

### Titans compete at state meet

Although medals were not a part of the final race for the Thayer Central Titans last week, the seven individuals who participated in the 2012 Class D State Cross Country Meet, experienced a beautiful day in Kearney to take a run at the prizes.

"Our goal was to place among the top ten teams," said TC coach Andy Long. "It was very exciting to finish seventh and be only 11 points out of a top five finish as a team."

It's been 10 years since Thayer Central has seen a girls' cross country team compete.

"The girls gained a lot of experience this season that will help prepare them for next year," Coach Long said.

This year the squad finished seventh with 131 points. Junior Madison Reece led the way in 16:57.7 for 34th;

Reece's time is the fastest of any girl competing for Thayer Central at the state meet.

Junior Bailey Linton, who competed at the state venue as a sophomore finished in 17:05.2.

Sophomore Rachel Heitmann finished in 17:36.7 while freshmen Shawna Timmerman finished in 18:58.8 and Sydney Cottam finished in 20:13.3.

"The girls have a lot to be proud of this season," the coach said and added, "They competed against 89 teams and beat 76 of them for an 82 winning percentage."

For the boys, senior Russ Heitmann completed the circuit in 18:12.0 while sophomore Adam Hellbusch finished in 18:21.6.

"This was a new experience for both runners in a state championship atmosphere," said Coach Long. "Both improved their times from the UNK Invite held on the same course a few weeks earlier."

Coach Long looks to lose two seniors to graduation this year including Russ Heitmann and Landon Schmitt. "It was great to see all the

support for the kids," Coach Long said. "It was a tremendous show of support by our fans to drive to Kearney Friday to watch."

### Eagles

The BDS Lady Eagles fell to Giltner 1-3, last week to end the Crossroads Conference in second place. After winning the first set, BDS fell into passing trouble against the Hornets allowing Giltner to sweep the rest of the contest 21-25, 25-18, 25-20, 25-22.

"It was a hard fought match against a tough talented team," said BDS coach Dan Sorge. "After taking game one by playing solid defense and playing aggressive, we lost our momentum as our passing broke down. We battled to the end, but too many unforced errors hurt our chances of winning the match." The team has taken the CRC runner-up title three years in a row.

Makaleigh Yantzie led the offense with 23 kills and added 22 digs and four ace blocks on defense. Christy Swartzen-druber added 2 ace serves, 11 kills and 24 digs while Taylor Houck had five ace blocks and Matyson Kleinschmidt provided 28 assists.

In the first round of the conference, BDS defeated Meridian, 26-24, 25-16, 25-11 and in the semifinals defeated Hampton 25-4, 25-12, 25-18.

The Eagles finished out the regular season Tuesday, Oct. 23, at Palmer and will head into D1-2 subdistrict play October 29-30 at Thayer Central. Other teams in the contest include Exeter-Miligan, Friend, Heartland and McCool Junction.

Details of the Palmer match will appear right here on the Sports page next week.


The Eagles are currently 21-4 prior to the Palmer contest.

The Dragons head into D2-2 subdistrict action October 29-30 at Sandy Creek. Other teams competing in the contest include Dorchester, Giltner, Lawrence-Nelson and Meridian.

### Titans

Thayer Central headed into Southern Nebraska Conference action Monday night defeating Superior 25-21, 25-22, 25-22. The tournament runs through Thursday - details from the final games will appear next week right here on the Sports page.

In Monday's contest against Superior, Bridgette Baden led the way with 16 kills, 17, digs, and two ace serves.

"This was a tough first-round battle as Superior serve-received much better and kept the ball in play on serving," said TC Coach Kurk Wiedel.

The coach noted that Trelby Virus had a great game at the net with five ace blocks while Tarryn Tietjen ran a good offense fending off the hot hitter. And he said Kelsey Long continues to play solid with near perfect passing and 10 kills.

Leading up to the SNC, the Lady Titans rounded out their regular season defeating Wilber-Clatonia on Oct. 16, 25-10, 25-12, 25-17, and finishing as the runners-up in the Lincoln Christian tournament Oct. 20.

There they defeated Arlington 25-16, 25-20, and Yutan 22-25, 25-14, 25-20 before falling to the hosting Crusaders 18-25, 12-25 in the championship round. "Serving and serve-receives broke down against the Crusaders," Coach Wiedel said, "as the C-1 No. 2-rated team had too many weapons at the net and on the serving line. Otherwise, we played very well throughout the tournament behind the hitting of Bridgette Baden."

Baden averaged 13 kills per game and provided two ace blocks per game.

### Titans JV/Frosh

The Thayer Central Freshman and Junior Varsity teams ended their season with two regular season wins against Superior and Wilber. Against Superior, the Freshman team won 25-12, 25-10. Cheyanna Tietjen scored 15 points and McKenna Tietjen scored 7 points. Jean Itzen had a great hitting game while Stacia Burkey and Brinley Linton continued to pass the ball efficiently for their team.

The Junior Varsity team beat Superior 25-10, 25-21. "Beating their opponent in the first set by a large margin but then having a close game in the second set seems to be the pattern of this team," said coach Carlee Kenner. "Staying focused after winning seems to be the one aspect that this team will need to work on to best continue the legacy of Titan volleyball in the future." Tashia Mumm continued to control the game with her serving as she was top scorer against the Wildcats with eight points. McCall Madsen also scored eight points in the two game match.

The Freshmen team ended its season with a win against Wilber 25-11, 25-15. The girls finished their season with a 7-5 record.

The Junior Varsity came out in the first set against Wilber and had one of their best sets of the year winning 25-11 and 25-18 against the Wolverines. High scorers for the team were McKenna and Tiffany Walsh. The Junior Varsity record ends at 8-3 for the 2012 season.

### Titans

Thayer Central fell to Hastings St. Cecilia 28-14 Thursday night in a prelude of what's to come later this week. The Titans again face the Blue-hawks as football playoffs get underway Thursday, Oct. 25. This time the contest will take place in Hastings.

Thayer Central Coach Josh Lanik said he thought the close score showed that the Titans held their own Thursday night, but the absence of some of the players accounted for uncustomary rotations. "We pushed them (St. Cecilia) to the limit," he said, "but with their style of offense they began to wear down our defense late in the game. And since we were without some members of our team, we were not able to use our usual player rotations to keep kids fresher during the game. We have some kids play nearly every snap of the game which can be very taxing."

Thayer Central had 154 rushing yards on 43 carries while St. Cecilia was 345 on 50 carries. Dalton Kenning led the way with 88 rushing yards on 24 carries while Jacob Kniep was 47-for-6.

In passing, Caleb Goedeken completed 30 yards on 4-of-12 passes and a touchdown and in receiving, Greg Dightman caught four passes for 30 yards and also scored a touchdown on a 90-yard punt kickoff return in the first period.

"We have some things we need to clean up in all phases of the game as we prepare for our rematch this week, but I thought we did some real nice things offensively against St. Cecilia Thursday night."

## Livestock Producers Affected By Disasters Urged To Keep Good Records

USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) State Executive Director Dan Steinkruger urged livestock producers affected by 2012 natural disasters such as the drought or fires to keep thorough records of their livestock and feed losses, including additional expenses for such things as feed purchases because of lost supplies.

"There are extraordinary circumstances caused by a variety of disasters such as fire, drought, heat and storms," Steinkruger said. "Each of these events causes economic consequences for ranchers and producers including cattle, sheep and dairy operations, bee keepers, and poultry producers."

FSA recommends that owners and producers record all pertinent information of natural disaster consequences, including:

- Documentation of the number and kind of livestock that have died, supplemented if possible by photographs or video records of ownership and losses
- Dates of death supported by birth recordings or purchase receipts
- Costs of transporting livestock to safer grounds or to move animals to new pastures and feed purchases

if supplies or grazing pastures are destroyed

• Farmers and ranchers who have not filed acreage reports for 2012 pastures with FSA should go ahead and file the report.

The department's authority to operate the five disaster assistance programs authorized by the 2008 Farm Bill expired on September 30, 2011. This includes SURE; the Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP); the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish (ELAP); the Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP); and the Tree Assistance Program (TAP).

Steinkruger noted, "Both the Senate and House have Farm Bills pending that provide emergency livestock assistance for 2012. Farmers and ranchers should maintain appropriate records in case this legislation passes in the coming months."

The author has been drawing since he was four years old and started his career as a commercial artist with his art appearing on book covers, posters, magazines and ice cream boxes.



During his visit, David presented to the K-1 students some of the illustrations in his books, as well as photographs he had taken that inspired the some drawings.

He also showed photos of his studio space and how it looks when he is working on illustrating or writing a book.

Together, the students and David designed a beetle with students selecting size, shape, and color.

During the two afternoon sessions with the students in grades 2-4 and 5-6 he talked about drawing techniques and the drawing programs that he uses on his computer. At 8:00 p.m. Trustee Roop moved to open a public hearing for the CDBG application for GIS grant funds. Heinrichs seconded the motion. Roll call votes: Ayes: Crouse, Heinrichs, Roop and Carbonneau. The following is a brief description of the project for which CDG funds are requested: The Chester Utility Planning Study will consist of creating a utility system-wide GIS map for water and sewer systems, creating a Wellhead Protection Plan to account for and protect the Village's new municipal well, and creating a long-term plan for a future well site and utility routing improvement in order to assist the village plan for future water and sewer system improvements. The Nebraska Department of Roads (NDOR) will hold an open house workshop regarding two projects on Nebraska Highway 53 (N-53) through and south of the Village of Alexandria. The meeting will be held at the Community Center in Alexandria, Tues., Oct. 30, 2012, 4:00-6:00 P.M.

Identified as **Project BR-STP-53-1(103) Alexandria South Bridges; Control Number 42474** and **Project STP-53-1(104) Alexandria South; Control Number 42533**, the proposed projects would be constructed entirely in Thayer County, Nebraska. NDOR is seeking public input regarding the development of these projects.

The **Alexandria South** project begins at the junction of U.S. Highway 136 (US-136) and N-53. The project proceeds north for about seven miles and would end north of the north corporate limits of Alexandria. Proposed improvements would include resurfacing of the existing highway and in Alexandria, curb ramp improvements to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

The **Alexandria South Bridges** project would include replacing the existing bridges at the Little Blue River and the Big Sandy Creek with new wider bridges. NDOR has evaluated various options to replace these bridges; this meeting will present those options. One of the options would require a one to two year detour. Work would also include extension of a box culvert at a tributary to Big Sandy Creek, replacing three timber drainage structures south of the Little Blue River.

New right-of-way (ROW) and temporary easement (TE) acquisitions are anticipated at various locations throughout the project area. This may include the relocation of a residence. Wetland impacts are anticipated. The existing N-53 Bridge over the Little Blue River is eligible for placement on the National Register of Historic Places. Public input is specifically being sought regarding potential impacts to this historic structure. The extent of property, environmental and historic impacts will be presented for each option being considered.

The proposed construction is not currently scheduled, but is on the District's five-year program. The projects together would take one to two years to construct. The estimated cost of **Alexandria South** is \$1.9 million and **Alexandria South Bridges** is \$5.7 million; final cost estimates will be determined by the construction option(s) chosen.

The project workshop is being held to provide information regarding the projects and receive public input. All citizens are invited to attend and present relevant comments and questions. Project development information will be displayed and personnel from NDOR will be present to answer questions and receive comments. The information "open house" format allows the public to come, gather pertinent information about the project, speak one-on-one with project personnel, and leave as they wish.

NDOR will make every reasonable accommodation to provide an accessible meeting facility for all persons. Appropriate provisions for the hearing and visually challenged or persons with limited English proficiency (LEP) will be made if the Department is notified by Oct. 17, 2012.

## ELECTION PREVIEW

**EDITOR'S NOTE**

Nebraskans will be voting on four issues when they go to the General Election polls on November 6. So that voters can better understand these important proposed changes to the state Constitution, the Nebraska Press Association in cooperation with this newspaper has prepared this report. This report briefly defines each issue, explaining its purpose.

**AMENDMENT 1**

Candidates for office who commit a misdemeanor in pursuit of the elected position would be subject to impeachment if voters adopt this proposed amendment to the Nebraska Constitution. Lawmakers approved LR19CA to bring this matter to the voters in the aftermath of a highly controversial University of Nebraska Board of Regents race eight years ago. Current law allows for the impeachment of an elected official only for misdemeanors performed while in office. After newly elected Regent David Hergert was seated in 2004, it was discovered that he violated campaign finance laws by not reporting his spending in time to trigger automatic public funding for his opponent, incumbent Don Blank of McCook. A vote for this amendment would allow for impeachment for acts committed in pursuit of the office. A vote against would not authorize such impeachment.

**AMENDMENT 3**

State Senators would be allowed to serve three terms instead of two if voters approve this proposed amendment to the Nebraska Constitution. Term limits were adopted under Initiative 415 in 2000, a move that limited senators to two terms in office. Proponents of that measure clearly indicated a desire to remove controversial Omaha Senator Ernie Chambers who served longer than any other state senator (38 years). In the 2012 session, lawmakers approved LR358CA to allow for the third term to be added. This is the same Legislature that saw five committee chairs and a popular Speaker of the Legislature ineligible to run again under the current two-term limit. A vote for Proposed Amendment 3 would change the number of terms a member of the Legislature may serve from two to three. A vote against the amendment would leave the limit at two consecutive four-year terms.

**AMENDMENT 2**

Hunting, fishing and trapping would become protected rights for Nebraskans if voters approve this proposed amendment to the state Constitution. The Legislature passed LR40CA to place the matter on the ballot. Proponents said it would help preserve the heritage of such activity for Nebraskans and serve as a viable means of managing and controlling wildlife. To answer critics, they pointed out that the measure would not modify any provisions of law dealing with property rights or trespass and would also be subject to other restrictions as prescribed by existing law. A vote for Proposed Amendment 2 would set forth a constitutional right to hunt, fish and to harvest wildlife as a management tool. A vote against the proposal would result in the activities not being recognized in the Constitution of Nebraska.

**AMENDMENT 4**

The last time voters agreed to increase the salary of Nebraska State Senators was 24 years ago. That was 1988, and lawmakers saw their salary increase to \$1,000 a month, or \$12,000 a year with the beginning of the legislative session in 1989. That increase tripled the \$4,000 annual salary that senators had received for years. Proponents of the new measure say that nearly a quarter century of economic change is long enough and senators should receive a raise. The Legislature passed LR373CA to increase the salary to \$22,500 a year, beginning January 9, 2013, if voters approve. Sponsors of the bill had sought a \$32,000 annual salary, but a committee amendment lowered the amount and lawmakers approved. A vote for the amendment would increase the salary for members of the Legislature. A vote against the constitutional amendment would result in no change in the salary.

County, as they must now take drill before leaving for cantonments.

*Footnote: A long photograph of these men is on display in the Belvidere area of the Thayer County Museum Annex. They later did receive real guns from the county.*

Kingdom, Germany, Netherlands, Italy, Ghana, Pakistan, Mexico, Canada. Nebraska has five officially registered sites - two in Omaha, one in Lincoln, Fremont and Hadar; the Baden's Little Free Library brings the number to six.

do nothing to remove the fences from the rights-of-way, they are opening up the county to possible lawsuits. "If there is an accident," he gave as an example, "the county can be found negligent." Landowners, too, can be fined for obstructing county property.

Currently the commissioners are trying to correct some of the fencing issues in Thayer County and the best way they've found is to notify the responsible party through certified mail or return receipt, the supervisor stated. In the letter, a legal description of the land where the fence is located indicates the problem area. Landowners have 10 days to remove or relocate the obstruction and failing to do so increases the risk of higher fines. For example, Heinrichs said, the fine after the 10-day period is \$100 per day, up to \$500. "Some landowners in the county have already received letters," Heinrichs said.

According to state statute, temporary fencing laws are dictated in Chapter 39, page 301 of the Nebraska Laws text and state, any person who injures or obstructs a public road...by encroaching upon the same with any fence... will be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor. Any officer in charge of road work, after having given reasonable notice to the owners of the obstruction...may remove any such fence or other obstruction... and recover the necessary cost of such removal from [the] owner...in county court.

The website [www.littlefreelibrary.org](http://www.littlefreelibrary.org) has photos and information on all registered libraries including locations with photographs on a nifty pop-up map. The site also contains instructions for building a Little Free Library, or for ordering one already put together and information on how to register. It also offers a blog.

Clarence is in the process of building a second library with children in mind, Anne said. "My first visitor was a little boy who lives down the street. He said he saw a book that he liked when he was a little boy, which is funny because he's only about six years old now, but he brought one of his own and traded it for the book he wanted in the library."

His visit inspired Anne to create the second library for children thereby separating the children's books from the adult's books. The new library will also set lower to the ground for easier access by children.

The organization's mission is to promote literacy and the love of reading by building free book exchanges worldwide and to build a sense of community by sharing skills, creativity and wisdom across generations. And, like Anne said before, "anything we can do to promote reading..."

## Keeping Kids Safe on Halloween

Did you know that on average, twice as many kids are killed while walking on Halloween as compared to any other day of the year?

When it comes to preventing injury and keeping kids safe on Halloween it is important that children hear repeated and consistent messages about safety. Given their short attention spans, SafeKids.org suggests that you must review all the correct behaviors with your children to help them be safe before they head out to Trick or Treat. Parents and drivers both need to do their part to help kids stay out of the emergency room on Halloween.

Kids will be out while it is dark — making it harder for drivers to see them and because they're excited about getting candy, they may not be watching out for cars. Use reflective materials on costumes

and bags with reflective tape or stickers and choose light colored costumes to improve visibility.

Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights in order to see better, as well as to be seen by drivers. Choose face paint and make-up instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.

Drivers must slow down and watch out for trick-or-treaters, especially around crosswalks and driveways. Reduce any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings. Remember that costumes can limit children's visibility and they may not be able to see.

Tell your children not to open goodies until you check them first. Be attentive for signs of tampering any treat. Candy should be thrown away if the wrapper is faded or torn, or if the candy is unwrapped.


