was largely attended by citizens of this county. After thorough discussion of all the points presented, a committee was elected to go to New York for the object of holding a conference with Mr. Kneval and other claimants for the purpose of securing a stoppage of all further proceedings against the occupants, and laying a definite foundation for congressional action at the next session. The following were elected as such committee: Hon. James Laird, A.F. Clemmons and E.M. Correll.

H.B. Hamilton left Carleton for the new Eldorado, Dakota, with a view of permanent location in that region. He was one of Carleton's oldest citizens and leaves many friends behind.

Keep it before the people that Carleton wants a dry goods and clothing store and a hardware and lumber yard.

Kaup & Lincoln have their implement house completed in Carleton.

C.P. Leigh of Carleton is building a good-sized barn with an eight foot stone basement under it.

Davenport Uncle Reeves Miles has an increase of about \$900 pension

Capt. Kinney has bought a half section northwest of town and is improving it.

The three blacksmiths are busy. They are having plenty of work.

G.W. Beams is improving and building on the quarter section he bought north of town.

Belvidere Frank Martin is breaking prairie for Will Bruning west of Belvidere.

Dr. J.J. Piggott has sold his fiery dogs. The doctor is getting to be quite a jockey.

Mrs. D.A. Derston of Rockford, Ill, sister of Mrs. C.J. Deming, has returned home.

C.F. Moore is building an office. We understand he will sell implements for Malowney & Wilson. He will also erect a large wind feed mill.

The lumber trade is booming. P.F. Burruss sold \$300 dollars worth of lumber to a Friedensau party.

Mcnally, our new lumberman, purchased the building recently occupied by S.G. Carman, set it on wheels and

moved it on the lots west of the schoolhouse, and is now fitting it up with additions until it shows a neat and respectable dwelling.

There is a healthy move on foot to start a newspaper at this place.

## 1893

### 120 Years Ago

Dr. Elder has received two carloads of rock from Louis Lange's quarry at Hubbell for the foundation of his new residence on Lincoln Avenue west of S.H. Young's residence.

A special engine came up to take W. Thomson's car of race horses to Chester to connect with the train to Denver.

F.H. Rudd, formerly of this city, is running a flour and feed store at Gresham, Ore.

Rufus Easton, who is studying pharmacy with C.C. McLeese at Davenport, visited his parents.

Elder Humphreys has resigned his pastorate of the Christian church here and will probably accept a call to Aurora, this state.

Dennis Green has bought Mr. Borland's interest in the Haffner livery stable, and the firm name will hereafter be Haffner & Green.

A cave-in at the new water-works ditch came near having a serious termination, three men barely getting out in time. City Engineer Barger was embedded up to his waist by the earth, but was neither hurt nor frightened by the incident.

This paper has often spoke in terms of the high merit of Artist Griffin's photographic work, his enterprise and his successful business. He has five assistants. The views of this city recently finished in his gallery are very fine and will meet with a large sale.

J.M. King has sold his farm two miles north and four miles east of Hebron to Jacob Wonderly of Rock Island, Ill., for \$6,200. The purchaser will soon take possession. Mr. King will commence manufacturing his press drills in a short time.

It is reported that Ed Beaver has bought out the meat market of Benjamin Hill and will occupy the room next west of Hazard & Co's shoe store. The present quarters of Mr. Hill are to be fitted up for B.F. Young's abstract office.

The Hebron Alumni Association gave its third annual banquet in honor of Columbian class, '93 immediately after the commencement exercises.

The people of Hebron turned out en masse to attend the graduating exercises of the class of 1893.

Decoration Day was celebrated with the almost universal patriotic interest that has ever distinguished this day in Hebron — a day held sacred to the memories of the brave defenders of the Union in dark days of 1861-65.

The interior of W.L. Thompson's brick business house on south side of Lincoln Avenue between Fourth and Fifth streets, occupied by Elsworth & Clark as a butcher shop, was seen to be on fire. The invincible fire department of Hebron soon subdued the fire, when it was learned that the fire had spread over the entire inside.

Alexandria One of the largest crowds this town has seen for years assembled here to observe Memorial Day. At 9:30 the long roll was beaten by Drum Major Selleg and the procession formed in the following order and marched to the school grounds: Alexandria Drum Corps, G.A.R., A.O.U.W., M.W. of A., North Prairie Band and Citizens on Foot.

Belvidere Dave Willey has a father visiting him from Missouri who will remain here for some time.

D.W. Wonderly has a brother visiting him. He will buy land here if any can be found that is suitable.

Carleton Mahlon Berkely of Pennsylvania, brother-in-law of Mrs. J. R. Lichty, Mrs. S.S. Flickinger and the Beachy boys arrived here from his eastern home. He is a former resident in this vicinity and received a hearty welcome.

Chester

Dr. J.C. Mosshart and family returned from their visit to the World's Fair.

Numbers of our farmers are plowing up their wheat and putting the land in corn on account of the dry weather.

Byron Owing to the severe illness of his daughter, Chas. Covert left for Illinois.

Davenport Mr. Rile from Somerset County, Pa., is visiting his sons, Wm. and Wilson. He talks some of moving out here this fall.

While raising his barn, Harrison Hoover fell from the top of the barn striking across the sill beneath, bruising him up considerable, but we are unable to learn at this writing just how bad he is hurt. Lamoraux's boy who was standing beneath Mr. Hoover, was struck across the back by a 6x6, which came down from the top with Mr. Hoover. He is also seriously hurt.

## 1903

### 110 Years Ago

(The Alexandria Argus) The Argus was printed on wallpaper.

John Marsh is building a new house.

Charley Bruckert is building a large barn.

Walden Willard is home from Omaha to remain a few days.

Those graduating were Benj. F. Allen, Bertha Brittain, Mabel West, Ellen Coane, Fred McDowell, Flossie Knox, Edna Wilson, Howard Wiswell and Levi Simmons.

## 1913

### 100 Years Ago

(The Bruning Banner) A large crowd of young people attended a barn dance at the J. Baumann farm home five miles west of Bruning.

Commencement exercises were held in the Bruning opera house with H.R. Park presenting the diplomas to John W. Redelfs, Herman A. Duis, Loy E. Guthrie, Earl H. Meyer and Irl S. Rouse.

Robert Casper returned to Bruning from Omaha and accepted a position in the lumber yard.

Albert Heinrichs was preparing to build a big barn on his place.

## 1923

### 90 Years Ago

(The Bruning Banner) Carl Johnson purchased the Martin Garrels farm adjoining Bruning on the south for \$17,500.

E.E. Wells was excavating and laying a foundation for an addition and basement to his residence in Bruning. When completed he would have an all-modern home.

The Bruning Banner was urging the Bruning school board to resume the teaching of music in the schools.

Members of the Bruning graduating class were Mildred Park, Olga Bruning, Lavada Garrels, Hilda Philippi, Fred Wilhelms and Darrel Walker. Mildred Park was valedictorian.

Joseph Zimmer and wife of Belvidere have the sympathy of this entire community in the affliction that has befell their small child. The child had one of its eyes badly injured from falling on a paring knife. During the past week this eye became so badly infected as to require its removal in order to save the child's life.

The Belvidere Commercial Club is working in conjunction with the cemetery board trying to work out an endowment fund for the upkeep of the

## Understanding Skin Cancer

As we approach the warm days of summer, it is important to again stress the importance of sun safety to everyone planning to enjoy the great outdoors. Summer can be a great time to take advantage of outdoor activities, but it is also important to remember to practice preventive medicine to protect yourself and your loved ones.

Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the United States, with more than 1 million new cases diagnosed every year. One in five Americans will develop skin cancer during their lifetime and it is one of the few cancers where the cause is known: overexposure to UV rays of the sun.

It is estimated that more than 10,000 Americans will die of skin cancer this year. Over the last two decades, the incidence of melanoma has more than tripled among Caucasians.

In a recent survey of over 10,000 young people ages 12-18 from all 50 states, found that the simple use of sunscreen on sunny days was practiced by only 34.4 percent of youths. In addition, the survey discovered that 83 percent of teens had experienced at least one sunburn in the previous year, and 36 percent had experienced three or more sunburns.

Natural sunlight isn't the only significant source of UV exposure for teens. Approximately 10 percent of young people surveyed said they had used tanning beds in the previous year. This form of UV exposure is practiced solely for cosmetic reasons. Teenagers are intentionally putting their health at risk. There seems to be a popular misconception among young people that indoor tanning is safe.

The best way to avoid the risk of skin cancer is to limit exposure to intense sunlight and to practice safe sun exposure. For example:

- Avoid the sun when it is strongest - from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.;
- Use a sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or higher;

• Wear a hat with a wide brim to protect your face and sunglasses to protect your eyes

• Follow safe sun practices even on cloudy days because UV rays travel through clouds.

Skin cancer can occur anywhere on the body, but occurs most often on parts of the body exposed to sunlight, such as the face, ear, neck, and hands. Routine exams of the skin increase the chance of finding skin cancer early. Skin cancer comes in two types:

• Non-melanoma skin cancer is the most common type and can be fast or slow growing but rarely spreads to other parts of the body.

• Melanoma accounts for a small percentage of skin cancer but is far more dangerous and causes the majority of skin cancer deaths. The good news is it is almost always curable when detected early.

Some of the risk factors for skin cancer include:

- Over-exposure to natural or artificial sunlight;
- Fair complexion (blond or red hair, fair skin, green or blue eyes);
- Multiple or atypical moles
- Family history

Treatment for skin cancer depends on several factors including: the stage of the cancer, type of cancer, size and location, and the patient's general health. Depending on these factors, treatment may include surgery, radiation therapy, chemotherapy, and/or photodynamic therapy.

If you have an area of the skin or changes in a mole you are concerned about, make an appointment with your healthcare provider by calling the Thayer County Health Services appointment line at 402-768-7203.



### Home Alone – Are Your Children Ready?

Summer is here. School is out and for many working parents, considering self-care for your children even if it is for short periods of time, can be a real challenge. There is no magic age at which children develop the maturity and good sense needed to stay alone. Nebraska has no law that states a specific age when children can be left alone; however, there are some very specific concerns you should consider before your child is in this situation.

A knock on the door when a child is home alone may be a frightening moment. Children need to remain calm and realize most people who approach the house do not intend to harm them. When children are home alone, you may want to instruct them not to answer the door at all.

But if you do expect them to answer the door, they should try to identify who is at the door before opening it. This can be done by saying, "Who is it?" through the closed door or looking through a window. Children should not open the door to a stranger.

When children are home alone, the phone can be a source of comfort and reassurance. Calls to parents, family members or friends can make their time alone less scary. Children need to understand while the telephone is a valuable safety tool, it can also be a source of danger. If you have an answering machine or caller ID, you can encourage your child to screen calls before answering them.

Otherwise, instruct your child to begin by only saying "Hello." Never answer the phone by giving your name. Never tell a stranger you are alone or your parents are not home. If a stranger asks to speak to your parents, say they are busy and cannot come to the phone. Never give any information about you or your family and offer to take a message.

Making emergency calls is a skill everyone needs to practice. When calling 9-1-1, be sure your child can state the problem and give first and last name and give your complete address. Perhaps they can give the nearest intersection, cross streets, or landmark if they do not remember your address.

Besides 9-1-1, parents should post other important phone numbers for easy access in case of an emergency. You may want to add numbers such as the poison control center; local power, gas or telephone companies; doctor;

parents' work numbers and trusted stay-at-home neighbors.

Your children should understand an emergency is when there is a real or potential threat to their health or safety or to personal property, and they cannot handle the situation alone. Examples of emergencies include fire, severe injury or assault.

In a non-emergency, children would have time to get help or they could handle the situation on their own. Examples of non-emergencies are minor injuries, the lights go out or a lost house key. Children can handle many accidents themselves if they are well prepared. Teach them these three important rules and how to give basic first aid.

When children are home alone, they may sometimes feel fearful. You should encourage your children to talk about their fears and discuss how they can cope with fear. When children do not know what to expect or do not know how to react in certain situations, they may become afraid. Discuss what your child should do when afraid. Make a plan for dealing with fear by keeping busy by doing chores etc.

If your child will be spending time alone, talk about family rules, expectations and personal safety. Encourage your child to share their thoughts and concerns. Role-play "what if" situations to help them feel more at ease.
