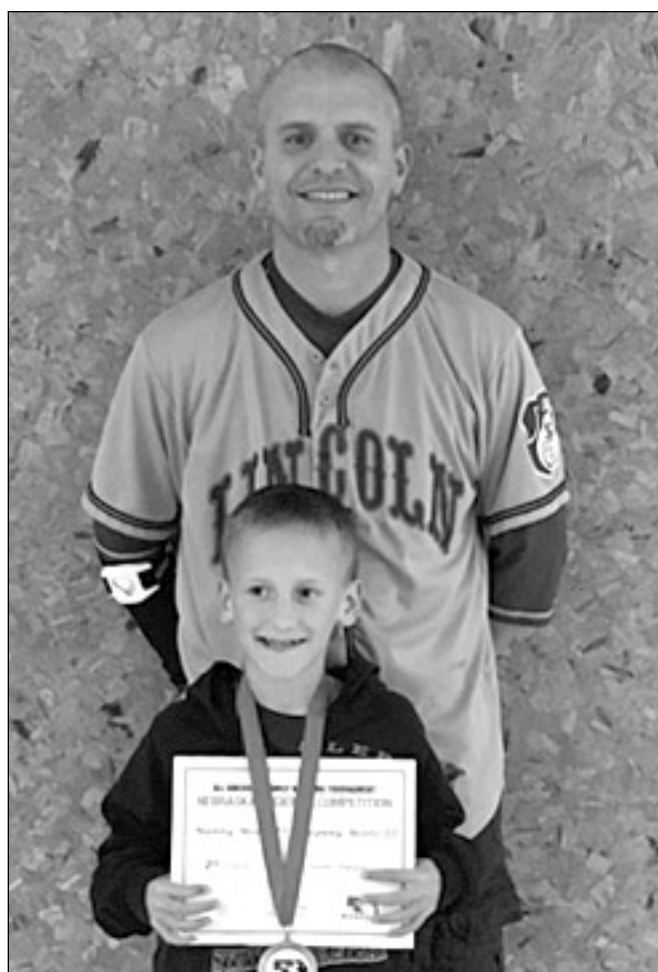

"HSF had the ball, fourth and one on the 13-yard line. They came inches short of making the first down," Coach Mark Rotter said about the last minute and a half of the game.

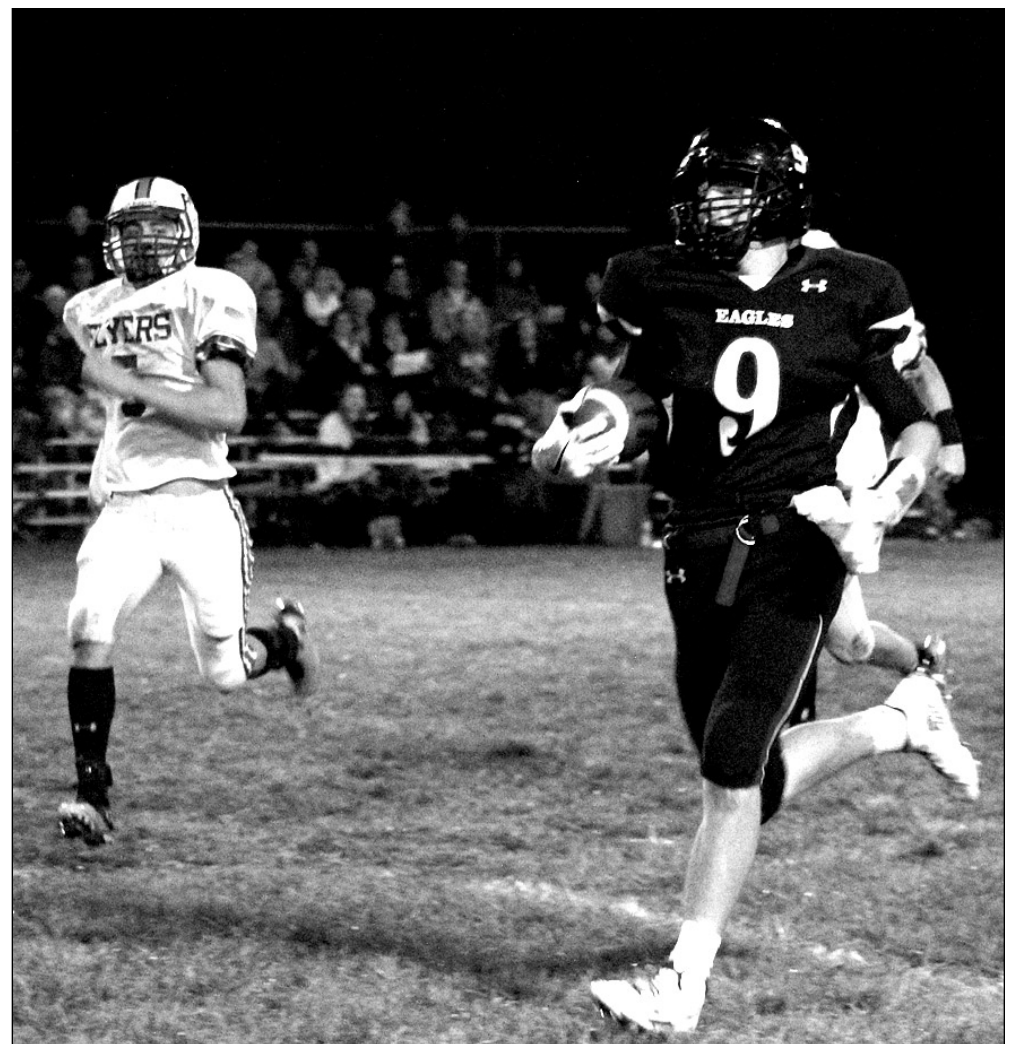
Kale Kleinschmidt rushed

Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor:

In the October 26th edition of your paper there was a letter to the editor from Charles Fangmeier. Like all political ads, the facts in his letter were partially correct, but only partially correct, so he could use his letter as a scare tactic to get somebody to vote, I assume, Republican. Mr. Fangmeier lists these "new taxes this year" and asks your readers to "remember this in November."

Medicare tax went from 1.45 percent to 2.35 percent: The additional 0.9 percent for Medicare only applies to an individual who has wages of more than \$200,000 or \$250,000 for those filing jointly.

Top income tax bracket went from 35 percent to 39.6 percent: According to my tax rate schedules this tax rate is the same as last year and only applies to those who have taxable income over \$515,050 if they file as an individual or \$566,950 in they file jointly.

Top income payroll tax went from 37.4 percent to 52.2 percent: I am sorry but I am not familiar with this tax but I am sure it only applies to the upper one percent of taxpayers.

Capital Gains tax went from 15 percent to 28 percent: I did not find a single 28 percent tax bracket for Capital Gains in my "U.S. Master Tax Guide." The highest rate was 20 percent for those who make over \$415,050. There is also a 25 percent tax on all so called 1250 Capital Gains.

Dividend tax went from 15 percent to 39.6 percent: Dividends are generally taxed as ordinary dividends and the

tax rates in the various income brackets did not change from 2015 to 2016. Some dividends from a domestic corporation and a few foreign corporations are taxed at Capital Gains rates mentions in the above paragraph.

Estate tax went from zero percent to 55 percent: I am not familiar with estate taxes. I do know there is a hefty exclusion from the tax and probably would not come to play with most estates of most of the readers of this newspaper.

A 3/5 percent real estate transaction tax was added: My source says this is a 3.8 percent tax, but, it only applies to individuals who earn more than \$200,000 a year and \$250,000 for those who file jointly. Plus, the tax only applies on profits from the sale that are over \$250,000 for individuals and \$500,000 for those filing jointly.

Now, Mr. Fangmeier, how many readers of this newspaper: 1) Earn more than \$200,000 as an individual or \$250,000 filing jointly. 2) Have taxable income over \$415,050 filing as an individual or \$466,950 if they file jointly. 3) Have estates that qualify for the estate tax and finally, 4) Have a profit that all of the exclusions mentioned above. I would guess that the percentage of readers that earn more than the above are less than the so-called one percent. It also appears, you must be in that upper one percent because of the concerns stated in your letter.

Kathryn Retzlaff entered the US Army Quarter Master Service July 5, 1968. She was discharged Feb. 5, 1972. Kathryn then entered the Army Reserves. She was ordered back to active duty in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from Aug. 20, 2004, to Oct. 11, 2005. Bateman said the legislation will help protect the airspace, especially at night and stormy nights as well.

"People tend to worry about more restrictions, but all we're doing is protecting pilots," he said, referencing the airport's ability to support air ambulance and people who use the airport for business, such as

crop dusters.

Chief BJ Linton of the Hebron Volunteer Fire Department informed the council the fire department needs to upgrade its airpicks at a cost of \$87,516.

The department will place \$15,000 down and finance \$72,516 at a two-percent interest rate for 10 years.

Councilman Larry Fangmeier agreed with the upgrade, saying the old airpicks are incompatible with the new packs.

"For me, it was a really important part," Fangmeier, who is on the finance committee, said.

Mont., produced the bridles, as well as Colorado and Kansas City.

Horse figurines, some made of brass with detachable saddles, sit in cases along the north wall.

"These are screwed on pieces," Mike said. "The saddles come off."

Weaving through, more saddles are on display, this time, military saddles that held the forest service, cavalry, artillery and other military men.

"In 1942, the government quit horses. They quit mules in 1956. After World War II, this country shipped 10,000 mules at a time to Europe," Mike said, proving once again he is a walking historical society.

Mary points to the Hudson Bay blankets hanging from the balcony.

On one of the blankets are four swipes with a black marker of some kind. Another has three.

"The black stripes represent how many beaver pelts

it took to buy that blanket," she said.

And Mike moves to another set of saddles.

"This is a Mother Hubbard style," he said.

He also pointed to a saddle Theodore Roosevelt would have ridden.

"Teddy Roosevelt went broke ranching. This is the exact type of saddle he used," Mike said.

There's so much to see at the museum, visitors might want to plan on staying for more than an hour.

The back room showcases some of Deshler's history, like the corner display of the town's Broom Factory with handouts on the history.

Esther Werner's work is in another corner. She painted designer plates and fine-tuned other pieces, like the pitchers sitting on a high shelf with their gold stripes.

Two designer plates by Werner show the Thayer County Museum.

Also in the room are primi-

tive utensils and a potato-picking belt with hooks.

"Scottsbluff was big potato country. There were potato growers in the area," Mike said.

The cowboy theme is noticed in the back room, too, with its set of cowboy china.

"It's not super old," Mike said about the set with large meat platters. "Maybe from the 50's."

A visitor won't leave the museum without learning some cowboy history. One of Mike's final stops on the tour was the case holding contemporary and vintage spurs, the Gal-legs.

He did make a slight detour to show a mule saddle.

The museum is open by appointment. Mike and Mary said classes have visited and they are open for Deshler Daze, which is during Father's Day weekend.

"You have to be interested in history to appreciate it," Mike said.

And saddles.

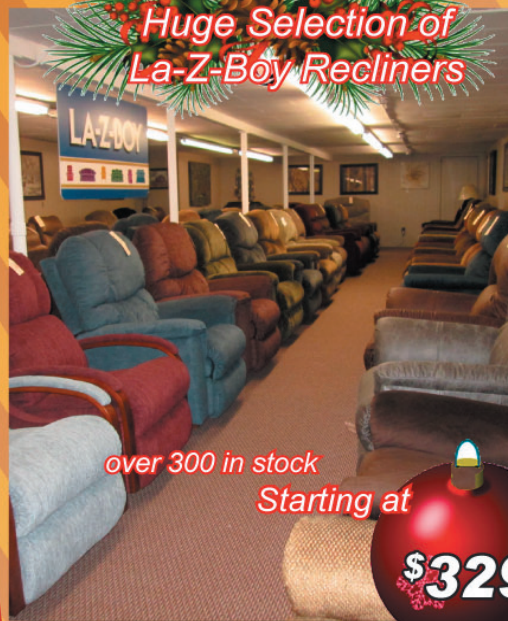
