

Lady Eagles finish fourth at D1 state volleyball

The Bruning-Davenport/Shickley Eagles did their best to avenge a 3-1 losing streak against Exeter-Milligan, but just couldn't withstand the Timberwolf pressure in the D1 semifinal round of the 2011 NSAA State Volleyball tournament.

"Our inability to get into our offense off their attacks kept us from keeping the momentum we gained in games two and three," said BDS coach Dan Sorge. "It was a hard fought

match." Exeter-Milligan closed the door on a season-long rivalry, winning the game in four sets: 25-14, 26-24, 16-25, 25-17.

The Timberwolves went on to finish as runners-up after falling to the state winning Humphrey Bulldogs. BDS ended fourth after falling to Guardian Angels Central Catholic in a grueling five-set consolation contest. GACC won the bout 25-14, 25-21, 18-25, 15-25, 17-15.

"We came up a little short in the consolation game," said Coach Sorge. "We battled back for a 2-0 deficit to lead 12-8 in game five only to finish short. I am extremely proud of the girls and how they never gave up all season."

Exeter-Milligan
Against the Timberwolves, Shelby Garland led the with 18 kills while Makaleigh Yantzie had 13. Garland also provided one ace serve and one block. Matyson Kleinschmidt pounded out seven kills for the team while Taylor Houck had six kills and three blocks in the game.

Whitney Walters put up 23 assists while Ashley Hinrichs provided 14.

Against Guardian Angels Central Catholic, Yantzie pounded out 15 kills while Garland had 13. Yantzie also used three service aces in the attack while Garland had one. Both Garland and Christie Swartzendruber had two blocks each in the game.

Taylor Houck had an all-around good game with ten kills, four ace serves and one block.

Walter's provided 23 assists in the contest.

tournament. BDS went 23-25, 27-25, 25-20, 25-22 to take the victory.

Attempting to contain Sailor-middle Samantha Kennedy took a little while, but the Eagles managed to get their serve-game in check and go on the attack in the final three sets.

"Our aggressive serving kept the Sailors from getting the ball to their big middle hitter on a consistent basis," said Eagles coach Dan Sorge. "After a few game one jitters, we settled down and played up

to our ability." Eagle senior Shelby Garland matched Kennedy hit for hit until pulling ahead in the fourth set with a stellar 26 kills on the night. Kennedy had 22. But defense behind Taylor Houck aided in control of the final set; Houck had three of four total game blocks including a block and kill to close out the match.

Houck also had seven kills and one ace serve in the game. Whitney Walters provided three ace serves and 14 assists on the night while Christy

Swartzendruber, who led in the back with 25 digs, had two ace serves. Cynthia Mick had two kills and two blocks while Makaleigh Yantzie pounded out 15 kills and had one block and 19 digs. Ashley Hinrichs rounded out the team stats with an outstanding 37 assists.

The Eagles will lose power-hitter Garland to graduation this year along with assist-leader Whitney Walters, Anna Lichti, Ashley Hinrichs and Cynthia Mick.

BDS Eagles end season in second round loss of playoffs

The BDS Eagles fell to Creighton, 44-48, Tuesday night in what turned out to be an overturned touchdown in the final two minutes of the game.

The controversial pass from Ryan Tegtmeier to Michael Houchin from the eight-yard line on a fourth-and-goal situation was ruled a fair catch at first, but overturned by another official who called it incomplete.

"After watching the game on tape," said BDS coach Chris Ardissono, "I would have ruled it a touchdown. It's a play that will be remembered for a long time."

The touchdown would have given BDS the lead, but even after putting the stop on Creighton's next drive, the Eagles sealed the loss when Tegtmeier threw into double coverage and Creighton's Ryan Mitteis picked off the pass and ended the game.

"We had prepared well for them," BDS coach Mark Rotter commented. "One frustration was at the beginning of the game, Creighton's level of violence seemed to surprise us. It shouldn't have, so we got behind right away. We then really played with a lot of courage and battled back all night. It just didn't end up going our way."

The Eagles end their second season together on a 9-2 record. Creighton moved into the D-1 semifinals.

BDS used all of the fourth period to mount an attack against the Bulldogs who held the edge the entire game. At the top of the quarter, Creighton scored to reach a 48-36 point lead, but in the Eagle's next possession, Tegtmeier hit Wyatt Schoenholz for a 25-yard

touchdown pass. A successful two-point conversion pulled the Eagles to within four points of catching the Bulldogs.

BDS followed that by recovering an onside kick, but Creighton's defense managed to hold them forcing them to punt. BDS returned the favor and in their next possession, Tegtmeier scored on a 65-yard run, but it was called back due to a penalty for an illegal block. The Eagles managed to drive to within eight yards of the goal setting up the overturned pass.

Junior Luke Christensen led BDS in scoring after running a couple of kickoff returns in the game; the first for 70 yards in the first period and the second for 65 yards in the third quarter. Wyatt Schoenholz also collected points for the Eagles on a 14-yard pass in the second quarter as did Ryan Tegtmeier on a 43-yard run in the next possession. Rounding out the BDS scoring was Kendrick Holeman on a 50-yard run in the third period.

Tegtmeier led in rushing; 149 yards on 20 carries, while

Holeman had 62 yards on five rushes and Christensen had 17 yards on four carries. The team had 223 yards on 31 rushes while Creighton had 347 yards on 60 rushes.

In passing, Tegtmeier was good for 125 yards on 12-of-23 tosses. In receiving, Schoenholz caught six passes for 86 yards while Holeman caught three passes for 26 yards. BDS had a total offense of 348 yards while Creighton had 454 yards. Creighton also had twice the first downs as BDS with 25 while the Eagles only had 12.

The Eagles, coached by Mark Rotter, Chris Ardissono and Scott Shipley, look to lose only four seniors to graduation including Omar Gines, Kendrick Holeman, Michael Houchin and Trevor Krehnke.

All-District teams D1-4 all-district teams were announced last week.

From BDS Michael Houchin, Luke Christensen and Ryan Tegtmeier were named to the first team offense. Also making the team was Luke Dlouhy of Deshler.

BDS's Kendrick Holeman was named to the second team offense, while honorable mention went to Deshler's Charlie Buckles.

BDS's Dylan Lauenstein, Wyatt Schoenholz and Trevor Krehnke and Deshler's Savino Lebron and Josiah Burger were named to the first team for defense, while honorable mention went to BDS's Nolan Schroeder.

BDS's Omar Gines was named to first team special teams as a kicker while Alberto Gamboa was named to the second team special teams as a punter.







Then they explained that they are members of the TCHCC coalition, which is a drug prevention organization that primarily focuses on reducing underage drinking, teen tobacco use, and prescription drug abuse.

The high school students also told the students that in order to be a member you need to be committed to being drug and alcohol free and are expected to be a good role model for younger students in the school.

Next, the coalition members led interactive classroom

discussions about what a hero is and how a true hero does not do drugs and alcohol and always treats others with respect. They also discussed how heroes show courage and are not afraid to say no.

The students talked about the harmful effects of drugs and alcohol and how making bad decisions always have consequences.

The coalition students asked the classroom if they could be their hero and share why they do not do drugs and alcohol and what consequences would affect them the most if they got caught drinking.

The members presented the class with a poster of them as a reminder to always be a hero and make good decisions. Then they asked the elementary students to be heroes with them by doing nice things for others and always include everyone.



Keep Water Clean, Fresh and Available for Livestock This Winter

It's necessary for livestock to have clean, fresh water all day every day. They will get the water nutrients they need from drinking water as well as from feed sources. Feed sources contain water, but removing the water makes the sources dry matter.

As the most important essential nutrient, water consumption is important all year because livestock can die or be greatly affected quickly without proper water consumption.

Consumption can vary as the seasons, temperature and exercise or movement level of the livestock changes. It is important that water be available for livestock, especially during the winter, even if there are freezing temperatures or snow. The water should be open and free of ice.

There are a variety of water sources that can be used, such as heated water tanks as an automatic waterer, buckets of water, a tank with a heater or buckets with heaters. No matter which source is utilized, the heat source must be functioning properly and the pipes leading to an automatic waterer need to be protected

from cold weather concerns like freezing.

For tanks and buckets that must be filled every day, unhook the hose from the hydrant and drain it after each use. Not doing so will result in a frozen hose the next time it is used.

If using a non-heated source, keep something close by to chop or break the ice to keep water open and accessible. If using a floating or submersible tank heater, make sure the type of heater matches the type of tank. There are different varieties of tank heaters for metal tanks, hard plastic tanks, some with guards and some without.

Even though most livestock consume some snow during the winter, the snow won't replace their need for fresh water and they won't eat enough to get the necessary water nutrients.
