## Holidays hard on working poor families

It may be difficult to imagine homeless families in rural communities, but Julie Hibbs of Blue Valley Community Action said she met with one just last week.

"People do live in their car here," Hibbs, BVCA's executive director, said.

And, when school let out for the summer, many parents found themselves struggling just to afford lunches.

"The utilities were really high. Kids were home and eating more," Hibbs said. "We had a lot of people in over the summer."

It's important to note, Hibbs said, that at least one parent in these families is working.

"They are the working poor," Hibbs said.

It isn't just a term. There are almost two million people in Nebraska who are in poverty with nearly 500,000 children, according to the Food Research and Action Center.

In Thayer County, BVCA serves roughly 30 to 40 families — that's 80 individuals, including children to benefit from the organization's food pantry.

"These families receive the full pantry," Hibbs said. "Every month, six to 10 families get emergency food. We had a couple of families whose homes burned. They needed emergency assistance and food."

For Christmas, BVCA is currently working to help 25 to 30 families. Churches have pitched in, too, but Hibbs said applications were still coming in after the deadline.

She said last year, some of the applications didn't come in until the last minute and BVCA ended up with zero sponsors for four families.

This year, a tree went up in Blue Valley's thrift store to cover for families who aren't registered in time. Hibbs said people are welcome

to donate.

"The real trees are at the banks. They do that every year for us," Hibbs said.

The Thayer County and Bruning State banks will each have giving trees with nicknames of families on them. One want and one need are listed by each family on the tree.

Blue Valley also touts over 30 programs to help families and individuals, depending on what they qualify for. Programs include, housing, housing rehabilitation and utilities.

And Hibbs issued a reminder — that the rest of the year, the need for food and personal items is just as high.

"Over the holidays, we have a lot of stuff coming in and that will last into the spring," she said. "From May to October or November, it gets a little tougher. The need is there all the time."

She said another resource is the Food Bank of Lincoln's mobile unit, which visits Hebron the second Tuesday of every month.

As of Oct. 1, BVCA became a partner of the Food Bank to help families apply for state assistance and Hibbs works through the Food Bank to purchase cheaper items for the local pantry.

"We try to be good stewards of the donations we receive. So, a couple of months ago, a case of 24 ham steaks was \$4.38 and one pound of hamburger was \$2.28 (from the Food Bank). I bought several cases after that. We have to spend our money as wisely as we can," she said.

Personal items always come up short.

"Those are huge needs," Hibbs said. "It costs me \$55 for 96 rolls of toilet paper."

For families who receive state assistance, such simple needs, like toothbrushes, laundry soap and toilet paper are expensive.

Hibbs also plugged Blue Valley's

shop on 4th Street in downtown Hebron.

"We really want the public to come and see what we have. The prices are reasonable," she said. The store is open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.,

Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. On Wednesdays, Blue Valley is open from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Hibbs said they are closed Fridays because more volunteer staff is needed.

## New management in place at Blue Valley

As the new executive director at Blue Valley Lutheran Homes, Kerrey Miller sees the changes as positive.

"We are really trying to promote a positive family environment," she said a couple of weeks after taking the lead position.

Miller, who was the director of nursing at Blue Valley for 16 months before stepping into executive director, said stability is the most important focus for residents.

"We need to make sure we have someone who is loyal to the community and the people we are serving," she said of the three Blue Valley facilities in Hebron. "It is a calling, not just a job. We have an obligation to these individuals on a much higher level."

Miller wants the facilities to keep moving forward in a direction that will best serve Blue Valley's aging population.

The facility is on its way with its private rooms and open meals plan.

The resident is the boss, Miller said.

"If they want to sleep in, fine. It

is about meeting the people where they're at," she said. "This is resident-centered care.

Miller noted people coming to Blue Valley are more advanced in the aging process because they're able to stay home longer.

"People are living to be much older, even than 20 years ago. They're coming to long term care because they really need the care," she said.

She said the new therapy department zeroes in on specific issues with individual patients to better serve residents.

Blue Valley didn't just hire a new executive director — changes in the management team included Lacey Wagner and Clara Hartley as the new directors of nursing at the care home and nursing home, respectively. In addition, Hannah Dunlap, who previously worked in Geneva with assisted living residents, was named administrator at the care home. Jamie Houser is the nurse coordinator at Courtyard Terrace.

"It's been fun. We're starting to do some strategic planning," Miller said. "I think it will be a lot of work

and a lot of fun."

Wagner moved up from her position as a nurse on the Blue Valley floor. Hartley was with AseraCare Hospice. She worked with Blue Valley residents through AseraCare.

While Miller is excited about Blue Valley's future, she grounds herself

in the present.

"I want the community to feel like they can come out and enjoy the activities. I just want to get that point across — how important it is for the community to come in here and make someone's day," she said. "It can be so very meaningful to them."

## Hannah B's reopens under new ownership

You have to dream big, Trey Pinkerman said, but not too fast.

"Since what we do is sandwiches, I don't want to move away from

that," Pinkerman said of the Hannah B's menu.

Pinkerman re-opened the restaurant Nov. 14 and scheduled Monday

through Friday from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., for serving lunches.

Later, he will implement specials and see what his customers like.

"I would like to play with different types of buns and try new things," he said.

Pinkerman is patient — he said introducing new menu items isn't his focus.

"If you go big at the beginning, you're going to fail," he said. "Since what we do is sandwiches, I don't want to move away from that."

The problem with a lot of businesses, is their menus are too large.

"It's hard to see where your sales are. They keep track of all those menu items and when the food expires, they do their specials," he said. "We don't want to do that."

Pinkerman came to Hebron because he saw an opportunity in Hannah B's.

He previously worked in Lincoln, where it is more complicated to open

a restaurant. The City of Lincoln requires steps to be a general manager, including a \$300 fee.

Pinkerman, who has been in the restaurant business since he was 16 years old, talked to people in Hebron prior to his opening.

"Hannah B's, this is what they know," he said.

As the volume of customer flow picks up, Pinkerman said he might start adding desserts, such as pies, but he is careful too, because pies quickly expire.

"It's hard to make a homemade pie and leave it in the case. Pies expire in two days, according to the health department," he said. "Restaurants will refreeze pies when they start to expire. Pies lose their flavor if refrozen. Just like soups."

Hannah B's received a stellar grade from its health inspection, he added.

"We went above and beyond," he said.

# Thousands raised for families

District 7 ABATE (American Bikers Aiming Towards Education) of Nebraska, Inc., through hard work and generous donations, presented Blue Valley Community Action with a check for \$6,397.20 and four large boxes of Christmas gifts.

The money will go toward buying more gifts and providing food items for Christmas meals families in the six District 7 counties, Fillmore, Jefferson, Thayer, Seward, Saline and York, wouldn't be able to afford on their own.

Julie Hibbs, a family development partner with BVCA who works in Fillmore and Thayer counties, said 57 families (which included 156 children) applied for Christmas assistance.

There were also nine families in Fillmore County that either didn't know about the registration period, or just missed the application deadline.

There were 37 children associated with these late additions, and the ABATE toys were earmarked for these

kids.

"Without the toys from ABATE, these children wouldn't have had any presents to open on Christmas," Hibbs said. "We made these families our top priority. Believe me, there were lots of tears and these parents were very grateful. Christmas can be very tough. There are lots of parents with their heads dragging. This definitely helped them pick their heads up."

Over 30 riders took part in the annual Toy Run, Poker Run that began at Criners Corner in Endicott Oct. 15 and traveled to Mama D's in Western, Toad's in Belvidere, Gary's Brickhouse in Grafton and ended at the American Legion Club in Fairmont.

There, ABATE members prepared a free-will donation Chili Feed. A live auction (with Linda Underwood donating her services), raffle and musical entertainment was also held.

Local businesses donated items for the raffle and auction as well as cash donations to the Toy Run.

The Fairmont Legion chipped in a percentage of its

bar revenue. All money raised went towards the donation to BVCA.

"On behalf of BVCA, I would like to thank ABATE District 7 for your hard work and dedication, and for choosing BVCA and trusting us to be good stewards of the precious gifts and donation check your members have so generously given us for our families once again this year," Hibbs said. "I truly appreciate all you've done."

At the Nov. 6 meeting at the Geneva VFW Club, Ken Cool noted there are 168 active District 7 ABATE members. The group of approximately 20 also discussed potential upcoming legislation for motorcycles and their drivers. Repealing the helmet law in the Cornhusker State seems to be a top priority.

Cool thanked those in attendance for their work on the 2016 Toy Run and Chili Feed.

"Your work on this was outstanding," Cool said.

## USDA announces applications available for Conservation Stewardship Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is currently accepting applications for enrollment in the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP), the nation's largest conservation program. Applications are available at local USDA service centers.

"This year, the Conservation Stewardship Program provides even more opportunities for conservation and greater flexibility to prioritize resource concerns and conservation approaches," says Craig Derickson, NRCS State Conservationist.

NRCS offices are now

taking applications for the program, with sign-up running through February 3, 2017. People interested in the additional opportunities the updated CSP will offer can find information on the new CSP portal, located at <http://www.nrcs.usda.gov/csp>. This one-stop shop, which provides information to help producers determine whether CSP is right for them, will be continually updated as more information becomes available. Changes that producers can expect to see include nearly double the enhancements and conservation practices offered and better reporting tools to tell producers the results of their conservation efforts on their land.

Through CSP, agricultural producers and forest landowners earn payments for actively managing, maintaining, and expanding conservation activities like cover crops, buffer strips, and pollinator habitat — all while continuing active agriculture production on their land. CSP also encourages the adoption of cutting-edge technologies and new management techniques such as precision agriculture applications and new soil amendments to improve water quality.

CSP is for producers who are already established conservation stewards, helping them to deliver multiple conservation benefits on working lands, including improved water and soil quality and enhanced wildlife habitat. Information about CSP, including national and state ranking questions and enhancement descriptions, is available at [www.nrcs.usda.gov/csp](http://www.nrcs.usda.gov/csp). Producers interested in the program should visit their local USDA Service Center to submit an application.

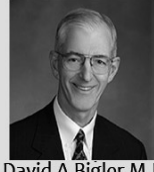
