## Rauner predicts all mail elections

Thayer County Clerk Marie Rauner thinks there will be a push for all elections to be held by mail.

"Voter turnout is higher via mail," Rauner said.

The recent special ballot in Deshler for Keno proved it.

Rauner said luck would have drawn more than 20 to 25 percent of voters, but mailing the ballots doubled that figure.

She has worked on elections since 1987. This year, Rauner celebrated her 30th anniversary with the county Nov. 1.

Rauner chuckles. Her oldest child was in kindergarten when she landed the job.

"She is now 35 and married with a family of her own," Rauner said.

Rauner was hired to work on elections and election lists.

She said they had to type the lists and update several times a year. Election nights were long.

Rauner said she remembers working on elections with 5 a.m., breaks to shower and eat before going back to work.

"I thought, 'This is ridiculous. There has to be a better way,'" she recalled.

Rauner said she had a progressive board of county commissioners. They were forward-thinking and decided Thayer County would become the first county of its population size to host a counting machine.

To offset the cost, Fillmore County had ballots counted in Thayer. Fillmore eventually acquired its own machine.

Rauner also recalled shrinking precincts over the years from 17 to seven because of a decline in population and federal compliance for people with disabilities.

Deshler, for example, had a north and south precinct and Hebron had three cut to two. Chester, Hubbell and Byron combined their precincts as did Carleton and Davenport, and Gilead and Alexandria.

Several of the halls were too old to be updated for compliance.

"There's always a new wrinkle," Rauner said about elections. "I've heard there are lots of petitions this year, but I haven't heard of anything turned in."

It wasn't just the precincts that shrank — car titles used to move through her office, then the assessor's and treasurer's office, which currently handles the titles from start to finish.

She also remembers using the month of December to balance the books for W-2's.

"Now, we just hit a key and they're done," she said.

Rauner moved up to deputy clerk and was sworn in as clerk in January of 2005 after Marilyn Free retired.

No two days are alike in the clerk's office, Rauner said.

"It is an ever-changing job from meeting days, payroll days, working on vendor claims and all the insurance goes through here. It is different all the time," she said.

Sometimes, she has to hunt for a typewriter for a certain government form.

And that means one with a good ribbon, she laughed.

She credits her deputy clerk, Cheryl Koch, for helping the clerk's office run efficiently.

"Cheryl has been with me since 2005," Rauner said. "I couldn't have done all we had accomplished without her help."

She said she turns to Koch if she needs something created and Koch handles the office when Rauner is gone, plus processes vendor

Carrying name brand apparel in clothing and shoes, all Thayer County high school athletic wear, and sports equipment, like cleats and gloves, the Gunns are continuing the store's tradition of service.

"We do all the uniforms for Legion ball, T-ball, youth soccer clubs and a lot for Fairbury, too," Perry said.

Perry wasn't familiar with screen printing and embroidery, but is working with screen printing as

much as possible and with embroidery expert, Holli Huhman, and Jerra Gumaer on graphics, Perry and Deanna are well versed on Sports Shack's services.

"She is able to keep up with the demand of what is coming in," Deanna said about Huhman. Other employees are Sequoia Heinrichs, Glenda Corn (Deanna's mother) and Alice Heinrichs, who has been

in the shop for 35 years and can remember when the building was a chicken hatchery and she sold baby chicks and feed.

Later, the store transitioned into guns, traps and clothing.

"It's been enlarged about four times," Heinrichs said.

On the day of the ribbon cutting, Huhman was printing for Thayer County Health Services. The embroidery machine can do four shirts at once.

The screen printing section is in the back of the shop and it's all manual.

Perry and Deanna want communities to know the Sports Shack is there to meet their needs.

They're quick on the turnaround — Thayer Central and Fairbury needed shirts in three days for this year's state cross country meet.

In another success, Perry recalled he was in the shop at 10 p.m. one night and a customer came in for cleats.

"He needed cleats and we got them for him," Perry said. "We are here for our community and glad to be here."

## 1887 130 Years Ago

Wild ducks and geese are scarce so far.

Cattle are being brought from counties in Kansas southwest of here to be wintered in Thayer County.

The farmers in the north part of Thayer and Fillmore counties are gathering as high as 50 to 60 bushels of corn per acre.

Fifteen cars of coal have been received on the B & M road during the last two weeks.

There are four new business houses being built at Bruning.

The address of Rev. W. T. Hacker to the young people, last Sunday evening, was full of good instruction and held the close attention of his audience. He described a model young man who would succeed in life, as a man physically strong, well educated in his trade or profession, religious and gritty.

We hope the manager of the opera house will promptly take the next boy who whistles or otherwise annoys an audience and put him out of the building. People who go to entertainments do not wish to be annoyed by the hoodlum element, which needs checking. Do it, Mr. Manager, and you will receive the grateful applause of a delighted audience.

Wm. Hill is manufacturing sausage by steam for the retail and wholesale trade.

Mr. Frank Leedom, the respected County Clerk of Thayer County, and a citizen highly esteemed by all, died at his home after a short week of sickness on Oct. 26.

Miss Ella Rudd, of this place, has passed her examination successfully, and is now a member of the college for deaf mutes in Washington, D.C.

Reed & Garmire have sold their lumber yard at Deshler to Hugh Caughey, A. Becksrom manager. Mr. Caughey owns the other yard at that place.

J. W. Hughes informs us that all smokers who want an interest in the new front to the Central House can assist in its erection by buying their cigars of him. For each 5c cigar bought of him (and he keeps first class brands), he will put a brick in the new building.

J. O. Talmadge has recently invented a heat radiator, which can be attached to any stove, and the Belvidere foundry will soon make a number for sale.

We hear but little talk about the county land proposition. The voters appear rather indifferent, but the indifference is as likely to be favorable as unfavorable.

We do not care to take up space on this question, but would say that two propositions ought to receive careful consideration, viz: that the county needs a good jail, and the sale of a part of the land would build the jail without direct taxation.

## 1917 100 Years Ago

Mrs. H. H. Hathaway received a sad message state that her brother, Harry Shaffer, had burned to death in his home near Norton, Kan., Sunday morning.

With stirring music to break the tension of farewells, a large crowd of well wishers assembled at the B & M depot yesterday morning at the departure of the third contingent of Thayer County soldiers for Camp Funston at Ft. Riley.

On Monday afternoon, O. J. Wortman met an excruciating accident at the Hayes' elevator, when the middle finger of his left hand was pulled off, and with it about six inches of the cord from the arm.

Last Sunday noon four autos loaded to the rails, pulled up to Dr. Easton's—he was 75 years old and time to celebrate!

## 1927 90 Years Ago

The main topic of discussion on the streets last evening was the county corn-picking contest staged yesterday in the field of Floyd Shaver of Hebron. Bill Parker of Bruning captured first among seven pickers with a total of 1,945 pounds. Second money was taken by a man named Voight with 1,800 pounds. Bill Hulse of Bruning husked the cleanest load and weighed in at 1,710 pounds and captured fourth honors. The corn was weighed in at 80 pounds to the bushel.

On Wednesday, Oct. 26, at the Louis Sander home before a large audience occurred the marriage of Miss Eliza Jobena Magdeline Alexander to Jonathan Ezra Josephus Nathaniel Hemplill. The marriage vows were read by Rev. Gus T. Witchcraft. The bride was gowned in customary white and carried a bouquet of yellow orange blossoms. The bride was attended by the Misses Velma Iceberg, Amanda Shadow, Rosaline Cape and Virginia Fashion as bridesmaids. Her train carriers were Misses Sally and Nora McKnee, while little Emma Canary acted as flower girl. The groom and his attendant, Mr. Clarence Bow-wow, wore the new Ever-ready Handkerchief suits. Mrs. Eloise Norwy played the wedding march, after which Emma Canary sang "America." Undue

confusion was caused by the minister's pinchy shoes. After the well wishes of their friends, the newlyweds, accompanied by some of their attendants, left on a distant journey.

The youths enrolled were Clarence Mammen and Keith Haak of Bruning, Cleo May, Louis Niemeyer and Edgar McGinness of Belvidere, George Mathiesen and Delmer Howell of Chester, Galen Martin of Alexandria and Kenneth Rowe of Hebron.

Karen Virus won the Hebron High School Homecoming Queen crown in a vote by the student body. Chris McKay won first attendance, Carol Pitts, second attendant and Barb Fangmeier, third attendant.

Mrs. Jim V. Johnson has resigned as chairman of the Thayer County Chapter of the American Red Cross Blood program and Mrs. Robert O'Neal has been named as her successor. Mrs. Johnson, clerk of the

Thayer County Local Board 88, Selective Service System Office, for the past nine years, has announced her resignation from that position also.

Work is near completion on the street improvement in front of the courthouse. By removing the terrace, the street was made about eight feet wider and a new sidewalk constructed.

Kathy Day of Hebron won the Fairbury Junior College Homecoming Queen crown in a vote by the student body. Kathy's first attendant was Joyce Sittler, also of Hebron.

## 1977 40 Years Ago

Hebron's Volunteer Firemen were called to the Don Templin farm where lightning destroyed more than 5,000 bales of hay.

The number one ranked Hebron Bears football squad traveled to Tekamah-Herman for a mid-week battle with the defending state class C-1 champions and came out on the short end of a 10-0 score. The loss was Hebron's first in two years, ending the Bears 20 game winning streak.

The Thayer County and Gilead Local Farmers Union met in Gilead to elect officers. Elected were: President Marvin Dux, Vice President William Willems and Mrs. James Schroeder, secretary/treasurer.

## 1987 30 Years Ago

Harvesting of corn, milo and soybeans in the county was exceptional, both in time and quality. It was brought about by a combination of dry weather early in the spring allowing much earlier planting than usual and for the most part dry and relatively warm weather during the fall. Except for one or two areas of the county, rains of only .25 to .50 fell during harvest time making harvest weather the best in the past 25 years.

Hubert and Gertrude Skucius of rural Chester started a mum plot three years previously and it continued to grow larger each year. The plot contained 140-150 different plant varieties purchased throughout the area. The mum plot has been admired by travelers with many stopping to take pictures of the colorful blooms.

The Rev. Charles Plant of the First Presbyterian Church in Hebron and a commission of ministers ordained Sue Finley Plant, wife of the Rev. Charles Plant. She was the first woman to be ordained in the Hebron Presbyterian Church.

Marshal R. Hinds, pastor

of the Presbyterian church in Alexandria, died at the age of 71.

## 1997 20 Years Ago

A brutal snow storm ripped through Thayer County causing many power outages throughout the area, downing crops in the fields and felling many shade trees. The wind howled up to 50 miles per hour making it difficult to determine exactly how much snow fell in the area. Guesstimates were from 12 to 16 inches.

Lady Bear Steph Klaumann placed fourth in the state cross country meet in Kearney.

Hebron eighth graders received prizes at Central Community College's EXPO of Technology in Hastings. Participating were Drew Pumphrey, Amanda Fangmeier, Jacob Baden, Lindsey Meyer, Dye and Stacey Kielion. They each were awarded a \$50 savings bond.

## 2007 10 Years Ago

The Thayer County Hospital Foundation held its annual fundraising talent show last week featuring special musical guests, the Homestead Harmonizers. During the intermission musical groups from Thayer County high schools also performed. The Foundation, each year, hands out a special award in recognition of volunteer work done for the Foundation by an individual. This year's award was presented to Dale Klaumann for his services during the hospital's annual golf tournament.

Thayer County Health Services will hold mass flu clinics during the influenza season which will not require appointment to get a flu shot.

Trinity Luther League had a successful service day on Sunday, Oct. 21. Sixteen youths, five adults and two others helped pick up three miles of trash along Highway 81. Then they cleaned up the aluminum cans that are collected behind the church and got them ready for recycling. After that they jumped on a flat bed trailer with bales of straw and traveled all over Bruning collecting canned goods for the Thayer County Food Pantry. The recycling totaled 633 pounds of cans and the canned goods taken to the Thayer County Food Pantry totaled over 350 pounds.

## Best safety tip: Wear your seatbelt

As we approach winter weather and the busiest time of the year, we are reminded of the tremendous role safety plays in our lives. Hopefully, we all practice safety each time we get behind the wheel of a vehicle, but sometimes despite our best efforts, we find ourselves in situations where our safety is compromised. Maybe it's another driver not paying attention or we are distracted and the weather has affected the road conditions.

Even an experienced driver can be involved in a crash. Seat belts, if used properly, reduce the risk of a fatal injury to front-seat passengers in a car by 45 percent and 60 percent for light truck occupants. Even though seat belts are saving more than 13,000 lives annually, statistics show only 79 percent of Nebraskans are wearing their seat belts.

In Nebraska wearing your seat belt is the law. The driver, each front-seat occupant in the vehicle and all children six years of age and less than 18 years of age must wear a seat belt. Besides wearing your seat belt being the law, there are still people who apparently believe the law doesn't apply to them or they are immune to the laws of physics.

If a vehicle is traveling at 60 miles per hour, its contents and passengers are also moving at 60 miles per hour. If that vehicle suddenly stops, wearing a seatbelt can mean the difference between life and death.

The passengers in a vehicle are its most valuable contents and seatbelts are designed to keep them in place. In a crash, unbelted passengers fly toward the point of impact and collide with anything in their path; dashboards, windshield or steering wheels.

While it's dangerous to smash into a dashboard or windshield, it can be more dangerous to be "thrown clear." Thrown clear of what? Telephone poles, trees, or oncoming traffic?

Thrown through what? The windshield or door? Airborne objects maintain momentum as they travel without control over where or how they will land. In a collision, passengers launched from a vehicle are 25 times more likely to die.

In a vehicle accident, the safest place to be is inside the vehicle, attached to the vehicle's seat. It's the seatbelt that keeps passengers in place. In a collision, the one part of the vehicle that stays reasonably intact, no matter how battered the rest of it may become, is the vehicle's seats. Newer vehicles are equipped with airbags that work in conjunction with seatbelts.

For high speeds, nighttime driving and bad weather, many passengers do buckle up, but the fact is that most fatalities occur in dry, sunny weather, at speeds under 40 miles per hour and within 25 miles of work or home.

Perhaps you are a safe driver in control of your vehicle, but there are a lot of other drivers not in control of their vehicles. Drivers who've drunk too much, are sleepy, or are distracted.

You can't control other drivers. Seatbelts are your best protection against those drivers. Buckle up and protect yourself so you don't become another statistic in an accident. Seatbelts save lives! This statistic is proven over and over every day.

With winter weather upon us, the staff at Thayer County Health Services wants everyone to remember to wear their seat belt and stay healthy, happy and above all a SAFE. Consider making a real commitment to always wear your seat belt. Better yet, make it a rule in your vehicle that everyone must be buckled up.



### Southeast Nebraska Region B awarded federal funds - Emergency food and shelter

Southeast Nebraska Region B has been chosen to receive an additional \$26,086 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the area for this fiscal year.

The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and consists of representatives from The Salvation Army; American Red Cross; Council of Jewish Federations; Catholic Charities, USA; National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.; and United Way Worldwide.

The Local Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

A Local Board representing similar entities will determine November 8th how the Southeast Nebraska Region B funds are to be distributed among the emergency

food and shelter programs operated by local service organizations in the area. The Local Board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds.

Under the terms of the National Board grant, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: 1) be private voluntary non-profits or units of government, 2) be eligible to receive federal funds, 3) have an accounting system, 4) practice nondiscrimination, 5) have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs, and 6) if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.


