## Warden predicts big deer harvest

Nebraska Game and Parks Commission game warden for Thayer, Fillmore and Jefferson counties, Matt Taylor, is expecting a "big deer" harvest.

"I anticipate it, people are saying there are some big bucks," he said. "Jefferson County has a good population."

Quail numbers also look good. Pheasants are more plentiful than last year, but hunters will have to work at it, unlike quail.

Not a lot of people actively hunt fall turkeys, but the turkeys are starting to bunch up, Taylor added.

Taylor covers three zones and the duck season is underway in parts of his territory.

"The water quality is really good in the rainwater basins. The ducks are actively migrating," he said.

According to a commission news release, wetland conditions have improved across the state.

"Due to cooler temperatures and increased rainfall, conditions in many Rainwater Basin wetlands have improved over the past month," wetland program manager Ted LaGrange said. "The cooler and wetter conditions have also helped to make our pumping more effective."

So far, Game and Parks has pumped water into 19 Rainwater Basin wildlife management areas and into four wetlands located outside of the basin.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has delivered surface water into the Funk Waterfowl Production Area, the news release stated.

Summer for Taylor was busy as it normally is. At Alexandria State Recreation Area, a new bath house was installed minus showers. New water hookups will provide for better water quality.

"I think the attendance was steady," Taylor said about Alexandria.

Taylor has also helped out locally, with the new archery range in Hebron and proposed gun range that will be a private club run on donated land.

Grants and donations are funding the archery activity, including grants from Little Blue Natural Resources District and Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. A grant is currently moving through the National Wild Turkey Foundation as well.

Applying for the grants was a combined effort with Jana Tietjen and Rick Souerdyke, who is a big bow hunter and member of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation.

Taylor said Nebraska Game and Parks is watching the grants and donations come in and may pick up expenses at the tail end of the project.

Plans for the archery range include a canoe and kayak access point to the river and a shelter.

"It is wonderful to have a great working relationship with Nebraska Game and Parks as Matt has been very instrumental in helping Hebron enhance our outdoor recreation," Tietjen said. "He has gone above and beyond by attending city council and Little Blue NRD meetings and has also assisted volunteers in making the frameworks for the archery range."

And, a lot of people are interested in a trap range.

"We may have a trap league as well," Taylor said about the gun range. "We are actively searching for a place."

Young shooters from Thayer County travel to Fairbury for meets and a trap league would let them compete in meets closer to home.



### Officer's flag presented to Thayer County

The flag of fallen Denver Police Officer Virgil Hall was presented to Sheriff David Lee of the Thayer County Sheriff's Office Oct. 11 by Denver Police Officer Barbara Cisneros of the Denver Police Museum. Hall, who was born in Hebron in 1909, was killed in the line of duty July 5, 1945, in Denver. A search for relatives of Hall by the police museum was unsuccessful. Hall's flag was recently flown over the the Capitol in Washington D.C. Cisneros also gave Lee a binder of Hall's story, complete with photographs. Lee said receiving the flag was truly an honor and Hall is gone, but not forgotten.

## Harvest sees area fields muddy

Weather forecasts this week improved from the recent rain and moisture in the fields that slowed the harvest.

Larry Seaman of Norder Supply in Hebron said farmers were "knocked out for about a week."

"They are about a third done with soybeans and 20 percent on corn," he said prior to a dreary Friday and Saturday.

But the yields were a pleasant surprise in some spots, Seaman added with the advance in hybrids contributing and no-till fields, which hold more moisture.

In Chester, even the light rain dampened the soybean harvest.

New manager, Roger Rumsey said early reports on yields were average to good. Rumsey came to Chester Sept. 11 with experience at AGP's in Rosemont and the Hastings Garvey Elevator.

"Right now, we're sitting pretty good with a fair amount of space

for grain," he said. "We are looking for the sun to shine and get 'er going."

Grain buyer for Cargill, Todd Burda, at Carleton said the area harvest began in mid-September. In the first part of October, fields were catching the rain, but the corn harvest had made good progress.

The irrigated corn and soybeans yields were better than expected, but not quite as good as last year in some areas, especially in a pocket east of Carleton toward Fairbury that had missed a good rain.

This week, Burda said the beans should be starting to pile on the ground as weather conditions dried out.

He estimated soybeans should be finished later this week with corn stretching to a week or two into November. Corn was being run through the dryer.

"We need some heat and wind,"

Burda said. We'll probably see more beans, but the majority will be wrapped up on the next seven to 10 days."

Brandon Benson, the new manager for Aurora Coop in Hubbell and Byron, said most of the corn was wet last week.

"We've only gotten about 90,000 bushels," Benson said. "Most farmers can't find dry spots and they want the beans out first."

The soybeans were about 60 percent done, even with farmers waiting until afternoons to start harvesting.

In Byron, conditions were similar with not much corn coming in, Benson added.

Benson, who grew up farming, comes to the Byron-Hubbell elevators from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, where he received his business degree in agriculture.



Beans were coming in Friday to the Chester AGP elevator as rain threatened once again to slow the harvest this year.

## Burkey wins American Red Cross scholarship

Stacia Burkey of Hebron helped save lives by hosting an American Red Cross blood drive this summer and earned a \$1,000 scholarship as a result of her lifesaving efforts.

As part of the Red Cross Leaders Save Lives program, the Southwest Community College student hosted a blood drive at the Courtyard Terrace on July 7, which collected 45 blood donations. As a result, Burkey was entered in a drawing to win a scholarship and was chosen as a winner. Burkey was also awarded a gift card.

"I wanted to help the community," Burkey said. "Saving people's lives by donating is a great option."

Blood donors from high school and college blood drives account for about 20 percent of donations given through the Red Cross dur-

ing the school year. Many of these blood donors do not give when school is not in session during the summer months and the winter holidays—a time when blood shortages can occur.

The Leaders Save Lives program encourages community-minded high school and college students to host blood drives to help maintain the blood supply during these crucial times of the year. 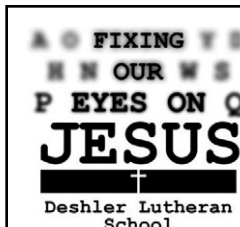

The Thayer Central volleyball team faced its sixth state-ranked opponent last Thursday when Superior (20-3) came to town for the annual Pink Out, and while the night had its highlights, it ended in a loss for the 10-13 Lady Titans, 25-22, 26-24, 25-22.

"We saw a fantastic match on the court tonight," Head Coach Amy Harris said. "The girls were fired up and ready to take on Superior, and we fully expected to give them more than they could handle. I was especially proud of our players for their enthusiasm and support for each other during this match. The crowd and Pink Out atmosphere lent a lot to that enthusiasm, and we appreciate the fans and the band for the excitement they created. We look forward to facing Superior again in sub-districts."

Junior Emily Welch led the way with 16 kills, four aces, and 13 digs.

Junior Maggie Harris followed with 11 kills, and senior Jena Cottam had 27 assists.

Sophomores Sydney Havel and Stephanie Meyer contributed 13 and 12 digs, respectively. Junior Maddison Williams had three aces.

Also on Thursday, the Reserve (freshman) team did well against a mostly JV team from Superior, finishing 11-25, 17-25 (0-9). Servers going 100 percent at the line included Kelby Mumm (two aces), Siraya Wiedel, Chloe Hintz and Alanna Fangmeier.

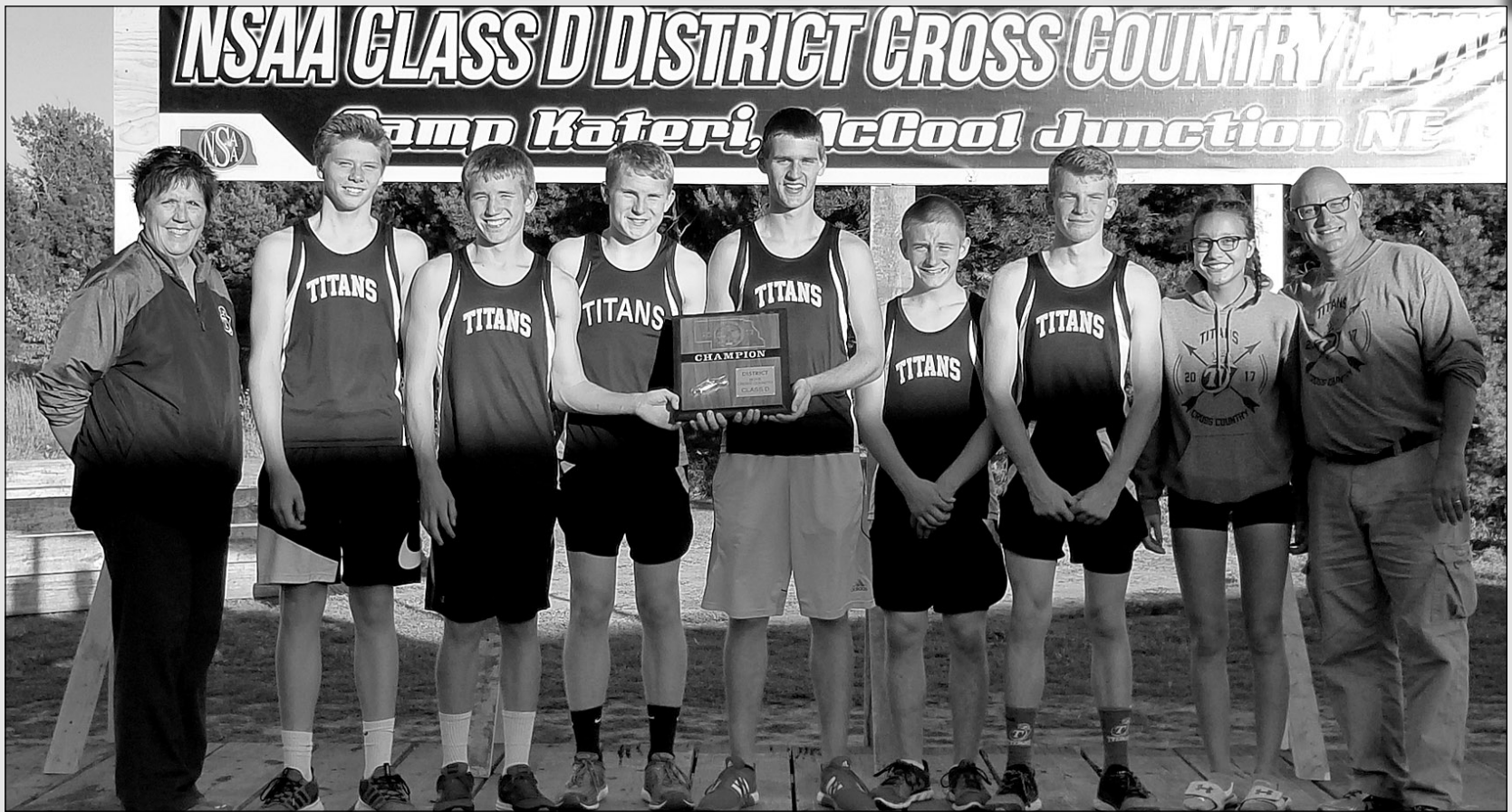
