ing them. Both victims had mental health diagnoses and were taking psychotropic medications, another area that goes unchecked at HHS, according to the OIG.

One of the victims said the abuse had been going on for two years, and an adult in the home was also abusing them. Multiple reports were not investigated.

The step-brothers were sentenced to prison, but the adult had not been charged at the time of the report.

Perpetrators aren't always given prison time. A 15-year-old state ward, who had been hospitalized for a mental health condition, said an older couple had given him drugs and he had sex with the woman.

His case was declared unfounded.

He was sexually abused by another woman and the woman was given 12 months probation.

In another case of an 11-year-old victim, no criminal charges were filed against the victim's grandfather, who was having sex with the victim and the other children in the home.

Elias said communication about unhealthy relationships, boundaries, limits on technology and confidentiality are solutions to helping children from becoming trafficking victims.

The keys are identifying red flags and knowing whom to call, such as WAC or its sister in education and assistance, the Hope Crisis Center.

"Communities are becoming more aware," Elias said about trafficking.

A "demand" for children and young adults exists and is served through sports and community events, factories, oil fields, shipping ports and agricultural jobs. Even last year's solar eclipse drew trafficking.

"Law enforcement had to more preparation for that event," Elias said.

Elias said more black women are trafficked than white, but the qualifications are the same — vulnerable young people with mental health problems, drug abuse, immigration status, prior

trauma, homeless or alternative lifestyle backgrounds, are more susceptible.

Heat maps point out obvious trafficking hot spots like Omaha, Lincoln, Grand Island and North Platte. Victims are recruited by use of force, fraud and coercion, and harbored and transported.

They are also heavily groomed — the coercion could come from a person acting like a boyfriend.

"We do see men and boys trafficked, but we don't have good nationwide numbers," Elias said.

She said residents can look for signs. People carrying multiple cell phones or hotel keys are potential traffickers.

Victims may be noticeably disoriented, physically abused or have tattoos that seem possessive. Brands are often used by major traffickers, who may be charismatic, but in reality, are manipulative because their victims are a means to the end.

"People are easier to get than drugs or weapons," Elias said. "Over 900 people are for sale every month."

She added, one in seven missing children are likely victims, and 86 percent were in the care of child welfare when they went missing. Parents are also trafficking children.

Hope Crisis Center offers a 24-hour crisis line at 1-877-388-HOPE, along with temporary shelter, client, legal, medical, bi-lingual assistance, and referrals dealing with sexual assault and domestic violence.

The Women's Center for Advocacy has information on trafficking at wcaomaha.org.

Trafficking is estimated per year to be in the \$30 billion dollar profit range.

"People who are having sex with children are not johns or tricks. They are child rapists and pedophiles, so we should call them what they are." — Jada Pinkett Smith.

Nor are the children prostitutes. Chances are, they never gave their permission to be sold for sex.

wheat crop is looking well because of the moisture.

"Some planted a little late, but it seems to be coming up good," she said.

As the moisture permeated fields, farm equipment and other vehicles sunk into the soil somewhat, leaving tire tracks.

Michael Sindelar, Extension educator for cropping

and water systems out of Sutton, said he had calls on how to fix the impressions. His background is in soil management.

There isn't a general fix Sindelar recommends because every situation is different, but some areas have deep tracks that can't be repaired without tillage.

Instead Sindelar discusses

ways to reduce the impact of tilling for no-till farmers.

"We can correct those areas when it's the least wet — it's really hard to fix once the ground freezes," he said.

Sindelar said recently, there was an inch of frost in the soil, starting from the top.

He said it may not be something that must be repaired immediately because freezing and thawing over the winter months loosens compact soil and the void space aggregates.

"If mother nature helps us out in that category, there may not be a lot of mediation needed. Decisions can be made at later dates," Sindelar said.

There is also some question to using radishes as cover crops. Radishes act as a biological drill in the soil.

"The challenge is it's late for good growth and price has gone down compared to previous years," Sindelar said.

Radishes also attract corn seed maggots, so if farmers plant in the fall, they should treat corn with insecticides in the spring.
